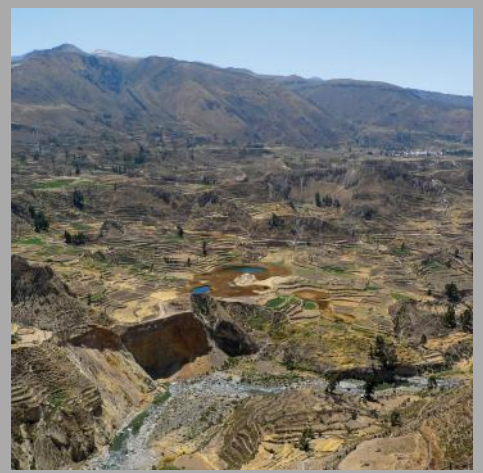
## Your tour itinerary

## DAY 1 Join tour Lima; afternoon city tour.

Arrive Lima and check-in at hotel. After an introductory briefing from our Tour Leader and meeting the rest of group, this afternoon we head out on a city tour of the colonial heart of Lima.

### Hotel la Hacienda

La Hacienda Hotel & Casino is conveniently located in the popular area of Miraflores, close to restaurants and shops. The rooms are elegant and spacious; facilities include a restaurant and bar.

## DAY 2 Fly to Arequipa; free afternoon

This morning we transfer back to the airport to fly to the beautiful city of Arequipa. This afternoon will be left free for you to explore the town on your own and acclimatise.

### Arequipa, Casa Andina Classic

Built out of white volcanic stone, the Casa Andina Classic hotel enjoys stunning views towards El Misti volcano from its 4th floor terrace. It is situated just a short, 6-block walk away from central Arequipa, so enjoys a more tranquil location. The rooms are well finished with modern fixtures and fittings and feature cable TV, safes, internet access and hair dryers in the bathrooms.

## DAY 3 In Arequipa; visit the Santa Catalina Convent

This morning we visit Santa Catalina Convent, a miniature walled town which once housed 450 nuns and serving ladies in total seclusion. The rest of the day is free to explore this charming city, situated at 2380m and surrounded by snow-capped mountains including the perfect conical peak of El Misti (5822m). Arequipa is famed for its colonial architecture and the arcaded city square, dominated on one side by the twin towered cathedral (1612), is among the finest to be found in South America.

### Arequipa, Casa Andina Classic

Built out of white volcanic stone, the Casa Andina Classic hotel enjoys stunning views towards El Misti volcano from its 4th floor terrace. It is situated just a short, 6-block walk away from central Arequipa, so enjoys a more tranquil location. The rooms are well finished with modern fixtures and fittings and feature cable TV, safes, internet access and hair dryers in the bathrooms.

## DAY 4 Drive to Chivay

This morning we head north where we enter the world of the Altiplano. We pass behind the volcanoes that ring Arequipa and on to Chivay. Passing herds of Llama and Alpaca - if lucky we may spot the elusive Vicuña. Today we briefly reach the highest point of our trip at 4,910m where we stop for a photo before descending towards Colca Canyon.

### Eco Inn Colca

The Eco Inn Colca is located on the edge of the small village of Yanque deep in the Colca Valley, this small hotel has a number of simple and rustic rooms built and decorated in a local style. There are splendid views of the valley, river and snow peaks in the distance.

## DAY 5 Colca Canyon; drive to Puno

From Chivay we make an early start to the mirador Cruz del Condor in the hope of spotting the rare Andean Condor. Seeing these magnificent birds in flight is a highlight of any tour. We continue to Puno on the shores of Lake Titicaca: the highest navigable lake in the world at an elevation of 3,820m, and the legendary birthplace of the Inca civilisation. The local Aymara and Quechua-speaking Indian people have adapted over generations to life at altitude and have larger lungs, hearts and spleens, and blood that is particularly rich in red corpuscles.

### La Hacienda Hotel - Puno

This comfortable and cosy hotel combines good facilities and accommodation with a convenient city location, just one block from Plaza de Armas. There is a bar and a restaurant serving international and local dishes.

## DAY 6 In Puno; boat trip to the Uros Islands and Taquile Island

From Puno we take a boat trip on Lake Titicaca to explore the floating reed islands, home to the Uros people who live on the lake itself. Their islands are made from totora, a reed-like papyrus that grows in the shallows and is used in most aspects of their life, including the construction of their boats and homes. We then continue to the less visited island of Taquile which has preserved much of its Inca and pre-Inca heritage and the islanders still speak the language of the Inca - Runa Simi or Quechua. We take our time walking across the island and we will have the chance to buy locally produced embroidery - the men's handiwork for once! After lunch we then descend to the jetty to board our boat back to Puno.

## DAY 7 Andean Explorer train to Cusco

Today we follow the legendary route taken by the first Inca ruler - Manco Capac - on his way to find Cusco. Travelling aboard the comfortable first class Andean Explorer train we can relax and enjoy the spectacular Andean scenery roll past our window. Shepherds graze their flocks of llamas or alpaca on the altiplano grasslands in scenes little changed since Inca times. We'll enjoy a sumptuous meal aboard the train, with perhaps the chance to try some local delicacies before we arrive in Cusco in the late afternoon and head to our hotel. Rail strikes are common in Peru and so there is the possibility that the train may not always be running. In the event that the train is not operating, then we will make the journey from Puno to Cusco by public bus.

### Eco Inn Hotel Cusco

The Eco Inn Hotel in Cusco has recently been opened, this beautiful hotel situated a few blocks from the main square and overlooking Cusco's craft market, makes a welcome retreat at the end of a days sight-seeing. With comfortable rooms and good facilities, the hotel also has a spa, where a wide range of treatments are available.

## DAY 8 In Cusco; visit Sacsayhuaman

The old capital of the Inca Empire survives only in its ruins, imbued with an atmosphere of mystery and grandeur. The Spanish colonial city, with its attractive pink tiled roofs, arcaded plazas and steep winding alleyways, stands upon tremendous Inca foundation stones. This morning we take a walking tour of this lovely city to see important Inca and Colonial monuments, such as Plaza de Armas and the Inca wall of Hatunrumiyoc with its famous twelve-sided stone. The stone, measuring some 5 feet across, has the typical bevelled joints which create the patterns of light and shadow on Inca walls. We will continue on by bus to the outlying Inca site of Saqsaywaman which broods high above the town, its huge, zigzagging stone walls broken into 66 sharply projecting angles to catch attackers in a withering crossfire. 20,000 conscripted workers toiled for 90 years to finish it. The afternoon is left free for some further exploration of Cusco.

## DAY 10 Train to Aguas Calientes; visit Machu Picchu

We take an early morning train along the side of the Rio Urubamba, flanked by high cliffs and peaks, then climb by bus to Machu Picchu - the famous 'Lost City' at 2,400m. The existence of this exquisite masterpiece of ancient civilisation remained unknown to the outside world until it was 'discovered' by an American archaeologist, Hiram Bingham in 1911. We explore this mountain-top stronghold - the most spectacular feat of engineering in ancient America. Returning to the valley floor, we stay in a simple hostel in Aguas Calientes, with the chance to soak in the nearby natural hot baths.

### Taypikala Machu Picchu

The Taypikala Machupicchu hotel is a beautiful and fresh minimalist rustic building located in the cloud forest town of Aguas Calientes and is the base for our explorations of Machu Picchu.

## DAY 11 Morning re-visit Machu Picchu (optional); train to Ollantaytambo and transfer to Yucay

We have another chance this morning to explore the site and if you want to have a very early start it may be possible to catch sunrise. You may also have time to climb the steep and difficult peak of Huayna Picchu to look down on the Temple of the Sun or it is possible to walk along part of the Inca Trail to the Gate of the Sun for amazing views back down upon the citadel. Later we take the train to Ollantaytambo and transfer to our hotel in Yucay, nestled in the heart of the Sacred Valley where we can relax and enjoy the views as the sun sets.

### Inkallpa Hotel

Located only a short distance from Urubamba and Ollantaytambo and set in beautiful gardens the characterful Inkallpa hotel offers you a peaceful and picturesque setting from which to explore the Sacred Valley. Rooms are spacious and comfortable with balconies offering views over the valley, and the building is decorated on both the interior and exterior with wood fixtures and stone. Facilities at the hotel include a small spa, a restaurant serving local and international dishes and a coffee shop.

## DAY 12 In the Sacred Valley

Today is a free day with a wide choice of things to do. For river-lovers there is the opportunity of a full-day raft-trip (optional) down the Urubamba in the Sacred Valley of the Incas. This is an exciting way to see the valley and no previous experience of rafting is necessary - full instruction and safety equipment are provided. Please note: Participation in rafting requires that you are able to swim 25 meters unaided. There is also the opportunity to visit Misminay, home to many of the porters who work along the Inca Trail and within the valley itself. We can learn a little more about the lives of these descendants if the ancient Inca during our visit. Alternatively you could visit Maras and Moray where hot springs at the top of the valley have been diverted into terraced saltpans. Ollantaytambo itself is also worth spending time in; during the Inca Empire it was the royal state of Emperor Pachacuti who conquered the region and built the town as a ceremonial centre. Tonight we stay in the Sacred Valley and enjoy the spectacular views of the peaks of the Cordillera Urubamba.

### Inkallpa Hotel

Located only a short distance from Urubamba and Ollantaytambo and set in beautiful gardens the characterful Inkallpa hotel offers you a peaceful and picturesque setting from which to explore the Sacred Valley. Rooms are spacious and comfortable with balconies offering views over the valley, and the building is decorated on both the interior and exterior with wood fixtures and stone. Facilities at the hotel include a small spa, a restaurant serving local and international dishes and a coffee shop.

## DAY 13 Fly to Puerto Maldonado, transfer to Amazon lodge

Today we transfer to the airport for a short flight to Puerto Maldonado, located in the Southern Amazon area of Peru. You can leave your main luggage in Puerto Maldonado and just take with you what you need for the next few days. The Amazon comprises 60% of Peru and the Peruvian Amazon is the second largest section of the Amazon Rainforest after Brazil. The Amazon basin covers two fifths of South America over many countries including Bolivia, Brazil, Colombia, Ecuador, Guyana, Peru and Venezuela and it is the most bio-diverse environment in the world. Most of the basin is covered by the rainforest, which is the largest rainforest in the world. We travel along the Tambopata River by dugout canoe (approximately 40 minutes) and check into our Amazon lodge. The lodge is comfortable but as it is in a remote location, the electricity is provided by a generator and is only available for certain hours of the day. After lunch, we will have a guided walk through the jungle and the local guide will explain the tropical trees, medicinal plants,


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insects, butterflies and other animals we see en route. Then we will make a quick stop at a lookout point to hopefully spot toucans, macaws and other birds. In the evening we will enjoy a twilight boat journey searching for animals including caimans and capybaras.

#### **Corto Maltes Lodge**

Located on the right margin of the Madre de Dios River, the Corto Maltes lodge comprises of 27 comfortable bungalows, all with hot showers, private safe and terrace with hammocks. There are a bar including free hot drinks and a dining room overlooking the river, a swimming pool with bar and a craft shop. Windows are fitted with mosquito nets.

### DAY 14 Explore Amazon Jungle

We have an early start this morning to walk to the clay lick. We watch from a hide as several different species of parrots and parakeets arrive to feed on special clay that is vital to their metabolism. The numbers of birds can reach as many as one hundred at a time and it is a very special and colourful spectacle to witness. Returning to the lodge, we have breakfast and then head off to 'Monkey Island' where four species of monkeys live, the largest being the spider monkey. These monkeys were originally captured by local people but were since rescued and now live on this island in freedom. Following another boat ride of approximately 30 minutes, we will enter the territory of the Tambopata- Candamo National Reserve. We will trek 5km through the dense vegetation of the tropical rainforest looking out for snakes, monkeys and birds. Our destination is Sandoval Lake. Numerous species of animals live near the lake, keep your eyes out for kingfishers, cormorants, squirrel monkeys, and capuchin monkeys. At the lake itself we may see giant river otters, black caimans and piranhas. This is also the habitat of the giant arapaima, a fish of more than 2.5m, weighing in at more than 200kg.

### DAY 15 Explore Amazon Jungle

This morning, we will follow the course of the river for approximately 1.5 hours in order to visit a native community. Occasionally we can see monkeys, river turtles, caimans and various birds in the dense vegetation of the riverbanks. We will also see some medicinal plants. The 'Project for the Rescue of Cultural Values' supports the local native community of Palma Real. It is the biggest in the area with approximately 200 families of the Ese'eja tribe. This project, located at Gamitada Island works together with two families that will introduce us to the cultural values of their ancestors including their language, customs and their dances. Afterwards we will visit a chakra (farm), where we will learn about a variety of tropical fruits and other local products. We will enjoy a typical Amazonian dish for lunch.

#### **Corto Maltes Lodge**

Located on the right margin of the Madre de Dios River, the Corto Maltes lodge comprises of 27 comfortable bungalows, all with hot showers, private safe and terrace with hammocks. There are a bar including free hot drinks and a dining room overlooking the river, a swimming pool with bar and a craft shop. Windows are fitted with mosquito nets.

**Credit Card Acceptance:** In major restaurants.

**Travellers Cheques:** Travellers Cheques are not always easy to exchange.

**Local Currency:** Nuevo Sol

**Recommended Currency for Exchange:** Carry all your funds in US cash NOT Sterling or Travellers Cheques which are more difficult to exchange. We recommend to take a minimum of US\$400-\$500 of your total spending money in cash for your tour, in mixed denominations. Notes should be in good condition otherwise they might be difficult to exchange.

**Where to Exchange:** Most major towns - your Tour Leader will advise you on arrival.

### Flight Information

## Important Information

### Travel Insurance

It is a condition of joining any of our tours that you must have valid travel insurance. It must indicate that you have cover for (at least) medical expenses and emergency repatriation in the event of illness or injury. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling in England and Scotland. We also strongly recommend your policy includes curtailment, personal effects and cancellation protection as all deposits paid are non-refundable. You will also need to ensure your travel policy covers you for all activities you intend to do whilst on tour.

We are delighted to include FREE travel insurance **for all qualifying customers** who book an Explore trip from 01 January 2015.

### Visa Information

Peru: Visas are not required for UK, New Zealand, Australian, US and Canadian citizens. Other nationalities should consult the relevant consulate.

All visa information is subject to change. You should confirm all visa related issues with the relevant Embassy prior to departure.

USA (If flights transit): According to US law, passengers will have to disembark, collect luggage and clear immigration before re-boarding for the onward flight.

Citizens of the UK, New Zealand, Australia, Canada and passport holders from several EU countries can enter the United States without



a visa under the Visa Waiver Program (VWP). This applies if you enter the country by sea or by air on a carrier participating in the visa waiver scheme, holding a return/ onward ticket. The passport requirements are that it must be machine readable, and must contain a digital photograph of the holder and also an integrated circuit chip that stores biographic information.

All passengers travelling to the USA under the Visa Waiver Programme must provide their details online no later than 72 hours prior to travel. British travellers who have not registered before their trip are likely to be detained and sent home.

When completing an application for transit you should enter the words 'In Transit' with your final destination location in the address line. Anyone applying for an Electronic Travel Authorisation (ESTA) to travel under the Visa Waiver system will be charged a fee of 14USD (9GBP).

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## Vaccinations & Protection

### Peru

We recommend protection against typhoid, tetanus, polio, infectious hepatitis and malaria. Consult your travel clinic for latest advice on different prophylaxis available against malaria. ## Preparing for your Tour

### Altitude Description

As this tour reaches altitudes of over 3800 meters, we strongly recommend that travellers with heart or lung conditions, anaemia, asthma, high blood pressure or on the pill should seek the advice of their GP.

You must have adequate travel insurance for your trip. Please ensure that your insurance policy covers you to the maximum altitude indicated above. If you have Explore insurance you will be covered to this altitude.

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### Climate

#### Peru

There is a rainy season from Dec - Mar however on the coast it rarely rains. Jun-Oct is damp and misty, but temperatures never drop below 10°C. At high altitudes although there are sunny days temperatures can drop dramatically, and conditions can change suddenly.

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### Clothing

Select your clothing carefully: For the tropical jungle region (Amazonas) with its humid climate, loose fitting and lightweight clothing with long sleeves and a sun hat are essential. A complete set of clothes which can get grubby and muddy are useful. Bring warm clothing such as a warm fleece, thermal underwear, warm hat and gloves for cooler nights in the mountains when temps drop dramatically. Lightweight waterproofs are essential. Bring your swimsuit.

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### Equipment

A good insect repellent is essential. Also bring a small torch, sunhat, sunscreen and a small towel (for rafting and thermal baths).

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### Footwear

Comfortable shoes and lightweight walking shoes and sandals. If participating in the rafting or visiting the jungle, bring old trainers (as they will get wet).

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### Luggage: On Tour

One main piece of baggage and a daypack. Bring a small overnight bag for essentials at Machu Picchu and the Amazon lodge - main luggage will be stored at Cusco and Puerto Maldonado respectively.
