## Family Toubkal Teen Trek

This exciting family trip to Morocco combines a challenging ascent of North Africa's highest mountain with the vibrant city of Marrakech. As we trek through Berber villages and juniper forests to the summit of Jebel Toubkal (4167 metres), we enjoy majestic views over the massif. We end our trip in Marrakech exploring the souk and the lively Djemma El-Fna square.

### Why Book this tour

This holiday is especially designed for families with children from 11 years and upwards and is intended for those who enjoy walking and are also up for the challenge of climbing to the summit of Mount Toubkal, the highest mountain in North Africa. With a few nights camping as we travel through the Atlas Mountains and the opportunity to meet the local Berber villagers, this is a great adventure that will be remembered.

We've given each of our tours a comfort rating and a tour pace, walking or cycling grade to give you a general idea about the level of activity on each tour and the standard of accommodation you will be staying in at the end of your day's adventure.

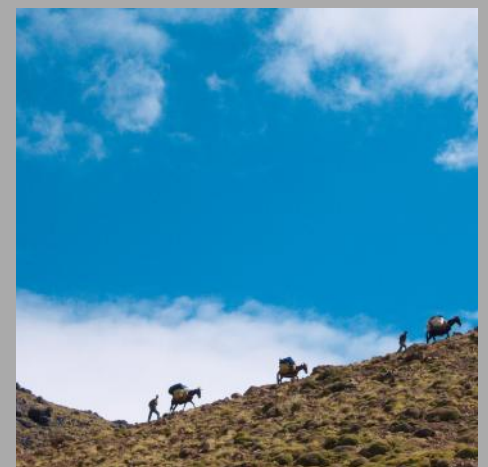
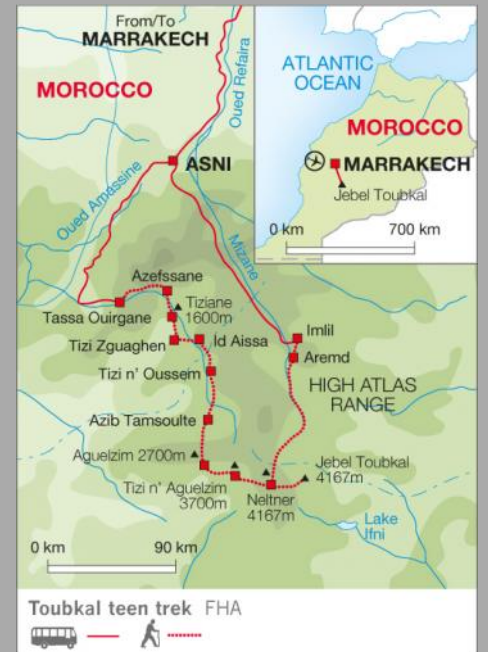
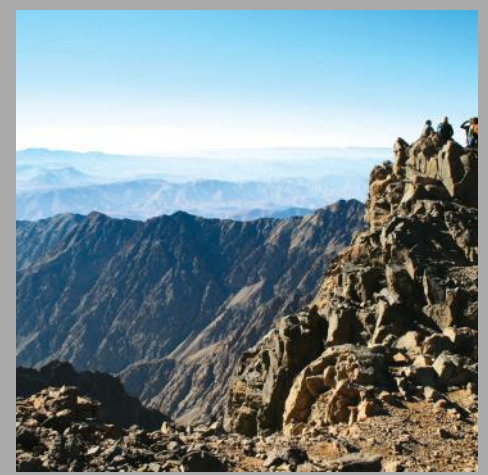

### DAY 1 Join tour Marrakech

Marrakech is the spiritual heart of Morocco, the cultural melting pot of the mountain Berbers and the desert peoples of the south, whose eclectic mix of ideals and traditions has resulted in a fascinating clash of colour, noise and visual delights that is straight out of the 'Arabian Nights'.

## DAY 2 Drive to Ouirgane and trek to Tiziane (1600m)

Leaving the city behind we drive south today, towards the craggy peaks and plunging valleys of the Toubkal Massif. Crossing the Haouz Plain we pass through the tiny town of Asni, from where our road begins to climb towards the foothills of the Massif. The towering peaks of the High Atlas are North Africa's greatest range of mountains, a wild region, culturally removed from the rest of Morocco, and a barrier between the northern plains and the pre-Sahara. This is the land of the fiercely independent Berbers, the 'Lords of the Atlas', whose traditions and ways still hold sway up here in their mountain strongholds far away from the cities below. The Berbers present us with a unique view of a way of life lost to the rest of North Africa, where music and dance, even language and religion, are far removed from their Arab neighbours. We reach our trek start point in the berber hamlet of Tassa Ouirgane and set out with our mountain guide and team of mules' heading along the Azzaden valley and Takherkhourte reserve where the last barbary sheep of the Atlas are kept, we enter the Toubka National Park pausing for a picnic lunch at Azerfssane. This afternoon we reach our gite at Tiziane (1600m). Approx 4hrs walking.

## DAY 3 Trek to Aguelzim (2460m)

Continuing through the valley we pass through the remote berber villages of Tizi Zguaghen, Id Aissa and Tizi n'Oussema to Azib Tamsoultea which is a grazing village where the families spend the hot summer months in a higher location with their goats and sheep. As the Toubkal massif draws nearer this afternoon we walk through juniper forest to Azib Tzikert and our camp at Aguelzim (2460m). Approx 6hrs walking.

## DAY 4 Trek via Tizi n'Aguelzim to Neltner (3050m)

This morning we climb to the high pass of Tizi n'Aguelzim (3520 m) following a mule track zig-zagging its way up to an initial pass with stunning views to Tizi Oussema, Asni and the plain of Haouz. From the highest point of today's trek we see Toubkal itself in all its majestic glory before descending to our base camp for our attempt on Toubkal at Neltner. Approx 6-7hrs walking.

## DAY 5 Trek to summit of Jebel Toubkal (4165m); return to Neltner

Early this morning we make our attempt on the summit of Jebel Toubkal, the highest peak in Northern Africa. Our route takes us up the south cirque, crossing the stream above the refuge and then heading across one of the mountain's numerous scree fields, where we will have to negotiate a seemingly endless carpet of boulders and rocks. The walking is relatively straightforward, but the scree and the altitude will make the going quite difficult in parts, however, the views along the way make the journey more than worthwhile. Cresting the ridgeline we find ourselves on the plateau, from where it is a short walk to the summit and the vistas out across the surrounding landscape are quite breathtaking. From here there are unrestricted views in every direction, from the Marrakech Plain to the High Atlas in the north and as far south as the Anti-Atlas and the Sahara. Pliny, the great Roman scholar, once described the High Atlas Mountains as the most fabulous mountains in all of Africa and from our vantage point high above the valley it is easy to understand why. Retracing our steps we return down the mountain to our camp at Neltner. Approx 5hrs walking.

## DAY 6 Trek to Imlil (1750m) & drive to Marrakech; free afternoon

Our final walk this morning takes us down to the small village of Imlil (1740m) where we are met for our return drive back to Marrakech. (Approx 4-5 hrs walking) There will be time this afternoon to relax after our trek and perhaps sample the nightly entertainment on the celebrated Djemma El Fna Square. A feast for the senses, the area is a chaotic confusion of noise and colour, where you will find the streets alive with storytellers and letterwriters, musicians, jugglers and water-sellers.

## DAY 7 In Marrakech; optional walking tour

This morning you may like to take an optional walking tour around the souks with a local guide, also visiting the museum and the elegant Koutoubia mosque and tower, reputed to be the most perfect Islamic monument in North Africa. Marrakech is divided into two distinct parts, the Gueliz (or modern French-built city) and the Medina (the Old City) and you may like to spend your final afternoon independently exploring its maze of narrow streets, filled with the sounds, colours and smells of the exotic, perhaps haggling for some last minute presents, or just sitting in a café and watching the street tableaux unfold before you.

## Accommodation and Meals

### Accommodation Rating

The hotel in Marrakech is located just outside the city walls and close to the main Jamma El Fna square. The new town is close by and it offers few options of small restaurants and fixed prices souvenir shops. The hotel has a swimming pool and a restaurant with air conditioned rooms. The rest of the night stops are camping as we travel through the valley towards Mount Toubkal and a village house.

### Food & Drink

Included meals: 7 breakfasts, 5 lunches, 4 dinners included in the price of this tour. Please be prepared to pay for non-included meals. Please note that costs for drinks and meals can vary depending on location.

## Budgeting for your Tour

You will need some extra money to cover meals and drinks not included in the tour price, any optional sightseeing, souvenirs and items of a personal nature such as laundry.

### Food

The costs for meals may vary depending upon location, type of restaurant and number of courses eaten and so the prices given are an average guide. Local restaurants located off the beaten track may be less expensive, whereas an upmarket restaurant located in the centre of a major city may charge more.

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## Foreign Exchange

### Morocco

**ATM Availability:** ATMs are available in main towns/cities, though can be unreliable.

**Credit Card Acceptance:** Not all places.

**Travellers Cheques:** Travellers cheques are difficult to exchange and are not recommended.

**Local Currency:** Moroccan Dirham (MAD).

**Recommended Currency for Exchange:** US Dollars, Sterling and Euros are readily exchangeable. We recommend you take a mixture of cash and credit cards. Scottish bank notes and Australian dollar travellers cheques and cash are NOT normally accepted in Morocco.

**Where to Exchange:** Most major towns - your Tour Leader will advise you.

## Joining your Tour

### Flight Information

You are able to book this tour on a 'land only' basis or as a 'flight inclusive' package. Your flight inclusive package will be fully protected by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) ATOL protection scheme.

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### Booking a land only package with Explore

Customers who have chosen to book on the 'Land Only' arrangements of our tour, please ensure that you have checked your tour specific 'Joining Instructions' prior to booking your own travel arrangements. 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### Joining Tour Abroad

The transfers will be from the Explore designated airport or train station to the joining point of your tour, and then back from the ending point to the designated airport or train station. The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of booking.

## Important Information

### Travel Insurance

It is a condition of joining any of our tours that you must have valid travel insurance. It must indicate that you have cover for (at least) medical expenses and emergency repatriation in the event of illness or injury. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling in England and Scotland. We also strongly recommend your policy includes curtailment, personal effects and cancellation protection as all deposits paid are non-refundable. You will also need to ensure your travel policy covers you for all activities you intend to do whilst on tour.

### Visa Information

Morocco: Visas are not required by UK, Australian, New Zealand, US and Canadian citizens. Other nationalities should consult their local embassy or consular office.

All visa information is subject to change. You should confirm all visa related questions with the relevant Embassy prior to departure.

### Lone Parents

#### Morocco

Single parents or other adults travelling alone with children should be aware that some countries require documentation confirming that the individual has authority to travel with the minor. It is crucial that you contact the Morocco embassy for further information on exactly what may be required.

### Vaccinations & Protection

#### Morocco

Nothing compulsory, but we recommend protection against tetanus, typhoid, infectious hepatitis and polio. Consult your travel clinic for latest advice on different prophylaxis available against malaria.

## Preparing for your Tour

### Trekking Details

We trek for 6 days of this trip with an average of 6 hours of walking each day. Generally we walk on well defined but rocky mule tracks. We reach a maximum altitude of 4167m. We have graded this trek as moderate to challenging.

### Altitude Description

### Walking Boots

Well broken in and stout walking boots with good ankle support are essential.

### Climate

#### Morocco

The climate is both Mediterranean and Atlantic. The dry, hot season is from May to October when summer temperatures can reach 38°C and above (if sight seeing is included we will do our best to avoid the heat of the day during this period). Temperatures may drop significantly at times during the night as the day's heat rapidly diminishes. From December to January snow can be expected on mountain passes and it can be wet. In winter, day temperatures will probably be around 18-25°C, dropping to perhaps 0-5°C.

### Clothing

In the highlands conditions are generally dry and sunny during the day but bring warm clothing such as a warm fleece, thermal underwear, warm hat and gloves for cooler nights in the mountains when temperatures drop dramatically. You will also need to bring waterproofs in case the weather changes, particularly at the start and end of the season.

Morocco is a Muslim country and it is important to dress with respect for local customs. People may be offended by shorts or revealing dresses, which can attract unwelcome attention. We advise that in general both men and women should cover shoulders, upper arms

and knees. Transparent, plunging necklines and tightfitting clothes should be avoided. Women should also cover their heads when entering a sanctuary, though in general, mosques are forbidden to non-Muslims.

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## Equipment

Please bring a 3-season sleeping bag (during May and Sept you will need a 4 season bag). Foam mats will be provided, but you may choose to bring your own thermarest for added comfort. Torch, high factor sunscreen, sunglasses.

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## Footwear

Trainers or shoes are useful for relaxing of an evening.

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## Luggage: On Tour

One main piece of baggage a daypack and a rucksack. It is preferable to bring your luggage in soft holdalls rather than a large suitcase - as it is easier to pack them on the vehicles and the mules.
