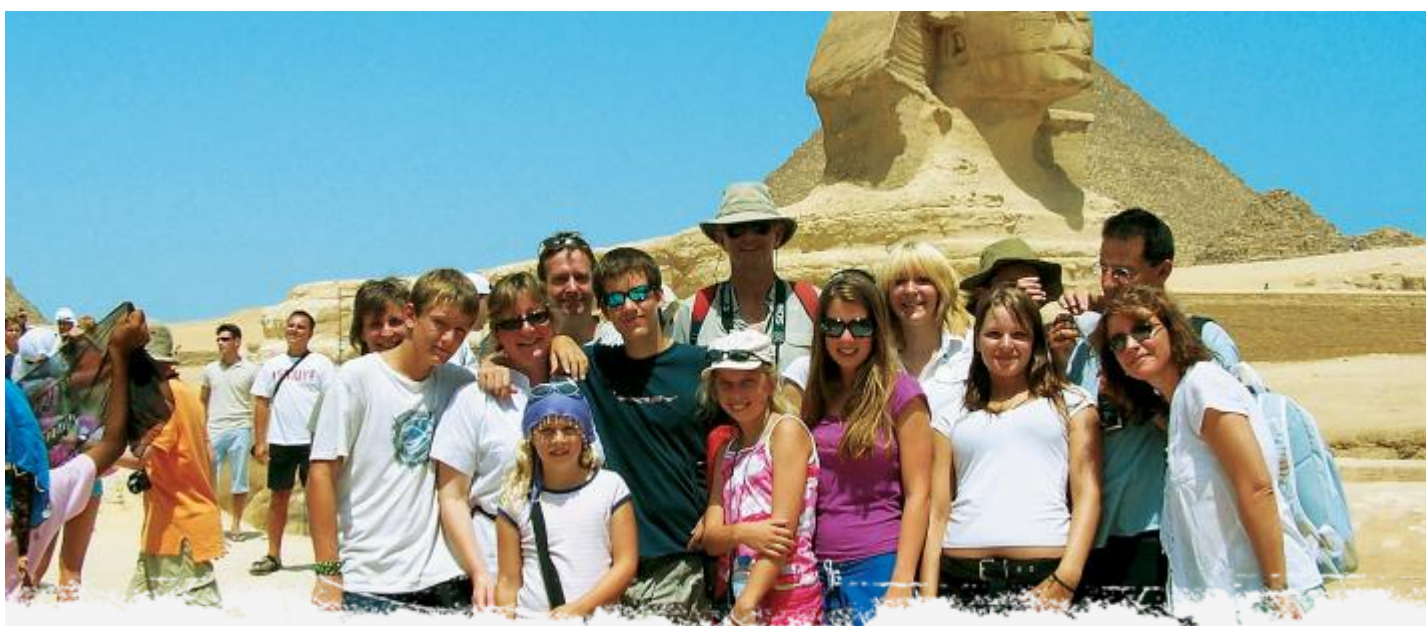

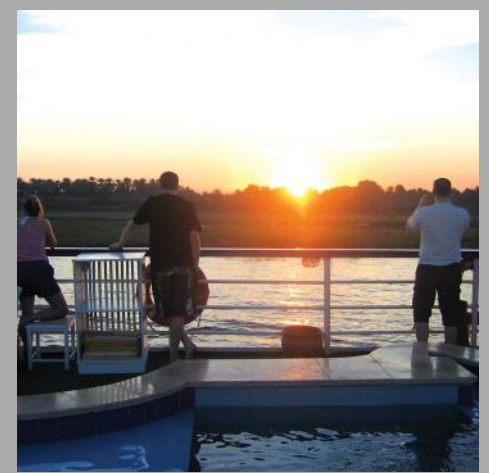

### DAY 1 Join tour Cairo

Arrive in Cairo and check-in at the hotel. Cairo is a vibrant, exhilarating, fascinating and welcoming city. Home to the best Pharaonic, Coptic and Islamic sites in Egypt, this city boasts a range of ancient monument that you can discover while wandering around. If you arrive early, you may wish to catch your first glimpse of the mighty Nile River, visit the capital's medieval markets at Khan El-Khalili or walk down the Nile promenade. There are also plenty of cinemas, theatres and modern shopping malls.

DAY **2** Sightseeing in Cairo; overnight train to Aswan

Africa's largest capital, Cairo is situated mainly on the east bank of the Nile. This morning we drive to Giza to visit one of the seven ancient wonders of the world, the Pyramids, among the most impressive man-made spectacles in the world. Here, you can opt to venture inside a pyramid or admire the Solar Boat, designed to transport the Pharaoh's soul to the afterlife. The complex includes the Sphinx, a crouching lion with a human head carved from solid rock, and the splendid Granite Temple. In the afternoon, we visit the Egyptian Museum, which amongst its 100,000 artefacts contains the extraordinary treasures of Tutankhamun, complete with his Golden Mask. We may also have the opportunity to visit the Children's Museum located in the Egyptian Museum, where you could have the chance to build your own pyramid! Tonight we board the overnight train to Aswan.

DAY **3** Arrive in Aswan; free afternoon; included Nubian dinner

Today we hope to arrive in Aswan by noon time where we will transfer directly to our hotel. We have left the afternoon free for you to settle into this exciting, bustling town; you might choose to visit the Nubian Museum or town souks. In the evening we plan a visit a riverside village where we dine with a Nubian family who have worked with Explore for many years.

DAY **4** Optional visit to Abu Simbel; free afternoon in Aswan

Today we have the chance to visit the fabulous rock-hewn temple of Abu Simbel. Cut into the rock face, this enormous structure was raised 61 metres to save it from inundation by the artificial lake created by the Aswan High Dam. The 20 metre high statues represent Ramses II who was known as the Great Builder. Alternatively, you might wander the streets of Aswan which is situated on the east bank of the Nile, just below the first Cataract. The town is well known for a meeting point of Arab culture with Nubia and Black Africa and consequently the excellent souks reflect this fusion between Arab and African cultures. The afternoon is left free for your own family exploration, which might involve visiting the souks of Aswan or simply relaxing by the pool.

DAY **5** Camel trek to St Simeon's Monastery; board the Nile cruise boat

In the morning, we cross the river by motor launch and meet our camels for an exciting journey across the desert to the abandoned Coptic monastery of St Simeon, then return via a different route to the river. Around lunchtime we board our Nile cruise boat for a three day voyage down river to Luxor. During our cruise, we see the intensive cultivation of the Nile Valley (mainly sugarcane and maize) and at intermittent points are small villages which depend upon the river for their livelihood.

DAY **6** Sail via Edfu Temple to Esna

We sail to the major settlement of Kom Ombo situated on the east bank of the Nile. Dating from the Ptolemaic period, the temple of Kom Ombo is unique in that it is dedicated to two gods. Both Horus and Sobek were worshipped; Sobek is the crocodile god - much needed at this spot as this stretch of the river was noted for crocodiles until early this century! We then sail to Edfu Temple, the largest Egyptian temple after Karnak. Edfu supposedly marks the position where the god Horus met and vanquished his father Osiris's murderer, Seth. The site dates from the time of the Ptolemies (3rd-1st century BC). A sacred falcon-headed god guards the Temple of Horus, which is in almost perfect condition. The temple is unusual in that the roof is still intact. We moor overnight at Esna.

## DAY 7 Sail towards Luxor; Karnak Temple visit

Early in the morning we pass through the lock in the dam at Esna which was built in 1906 to regulate the Nile floodwaters. From here, we sail on to Luxor and upon arrival we have the afternoon in Luxor with a trip to Karnak Temple. There are also optionals to visit Habu Temple, Workers Tombs, or perhaps the souk for find bargains for some souvenirs. In Luxor we will normally be accommodated on the west bank of the Nile, opposite the main city with a motorboat being available to transfer you across the river.

## DAY 8 Visit Queen Hatshepsut Temple and the Valley of the Kings; free afternoon in Luxor

Rising very early this morning, we cross the Nile to enjoy a visit to the extraordinary Temple of Queen Hatshepsut, Egypt's only female Pharaoh who usurped the throne from her son, the future Tuthmoses III. The scale of the temple and it's magnificent setting is breathtaking, but perhaps even more remarkable are the details - look out for the fine carving of the Expedition to the Land of Punt. We then take a bus ride to the Valley of the Kings to explore some of the more important sites made famous in 1922 by the discovery of the tomb of Tutankhamun by Howard Carter. We visit three tombs. In the afternoon you are free to enjoy the historical city as you wish. This may involve some pool time or even an optional donkey ride through the villages and fields of the West Bank with a great view of the sun set over the Nile.

## Joining your Tour

### Flight Information

You are able to book this tour on a 'land only' basis or as a 'flight inclusive' package. Your flight inclusive package will be fully protected by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) ATOL protection scheme.

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### Booking a land only package with Explore

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### Joining Tour Abroad

The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of booking.

## Important Information

### Travel Insurance

It is a condition of joining any of our tours that you must have valid travel insurance. It must indicate that you have cover for (at least) medical expenses and emergency repatriation in the event of illness or injury. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling in England and Scotland. We also strongly recommend your policy includes curtailment, personal effects and cancellation protection as all deposits paid are non-refundable. You will also need to ensure your travel policy covers you for all activities you intend to do whilst on tour.

We are delighted to include FREE travel insurance **for all qualifying customers** who book an Explore trip from 01 January 2015.

### Visa Information

Egypt: An entry visa is required by all nationalities. UK citizens can obtain a visa on arrival at the airport for the current cost of 25USD. Please note, you must purchase a visa stamp at one of the nearby banks before proceeding to the immigration desk.

Visas can also be obtained prior to departure through Explore's recommended visa service in the UK; Visaswift, at <http://www.visaswift.com/explore.aspx>. Other nationalities should consult their local embassy or consular office.

All visa information is subject to change. You should confirm all visa related questions with the relevant Embassy prior to departure.

### Lone Parents

#### Egypt

Single parents or other adults travelling alone with children should be aware that some countries require documentation confirming that the individual has authority to travel with the minor. It is crucial that you contact the Egyptian embassy for further information on exactly what may be required.

### Vaccinations & Protection

#### Egypt

Nothing compulsory but we recommend protection against typhoid, tetanus, infectious hepatitis and polio. Though malaria does exist in Egypt it is not normally found in the areas in which we travel. For the most up to date advice please consult your travel clinic.

## Preparing for your Tour

### Climate

#### Egypt

Egypt's climate is hot and dry, typical of a desert environment. In summer it can be very hot and remain hot overnight whereas winter days are milder by comparison and temperatures can drop considerably at night. The mildest area is along the Mediterranean coast with temperatures ranging from 23-31°C in summer and 10-17°C in winter. In the desert region temperatures fluctuate in summer reaching as low as 7°C at night and 40°C during the day and in winter it can vary from 0°C at night to 18°C in the day. Aswan is one of the hottest cities with Cairo and Alexandria generally being slightly cooler. Egypt receives very little rainfall annually and rainfall in summer is very rare.

### Clothing

Women and older girls are advised not to wear shorts or dresses that are too revealing as this can attract unwelcome attention in the streets of Muslim towns - loose fitting trousers or slacks are ideal. Females should also cover their head and shoulders when entering a mosque and men should wear long trousers.

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## Equipment

Bring a water bottle, insect repellent and a small torch for examining wall carvings. Sunhat, high factor sunscreen and sunglasses are essential. Please note that on the donkey trek and the camel trek we cannot supply hard hats - if head protection is felt to be necessary please bring your own with you to Egypt, as hard hats are not available to buy locally.

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## Footwear

Comfortable shoes or trainers for sightseeing and donkey/camel rides; plus sandals.

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## Luggage: On Tour

One main piece of baggage and daypack. Remember you are expected to carry your own luggage so don't overload yourself.

Please note that packages booked outside the UK are only protected when purchased directly with Explore.

### Reserving your place

To reserve your place on this tour you will need to check availability on the Explore website or through our dedicated call centre based in the UK where you can. Our tours can fill up quickly so you are advised to book as early as possible. If your chosen date is 'Available' or 'Guaranteed' we will be able to provisionally hold you a space for up to 48 hours.

For Self-Guided holidays and Private Journeys simply choose your date of travel and let us know so we can confirm all ground services.

The easiest way to confirm your booking is through our website.
