We also see many of the country's astonishing natural wonders, from the dramatic Tississat Falls to the rugged Simien mountain range.

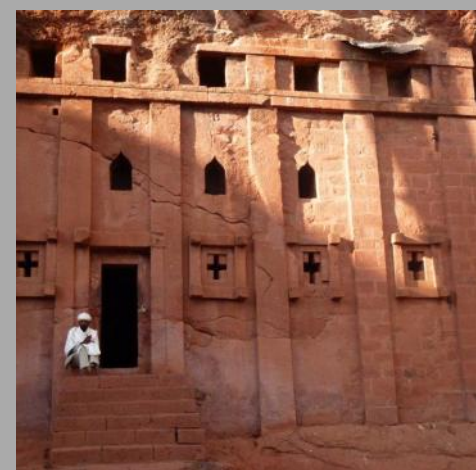

## Your tour itinerary

### Tour itinerary notes

While our intention is to adhere to the day-by-day itinerary as printed below, a degree of flexibility is built in. Overnight stops may vary from those suggested.

**DAY 1** Join tour Addis Ababa, fly Dire Dawa, drive Harar

Upon your arrival in Addis Ababa, you may be struck by how modern Ethiopia's capital is. At an altitude of 2438 metres, the city is barely more than a century old and is home to some elegant buildings set along wide streets, dispersed with plenty of green space. Prior to our flight to Dire Dawa later this afternoon, you will have use of a day room in which to freshen up and relax. You may choose to use the time to explore some of Addis, maybe visiting Mercato -one of the largest open markets in Africa. After our arrival in the plains of Dire Dawa, we ascend by road to the walled city of Harar, where we will spend the next two nights. Nestled into a hillside, the city walls are pierced by five gates topped by 25 towers.

## DAY 2 In Harar; exploring the medieval city on foot

Harar is the cradle of Islam in Ethiopia and, by the Middle Ages, had become known as the fourth most sacred city in the Islamic world. It remained closed to outsiders for centuries - even when the Victorian scholar Burton visited, he entered the city disguised as a Turkish trader. Later, the poet Rimbaud became enchanted by Harar's people and the house where he spent some of his happiest days still stands. This morning, we will spend time exploring the city's narrow alleyways. As well as taking in the 16th century mosque with its slender minaret, we will also visit one of the most colourful markets in Africa.

## DAY 3 Drive to Awash Saba; visit Awash National Park

Today, on our drive to Awash National Park, we will visit the town of Aweday - home to the country's largest chat market (a mildly stimulating plant). The scenic Awash National Park is situated in the dry acacia savanna of the Rift Valley. The skyline of the park is dominated by the jagged edges of Mount Fantelle - a dormant volcano whose crater towers above the surrounding bush. This afternoon, we will have an opportunity to visit its splendid waterfall, spilling into a 150 metre gorge. We may also have the chance to spot some of the park's wildlife. The most visible large mammals are the Beisa oryx, Soemmering's gazelle and the Slat's dik-dik. The park also boasts lions, hyenas and jackals, although these are seen less frequently.

## DAY 4 Drive to Addis; orientation tour

Driving back to Addis via the Rift Valley Lakes, we aim to arrive in the capital this afternoon, before taking a tour of the main highlights. This will include the Ethnographic Museum and the Church of the Holy Trinity, whose large dome and slender pinnacles make it a landmark in the city.

## DAY 5 Fly to Bahar Dar

Today, we take a morning flight north to Bahar Dar, capital of the Amhara region and situated on the shores of Lake Tana. In the afternoon, we visit a viewpoint close to the source of the Blue Nile. With tremendous views over Bahar Dar and Lake Tana, we can pause to consider the tremendous distance this body of water must now travel to reach its mouth in the Delta region of Lower Egypt and the Mediterranean.

## DAY 6 At Bahar Dar; visit Tississat Falls

This morning's visit takes us a short distance south of Bahar Dar to Tississat Falls, also known as Blue Nile Falls. After crossing a 16th century Portuguese-built bridge, we walk for approximately 45 minutes up the hillside on an easy path to a viewpoint. From here, it is easy to understand the Amharic translation for these falls - 'the water that smokes'. Once, these falls were the second most magnificent in Africa, after Victoria Falls. Unfortunately, the construction of a nearby hydroelectric plant dramatically reduces their volume on occasions, but they are still an impressive sight to behold. There may also be the opportunity to extend our exploration to a two-hour circular walk, including a short boat crossing of the Nile, should this appeal. After returning to Bahar Dar for lunch, we take a boat trip on Lake Tana. Making a stop on the Zeghie Peninsula, we are shown round the Ura Kidane Meret Church by a local guide. Part of the Complex of the Convent of Mercy and dating back to Medieval times, its walls are painted with numerous murals and it contains valuable manuscripts and religious treasures.

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## DAY 7 Drive to Gondar, castle visit

Today we drive to Gondar, located on the high plateau just north of Lake Tana. The town was the imperial capital of Ethiopia for 200 years. Gondar's most famous monuments are its exceptionally well preserved 17th century castles. The largest and best is that of King Fasilidas. It is a stone-built construction with round turrets and wooden balconies. The king also built remarkable baths a mile or so outside of town known as the 'Pavilion of Delight'. This whole complex of buildings is unique in Ethiopia and unlike anything found elsewhere in Africa. This afternoon, as well as visiting the baths and the castle ruins, we'll also make a visit to the Debre Berhan Selassie Church, famed for its ceiling frescoes of many faces.

## DAY 8 Drive to Debarq,

A morning's drive takes us to Debarq, the village base for hiking in the Simien Mountains. The range lies north of Gondar and many of the peaks rise above 4000 metres. The highest is Mount Ras Dashen at 4543 metres, the fifth highest in Africa. The mountains are criss-crossed with tracks worn out by the local people travelling from village to village, or moving their animals to fresh pastures. The combination of these tracks and the spectacular scenery make for excellent walking. This afternoon, we will take a short walk around the village that will be our base for the next two nights.

## DAY 9 In the Simien Mountains

Today we plan to explore the Simien Mountains National Park on foot. We'll keep an eye out for some of Ethiopia's endemic mammals, the walia ibex, gelada baboon and the rare Simien fox - misnamed as it is not really a fox, but a member of the dog family. Today's walk will take approximately four hours, with plenty of stops. It is, of course, completely optional for those who would prefer not to take part.

## DAY 10 Drive to Axum

Today's full day's drive to Axum takes us over the Simien Mountains and through the Tekeze Valley. Although the roads are rough and dusty, the views in this remote part of Ethiopia are simply spectacular and more than make up for them. The route is dotted with intermittent mountain hamlets that add to the splendour. We will enjoy plenty of stops for photo opportunities. The sacred city of Axum sits in the Tigrayan region and was the capital of the Ethiopian empire between the 1st and 10th centuries AD. As the birthplace of Christianity within the country, it was also a bustling commercial centre. We can look forward to a two night stay here. Please note: Should the road to Axum be impassable due to weather conditions, we will return to Gondar and fly to Axum.

## DAY 11 Sightseeing in Axum

We will spend today exploring Axum by bus and on foot with a local guide. Evidence of its former importance now lies in several places in or near the town. Ruined fortresses, palaces and churches, plus an abundance of giant obelisks, or 'stelae', stand as mute reminders of its former glory. Axum claims to be the final resting place of the sacred Ark of the Covenant. But while its local guardians continue to celebrate the legend, the object of their veneration is kept strictly under wraps.

## DAY 12 Fly to Lalibela; visit rock cut churches

Today we will fly to Lalibela for a two-night stay in one of the world's most remarkable historic sites. Although churches carved in rock are found in other parts of the world, those found in Ethiopia are particularly interesting. Generally, they were excavated on all sides of a rectangle, leaving a large block of granite isolated in the centre. This rock was then shaped and formed both inside and out and the carvings show extremely skilful workmanship. Lalibela, the New Jerusalem, is thought to have been constructed some 800 years ago by King Lalibela as his capital city. These days, this UNESCO World Heritage Site is a small village. This afternoon's tour involves a certain amount of scrambling through a labyrinth of tunnels. The churches stand in two main groups on either side of a stream, known locally as 'The River Jordan'. There are 11 rock-cut churches, of which the most impressive is Bet Giorgis. It is carved in the form of a Greek cross and approached through a passage in the rock. Between them, these rock-cut churches are one of the great wonders of the world.

## DAY 13 In Lalibela; mule trek

Located among the mountains that encircle Lalibela are several more isolated churches. Using mules, we journey for some two hours to Ashatan Maryam Church and are rewarded with stunning views over Lalibela and the peaks and mountains of these remote highlands. Reached by steep shale paths, it will be necessary to dismount in places due to the terrain. Good footwear is a must. Vertigo sufferers or people with a low level of fitness may choose not to partake in the mule trek, your tour leader can advise you. This afternoon we return to Lalibela, allowing more time to explore the rock-cut churches.

After a free morning in Lalibela to visit churches that you may not yet have seen, we take a flight back to Addis Ababa, where the tour ends.

Please note that any pre- 1999 or torn US Dollar bills will not be accepted in Ethiopia. Please keep any receipts as you may be able to change back any unused local currency.

### Flight Information

You are able to book this tour on a 'land only' basis or as a 'flight inclusive' package. Your flight inclusive package will be fully protected by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) ATOL protection scheme.

### Booking a land only package with Explore

### Travel Insurance

It is a condition of joining any of our tours that you must have valid travel insurance. It must indicate that you have cover for (at least) medical expenses and emergency repatriation in the event of illness or injury. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling in England and Scotland. We also strongly recommend your policy includes curtailment, personal effects and cancellation protection as all deposits paid are non-refundable. You will also need to ensure your travel policy covers you for all activities you intend to do whilst on tour.

### Visa Information

Ethiopia: Visas for UK nationals can be obtained on arrival, although this can change at short notice, and you should be prepared to queue on arrival. Should you wish to apply for a visa prior to departure, please note that a single entry visa is valid for 30 days from the date of issue, so you must submit your application no more than two weeks prior to departure. It is also possible to apply for a multi-entry visa which is valid for 3 months from issue.

Visas can be obtained through Explore's recommended visa service in the UK; Visaswift, at <http://www.visaswift.com/explore.aspx>. Other nationalities should consult their local embassy or consular office.

All visa information is subject to change. You should confirm all visa related questions with the relevant Embassy prior to departure.

### Vaccinations & Protection

#### Ethiopia

We recommend protection against malaria, hepatitis A, diphtheria, tetanus, typhoid and polio. Although the risk is low you may also consider immunisation against rabies and meningococcal meningitis. Consult your travel clinic for latest advice on different prophylaxis available against Malaria. The above is not an exhaustive list. ## Preparing for your Tour

### Climate

#### Ethiopia

Ethiopia is generally pleasant and warm, but varies with altitude. The long rains usually arrive mid- June to early September and the short rains between mid-February and April although this pattern has been completely erratic in recent times. After the rains, the highlands of northern Ethiopia are usually green and thus particularly scenic. The temperature all year round rarely falls below 18°C. Night-time temperatures in the mountains can be cold and can drop below freezing at higher altitude. There is a strong risk of sunburn at high altitude in Ethiopia. Additional information and climate charts can be accessed at <http://www.explore.co.uk/weather>. Seasonal weather patterns can be unpredictable. Up-to-date information on the weather worldwide can be found by following the BBC weather link on this page.

### Clothing

Daytime temperatures are mainly warm and comfortable but evenings in the highlands can be cold. We recommend a thick jumper or warm fleece and lightweight wind/waterproof clothing. Take a sun hat.

### Equipment

Bring sun cream, a torch and memory cards for your camera. An insect repellent against fleas could be useful for the churches at Lalibela.

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## Footwear

Comfortable, good walking shoes with ankle support are strongly recommended as well as comfortable sandals.

One main piece of baggage and a daypack. Please note that there is a weight restriction of 7kg for hand luggage/daypack for international and internal flights.

In addition, As a member of the Association of Bonded Travel Organisers Trust Limited (ABTOT), Explore has provided a bond to meet the requirements of the Package Travel, Package Holidays and Package Tours Regulations 1992. Please note that packages booked outside the UK are only protected when purchased directly with Explore.

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### Reserving your place

To reserve your place on this tour you will need to check availability on the Explore website or through our dedicated call centre based in the UK where you can. Our tours can fill up quickly so you are advised to book as early as possible. If your chosen date is 'Available' or 'Guaranteed' we will be able to provisionally hold you a space for up to 48 hours.

For Self-Guided holidays and Private Journeys simply choose your date of travel and let us know so we can confirm all ground services.

The easiest way to confirm your booking is through our website. When you are ready to book, we normally require a 10% non-refundable deposit, but for some holidays this may be more to cover such items as permit fees, internal flights or other non-refundable services.
