DAY 1 Join tour in Trogir, settle into cabins on boat

Arriving in Trogir, we join our traditional wooden boat, docked on the old town waterfront. Old Trogir is a pretty, walled town of ancient palaces and jutting belfries and is a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage site and one of the best preserved Romanesque-Gothic towns in Central Europe. The town offers a lot of sights that are worth visiting such as the Cathedral, Castle Kamerlengo and the Tower of Saint Marc. Tonight we shall meet the crew, settle into our cabins and have a light supper on board.

DAY

2 Cruise to Vis Island and sea kayaking

We start our journey cruising towards Komiza on Vis Island, which is a full days sailing. Along the way we'll stop at Bisevo to visit the Blue Cave. In this grotto, if there is direct sunshine overhead, it displays the most wondrous turquoise waters, which give the cave its name. We then sail from the small inlet of Bisevo to Vis Town on the island of the same name which boasts both Greek and Roman ruins, a very pretty church and a small fort with sloping walls over the entrance to the port. We also enjoy an included sea kayaking excursion for a few hours that departs from Komiza on the north west of Vis Island. Our sea kayaking journey takes us to a number of beaches close to Manjarema Fort and the beautiful Barjoska Bay with its crystal clear waters. There is also the opportunity to walk to an old military bunker at Barjoska. Tonight we will either moor in the harbour at Vis Town where we can dine in a waterfront restaurant or alternatively we may move around the headland to a quiet bay where a tunnel was constructed by the Yugoslavs to hide their ships from the German air raids during World War II. A section of the tunnel has been converted into a family run wine cellar where you have the option to stop and sample the local wine. In splendid isolation and away from the harbour lights, you can dine on board (optional) and spend time gazing up at the stars.

DAY

3 Cruise to Vela Luka (Korcula Island)

Today we head to Korcula, one of the most historical of all the Dalmatian Islands and is believed to be the birth place of Marco Polo, as well as being famed for its high quality white wine production. They'll be plenty of time today to stop for a swim or to snorkel. Vela Luka is our overnight mooring spot and is well-known for its beauty and old buildings including the parish church of St. Joseph which houses a museum, a gallery and a library which houses a collection of drawings, small sculptures and ship models carved in wood. Vela Luka is also home to many talented musicians and artists and do not be surprised if spontaneous singing starts on a street corner. There is also a good selection of restaurants and inns offering traditional specialties and locally produced wine. This evening there's the option to visit an olive grove where you can have dinner and enjoy a local music performance.

DAY

4 Cruise to Korcula Island and windsurfing

Continuing east, we follow Korcula's coastline with stops for swimming and snorkelling to our destination tonight, Lumbarda which is close to Korcula Town itself. It is from here that we have our included windsurfing lesson with an instructor who will teach the basics of how to manoeuvre the board to best catch the wind. Lumbarda on the island of Korcula is undoubtedly one of the highlights of the trip. Take a self-guided walking tour of this wonderfully compact walled town whose history, like most of Croatia, spans the centuries with the first settlement believed to be from the 3rd century BC by the Greeks (Psephism and the gnathia vases from this period can be found in the museum). Discover Rector's Place and City Museum which is housed in a 16th Century mansion and boasts Byzantine icons. The island is a photographers dream, with its red terracotta roofs, stone cathedrals and winding roads. There are several taverns and inns in Lumbarda offering traditional dishes, especially fresh grilled fish seasoned with olive oil and accompanied by the local white wines. It is also known for its white wine called Grk which has been locally produced for hundreds of years.

DAY

5 Cruise to Hvar (Hvar Island) with guided walk

Today we head eastwards to the tiny island of Scedro, south of Hvar. We stop at this secluded bay to enjoy lunch on board and to take a swim, or maybe visit a small harbour. We then make for Hvar, where 7,000 years of history are encapsulated in this small island town. Sparkling amid green hills, rocky terrain and a sea of cobalt blue, Hvar is a producer of olive oil, lavender oil and wine. The town is filled with sophisticated shops, cafes and restaurants with a main-square where most of the activity revolves. Our tour leader will guide you through the narrow streets to visit the citadel with the chance to see the first citizen's theatre, founded in 1612, the 15th century Franciscan Monastery, the old rectory that today houses a collection of lace, manuscripts and books and the church with its remarkable collection of paintings. In the main square, you'll see Saint Stephen's Cathedral with its treasury and bell tower, all of which bear the mark of Venetian rule. We return to our boat this evening to enjoy dinner on board.

DAY 6 Cruise to Brac, cycle ride and swim stops

This morning we take to two wheels and cycle from Starigrad on Hvar Island through small island settlements, fields and vineyards along a trail that follows the old Greek and Roman pathways. There may also be the opportunity between Vrboska and Jelsa to have a short swimming break on one of the beaches, which expands over the 10 km coastline. Upon re-boarding our boat, we then head north to the Island of Brac with an included stop at Bol on Brac Island which has an excellent beach from where you can swim. Above Bol is Vidova gora which is the highest point of the Adriatic islands. There are also a Christian sarcophagus with the engraved crosses, the church of St. Ivan and St. Tudor which were built in the 11th century and the local church of the Madonna of Karmel, with the motive of an angel with the handkerchief of Veronica. We then dock for the night at the quiet port and village of Milna. From here we can explore the local monastery and enjoy the tranquil surroundings.

DAY 7 Cruise to Solta Island

Today we make the short journey to Solta Island where we enjoy our lunch in a bay before having the opportunity to visit an olive oil factory and taste the local produce. The waterfront was built in the early 19th century and it is where the local fishermen still sell their freshly caught produce early each morning. The area is famous for olives, homemade olive oil and gingerbreads which have been cultivated over many years with sailors bringing exotic spices back to the island which was used within its ingredients. Tonight, as it will be our last evening onboard, we'll get to enjoy a Captain's dinner.

DAY 8 Cruise to Trogir where tour ends

With just an hour or two's sailing time along the coast to Trogir which sadly is our final destination, there is time on arrival to explore the narrow streets and old buildings of this pretty walled town.

Ability to swim required

An ability to swim is essential for your safe enjoyment of this water-based tour.

Accommodation and Meals

Accommodation Rating

We use a boat that is a family run traditional Croatian 'Oldtimer' vessel steered by the boat captain who used to cruise around the islands with his father. There are 10 twin cabins (bunk beds) on the main and upper deck, with a wash basin in each cabin. There are also 4 toilet/showers and one separate shower.

Please be aware that cabin space is limited so please pack accordingly. Soft bags are much easier to stow than hard-framed suitcases.

Our boat is equipped with a galley (kitchen), dining room and spacious sundeck. There is also a boat ladder to make the most of the swimming and snorkelling opportunities. There is an Explore tour leader, plus the captain, boat crew and a cook on board. Breakfasts and lunches are generally taken on board the boat, leaving you free to sample the cuisine in local restaurants in the evenings.

While our intention is to adhere to the day-to-day route printed, a degree of flexibility is built into the itinerary. Overnight stops and even islands visited, may vary due to weather, sea conditions and the availability of mooring space in harbours. In some harbours, we may be mooring alongside other boats and so access may involve crossing other vessels decks.

Food & Drink

Included meals: 7 breakfasts, 3 lunches, 4 dinners included in the price of this tour. Please be prepared to pay for non-included meals. Please note that costs for drinks and meals can vary depending on location.

Budgeting for your Tour

You will need some extra money to cover meals and drinks not included in the tour price, any optional sightseeing, souvenirs and items of a personal nature such as laundry.

Tipping - Tour Leader

Some local staff will look to members of the group for personal recognition of particular services provided. Accordingly, you should allow £15.00 for tipping. In order to make things easier for you, the Tour Leaders may organise a group's tips kitty and if this is the case, they will account for it throughout the tour.

Foreign Exchange

Croatia

ATM Availability: Most towns have ATM's for cash withdrawal.

Credit Card Acceptance: Generally accepted throughout including most larger restaurants (make sure you have informed your credit card company that you are travelling abroad as some companies will reject payments)

Travellers Cheques: Travellers Cheques can only be exchanged in banks.

Local Currency: Croatian Kuna.

Recommended Currency for Exchange: Sterling pounds, US Dollars and Euro cash can all be exchanged for the local currency.

Where to Exchange: Most major towns have a Bureau de Change

Joining your Tour

Flight Information

You are able to book this tour on a 'land only' basis or as a 'flight inclusive' package. Your flight inclusive package will be fully protected by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) ATOL protection scheme.

Booking a land only package with Explore

Customers who have chosen to book on the 'Land Only' arrangements of our tour, please ensure that you have checked your tour specific 'Joining Instructions' prior to booking your own travel arrangements. Joining Tour Abroad

Customers booked on the 'Land Only' arrangements will now receive a Free Transfer, provided you arrive and depart on the tour only itinerary start and end dates. The transfers will be from the Explore designated airport or train station to the joining point of your tour, and then back from the ending point to the designated airport or train station. The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of booking.

Important Information

Travel Insurance

It is a condition of joining any of our tours that you must have valid travel insurance. It must indicate that you have cover for (at least) medical expenses and emergency repatriation in the event of illness or injury. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling in England and Scotland. We also strongly recommend your policy includes curtailment, personal effects and cancellation protection as all deposits paid are non-refundable. You will also need to ensure your travel policy covers you for all activities you intend to do whilst on tour.

We are delighted to include FREE travel insurance **for all qualifying customers** who book an Explore trip from 01 January 2015.

Visa Information

Croatia: Visas are not required by UK, Australian, New Zealand, US or Canadian citizens. Other nationalities should consult their local embassy or consular office.

All visa information is subject to change. You should confirm all visa related questions with the relevant Embassy prior to departure.

Lone Parents

Croatia

Single parents or other adults travelling alone with children should be aware that some countries require documentation confirming that the individual has authority to travel with the minor. It is crucial that you contact the Croatian embassy for further information on exactly what may be required.

Vaccinations & Protection

Croatia

Nothing compulsory, but we recommend protection against hepatitis A, polio, tetanus, and typhoid. Tick-borne encephalitis is recommended by some medical sources if travelling in certain areas of Eastern Europe, at specific times of the year. Check latest requirements with your travel clinic or doctor prior to departure. The above is not an exhaustive list. Visa and vaccination requirements are subject to change and should be confirmed before departure.

Preparing for your Tour

Climate

Croatia

The Croatian Adriatic has a Mediterranean climate with mild winters and warm, sunny summers. There is a chance of sporadic rain in spring and autumn, though generally it is in the form of short showers. Thunderstorms occur in summer, generally helping to cool the air. Itineraries with boat cruises can occasionally be disrupted due to bad weather.

Clothing

July and August are the hottest months, but early and late in the season go prepared with clothing to suit drops in temperature and the showers. You'll need your swimming gear, a bath towel and a beach towel. Light rainwear may be needed at any time of year, and a warm fleece/jacket is recommended for cooler evenings and nights.

Equipment

A water bottle, sun hat and sunscreen are all essential and you may wish to bring your own mask and snorkel. Please note that if you wish to sleep out on deck on some nights, as many choose to do in good weather, you should bring a sheet sleeping bag and a roll-mat, as the cabin bedding is not permitted on deck.

Footwear

Trainers or light walking shoes are ideal plus sandals for relaxing. Footwear is generally not worn on board, but you may find a pair of old shoes or plastic sandals useful to avoid sea urchins on rocks.

Luggage: On Tour

One main piece of baggage and daypack. But pack light as space is limited. As with all boat trips, cabin space is limited, so please pack accordingly – soft luggage is much easier to stow than a hard frame suitcase.

Luggage allowance on tour: 20kg

In addition, As a member of the Association of Bonded Travel Organisers Trust Limited (ABTOT), Explore has provided a bond to meet the requirements of the Package Travel, Package Holidays and Package Tours Regulations 1992. Please note that packages booked outside the UK are only protected when purchased directly with Explore.

Reserving your place

To reserve your place on this tour you will need to check availability on the Explore website or through our dedicated call centre based in the UK where you can. Our tours can fill up quickly so you are advised to book as early as possible. If your chosen date is 'Available' or 'Guaranteed' we will be able to provisionally hold you a space for up to 48 hours.

For Self-Guided holidays and Private Journeys simply choose your date of travel and let us know so we can confirm all ground services.

The easiest way to confirm your booking is through our website. When you are ready to book, we normally require a 10% non-refundable deposit, but for some holidays this may be more to cover such items as permit fees, internal flights or other non-refundable services.
