





In Marrakech; walking tour

Like many North African towns, Marrakech is divided into two distinct parts, the Gueliz (the modern French-built city) and the Medina. For generations it has been a meeting place for the mountain Berbers and the desert peoples of the south, who come to trade and barter amongst the colourful souks, turning the centre of the old city into a rich cacophony of noise and colour. We'll take traditional caleshes to the main square then journey out into this vibrant city on foot, to enjoy a tour of some of its most enthralling sites with a local guide. You can wander past vendors selling doughnuts and fried grasshoppers, meander through native markets where Muslim women, their hands and feet dyed with henna, call out to sell their wares, and enjoy the sounds and the smells of the exotic. After our tour there will be the option to stay in town and make your own way back to the hotel, taking time to enjoy more of the remarkable Medina, perhaps haggling for a bargain or two, or simply sitting at one of the local cafés and watching the street tableaux unfold before you. The city's beating heart is the spectacular Djemma-el-Fna, a site not to be missed and a scene straight out of the pages of the Arabian Nights. You will find the square alive with storytellers and musicians, jugglers and acrobats, snake charmers and clowns. Marrakech is a city like no other and a walk through its bustling streets will fill the senses and fire the imagination. The city boasts a staggering array of spectacular architecture and wonderful facades, but do remember that many of the mosques will be forbidden to non-Muslims and be careful of photographing women, however photogenic they look, as the Moroccans are very sensitive about such things. If you are unsure, it is always best to ask.

Drive to Imlil in the High Atlas; walk to Aremd & drive on to Ouirgane

Leaving the city behind, we drive south today, towards the craggy peaks and plunging valleys of the Toubkal Massif. Crossing the Haouz Plain we pass through the tiny town of Asni, from where our road begins to climb towards the foothills of the Massif. Below us the valley of the Oued Rhirhaia stretches out into the distance and small villages cling to the sides of the steep hills as we meander our way towards the village of Imlil. The towering peaks of the High Atlas are North Africa's greatest range of mountains, a wild region, culturally removed from the rest of Morocco, and a barrier between the northern plains and the pre-Sahara. This is the land of the fiercely independent Berbers, the Lords of the Atlas, whose traditions and ways still hold sway up here in their mountain strongholds far away from the cities below. The Berbers present us with a unique view of a way of life lost to the rest of North Africa, where music and dance, even language and religion, are far removed from their Arab neighbours. From Imlil we walk to the village of Aremd, at once transporting ourselves into another world where mule tracks follow the contours of the mountains, past precariously balanced villages and across a landscape of remarkable flora and fauna. Following the course of the Mizane River, we traverse the meandering slopes of the valley to a network of terraced fields, where barley, potatoes and fruit cling to the valley walls. Aremd is built above a massive moraine spur and on arrival we will head for the house of a local Berber family for lunch, before returning back to Imlil to rejoin our vehicle for the drive to Ouirgane. Providing mules are not being used by the locals to carry loads from village, there may be the option to hire mules for those not wishing to walk the route between Imlil and Aremd, allowing your trusty steeds to follow the same mountain tracks that their ancestors have for centuries.

Drive to Taroudant via Tizi n' Test

Heading south today, we will first visit the Tin Mal Mosque. Built in 1156, it is one of the only mosques open to non-Muslims. After our visit we take a dramatic drive through the spectacular Tizi n' Test pass and down into the region of the High Atlas. At 2092m the views from the pass can be quite spectacular, with views back across to the Toubkal Massif and down into the Souss Valley presenting us with some magnificent photo opportunities. Our descent is something of an exhilarating ride, dropping an incredible 1600 metres in just 30 km. The views, as you can imagine, are incredible, with mountain peaks and tiny villages nestling amongst the valley slopes laid out before us. Finally we reach Taroudant.

Dar Zitoune

Just outside the town, Dar Zitoune enjoys a peaceful setting in extensive grounds. The bungalows are arranged around a lush garden whose central feature is the large swimming pool, fringed with palms and built in the shape of a traditional Moroccan door. All rooms are decorated in traditional style to a high standard.

Taroudant has lain at the centre of political life of the Souss Valley for generations. Lying before the imposing backdrop of the Anti-Atlas Mountains, amidst a landscape of olive groves and orange orchards, the town lies behind an impressive bastion of fortified towers and some of the best-preserved walls in the country. Strategically important and site of the region's most important market, Taroudant once commanded a network of major trading routes and even today its bustling market lies at the centre of life. Today has been left free for you to explore or simply relax in the pleasant surroundings of this hidden corner of Morocco. We recommend a tour of the city walls, perhaps by calesh. You can climb up the gate to enjoy great views of the surrounding gardens and olive groves which adjoin the walls and over to the countryside beyond. A visit to the local souks is also recommended and jewellery here is particularly good. For the more energetic there may be the possibility to take an optional hike in the surrounding area.

Dar Zitoune

Just outside the town, Dar Zitoune enjoys a peaceful setting in extensive grounds. The bungalows are arranged around a lush garden whose central feature is the large swimming pool, fringed with palms and built in the shape of a traditional Moroccan door. All rooms are decorated in traditional style to a high standard.

Drive to Essaouira via Agadir

Joining the coast road at Amesnaz, we head for the resort town of Essaouria today, a mecca for water sports enthusiasts from all over the region. If time allows we may stop off en route at the wide, sandy beaches close to Agadir. Situated within the confines of its 15th century Portuguese fortifications, Essaouira has a lively yet relaxed feel to it, where whitewashed houses and traditional fishing boats present a perfect backdrop for our stay. The town has a rich and somewhat colourful history and its importance as a trading port during the 18th and 19th centuries saw it prosper, attracting British, French, Arab and Jewish merchants and sailors to its shores. These influences are still reflected in the architecture and layout of the town. An interesting, and it has to be said wholly suspect, legend claims the town's patron saint to be a Scotsman by the name of McDougal, who was believed to have been washed up onto these shores after a storm in the 14th century. Another interesting footnote is that much of Orson Welles's version of Othello was filmed here, its ramparts and coastline providing a rich and original setting for Shakespeare's Moorish tragedy.

Riad Dar L'Ouissa

Our comfortable hotel in Essaouira is located in the heart of the old city, right by one of the historic city gates. Being built over 5 storeys, it is somewhat larger than many Riads though only having 24 rooms, the atmosphere is still intimate. The simple décor and use of colour adds a real touch of class and sense of luxury. Rooms are spacious and modern and there is also a hammam. There are fantastic views of the beach from the roof terrace; a perfect place to enjoy a sundowner after a day's sightseeing!

Free day to relax or join an optional activity

Not to be missed is a visit to the Medina, but be warned, after passing through the narrow, highly decorated arched entrance, it may be hard to resist snapping up some of the locally made rustic leather belts, gleaming gold and silver jewellery and wooden boxes exquisitely inlaid with mother of pearl. The town abounds with galleries and workshops, cafes and souks, making it a











pleasurable way to pass the day. For the more active amongst you, you may prefer to take to the beaches for some opportunities to enjoy some walks along the coast. Swimming is possible but please take local advice before entering the water as the surf off these beaches can prove to be too much for less able swimmers.

In order to make things easier for you, the Tour Leaders may organise a group's tips kitty and if this is the case, they will account for it throughout the tour.

Accordingly, you should allow approx. £10 per person for tipping crew and local guides used.

Foreign Exchange

Morocco

ATM Availability: ATMs are available in main towns/cities, though can be unreliable.

Credit Card Acceptance: Not all places.

Travellers Cheques: Travellers cheques are difficult to exchange and are not recommended.

Local Currency: Moroccan Dirham (MAD).

Recommended Currency for Exchange: US Dollars, Sterling and Euros are readily exchangeable. We recommend you take a mixture of cash and credit cards. Scottish bank notes and Australian dollar travellers cheques and cash are NOT normally accepted in Morocco.

Where to Exchange: Most major towns - your Tour Leader will advise you.

Flight Information

You are able to book this tour on a 'land only' basis or as a 'flight inclusive' package. Your flight inclusive package will be fully protected by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) ATOL protection scheme.

Booking a land only package with Explore

Customers who have chosen to book on the 'Land Only' arrangements of our tour, please ensure that you have checked your tour specific 'Joining Instructions' prior to booking your own travel arrangements. Joining Tour Abroad

Customers booked on the 'Land Only' arrangements will now receive a Free Transfer, provided you arrive and depart on the tour only itinerary start and end dates. The transfers will be from the Explore designated airport or train station to the joining point of your tour, and then back from the ending point to the designated airport or train station. The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

Free transfers are not available for Self-Guided, Tailormade or Tours for Churches customers.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of booking.

Travel Insurance

If you are trekking at altitude please ensure that there is no upper altitude limit which may limit or exclude cover for your trip. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling on trips within the United Kingdom.

Visa Information

Morocco: Visas are not required by UK, Australian, New Zealand, US and Canadian citizens. Other nationalities should consult their local embassy or consular office.

All visa information is subject to change. You should confirm all visa related questions with the relevant Embassy prior to departure.

Vaccinations & Protection

Nothing compulsory, but we recommend protection against tetanus, typhoid, infectious hepatitis and polio. Consult your travel clinic for latest advice on different prophylaxis available against malaria.

Preparing for your Trip

Climate

Morocco

The climate is both Mediterranean and Atlantic. The dry, hot season is from May to October when summer temperatures can reach 38°C and above (if sight seeing is included we will do our best to avoid the heat of the day during this period). Temperatures may drop significantly at times during the night as the day's heat rapidly diminishes. From December to January snow can be expected on mountain passes and it can be wet. In winter, day temperatures will probably be around 18-25°C, dropping to perhaps 0-5°C.

Clothing

Pack essentially for all conditions. Summer (Apr-Oct) clothing should be lightweight, however, a warm fleece/jumper and waterproofs are also advisable, as the mountains can sometimes be cold at night, even in the summer. As the High-Atlas region is mountainous, climatic conditions are variable and whilst days can be warm and sunny, the mountain air is crisp and nights can be cool. Morocco is a Muslim country and it is important to dress with respect for local customs. People may be offended by shorts or revealing dresses, which can attract unwelcome attention. We advise that in general both men and women should cover shoulders, upper arms and knees. Transparent, plunging necklines and tightfitting clothes should be avoided. Women should also cover their heads when entering a sanctuary, though in general, mosques are forbidden to non-Muslims. For those clients on a cycling holiday please bear











this information in mind for times that you are not on the bikes. While cycling it is no problem for both men and women to wear your regular cycling gear, tight fitting or not.

Equipment

We recommend a sunhat, high factor sunscreen, a torch, insect repellent and a water bottle.

Footwear

Lightweight trail boots or robust trainers with good traction soles and sandals.
