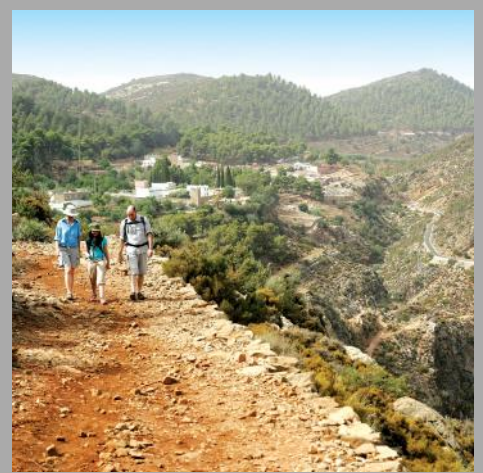
While our intention is to adhere to the day-by-day itinerary as printed below, a degree of flexibility is built in. Overnight stops may vary from those suggested.

DAY 1 Join tour Marrakech

Join your tour in the vibrant city of Marrakech. Depending on the schedule of your flights, you may wish to start exploring the Red City independently or you may prefer to relax by the pool, before meeting the group and the Tour Leader at the hotel. The hotel is located in the heart of the new town surrounded by many restaurants with easy access to the main avenue to the old town. The building is modern with the swimming pool on the top terrace and rooms are equipped with satellite TV.

DAY 2 In Marrakech; walking tour. Drive to Ouirgane

Like many North African towns, Marrakech is divided into two distinct parts, the Gueliz (the modern French-built city) and the Medina (the Old City). For generations it has been a meeting place for the mountain Berbers and the desert peoples of the south, who come to trade and barter amongst the colourful souks, turning the centre of the old city into a rich cacophony of noise and colour. We journey out into this vibrant city this morning, to enjoy a tour of some of its most enthralling sites with a local guide. You can wander past vendors selling doughnuts and fried grasshoppers, meander through native markets where Muslim women, their hands and feet dyed with henna, call out to sell their wares, and enjoy the sounds and the smells of the exotic. After our tour there will be the option to stay in town and make your own way back to the hotel, taking time to enjoy more of the remarkable Medina, perhaps haggling for a bargain or two, or simply sitting at one of the local cafés and watching the street tableaux unfold before you. The city's beating heart is the spectacular Djemma-el-Fna, a site not to be missed and a scene straight out of the pages of the Arabian Nights. You will find the square alive with storytellers and musicians, jugglers and acrobats, snake charmers and clowns. Marrakech is a city like no other and a walk through its bustling streets will fill the senses and fire the imagination. The city boasts a staggering array of spectacular architecture and wonderful facades. Leaving the city behind this afternoon, we drive south towards the craggy peaks and plunging valleys of the Toubkal Massif. Crossing the Haouz Plain we pass through the tiny town of Asni, from where our road begins to climb towards the foothills of the Massif. Below us the valley of the Oued Rhirhaia stretches out into the distance and small villages cling to the sides of the steep hills as we meander our way towards the village of Ouirgane. The towering peaks of the High Atlas are North Africa's greatest range of mountains, a wild region, culturally removed from the rest of Morocco, and a barrier between the northern plains and the pre-Sahara. This is the land of the fiercely independent Berbers, the Lords of the Atlas, whose traditions and ways still hold sway up here in their mountain strongholds far away from the cities below. The Berbers present us with a unique view of a way of life lost to the rest of North Africa, where music and dance, even language and religion, are far removed from their Arab neighbours. Built in the middle of olive groves, the hotel presents a great place for relaxation with its big swimming pool surrounded by nice gardens. It's isolated location gives the opportunities for many walking options.

DAY 3 In Ouirgane, optional activities

Ouirgane presents the perfect spot to relax and enjoy the magnificent scenery of this superb part of North Africa. Today has been left free to enjoy something of its abundant charms at your own pace, with a number of optional activities available to make the most of your time here. Walking in the valley offers some wonderful ways to spend the day. There are also opportunities for swimming, or visiting a Berber village to learn something more of the unique lifestyles of these most remarkable and hospitable of people as well as ride a mule for a closer contact with the local community and their way of life. One of the other options is to ride a mule with opportunities to meet the local community and experience their way of life.

DAY 4 Drive to Ouled Berhil via Tizi n' Test

Heading south today we will first visit the Tin Mal Mosque. Built in 1156 it is one of the only mosques open to non-Muslims and was once considered the center of the reign of the powerful Almohades dynasty. After our visit, we take a dramatic drive through the spectacular Tizi n' Test pass and down into the region of the High Atlas. At 2092 m, the scenes from the pass can be quite spectacular, with views back across to the Toubkal Massif and down into the Souss Valley presenting us with some magnificent photo opportunities. Our descent is something of an exhilarating ride, dropping 1600 metres in just 30 km. The views, as you can imagine, are incredible, with mountain peaks and tiny villages nestling amongst the valley slopes laid out before us. We will arrive with plenty of time to enjoy the surroundings of this evening's accommodation, Riad Hida. This old Riad residence is in the middle of a beautiful farm of orange trees and a multitude of flowers with olive trees that surround the swimming pool giving a natural tranquility to soak up the atmosphere of this rural area.

DAY 5 Drive to Immuizer via Taroudant

Leaving Ouled Berhil we head for the small market town of Taroudant, situated in the Souss valley and surrounded by red-mud walls. The souks are worth a closer look and you may be able to find a bargain souvenir or two. After our visit to Taroudant, we continue our journey back into the mountains and towards Immuizer which lies nestled amongst the western edges of the Atlas. Located outside the village, the hotel building has two floors overlooking the valley and hotel swimming pool plus there are pleasant gardens in which to relax and a tennis court for the more active.

DAY **6** Walk in Immuizer; drive to Essaouira through Paradis valley

Immuizer is a regional market town famed for its honey, which benefits from the bees' ready access to a wide range of wild mountain herbs and is set amidst a landscape of olive and almond groves. We walk this morning out to the site where until recently flowed the famous Immuizer waterfall, enjoying the tranquillity of the setting and perhaps spotting some of the rich birdlife that inhabits this region - crag martins, golden eagles and bonelli's eagles can quite often be seen here. Joining the coast road at Amesnaz, we head for the resort town of Essaouira, a mecca for water sports enthusiasts from all over the region. If time allows we may stop off en route south of Sidi Kaouki, where a rich expanse of open sands and colourful fishing communities present the perfect setting for a walk along the Atlantic coast. Situated within the confines of its 15th century Portuguese fortifications, Essaouira has a lively yet relaxed feel to it, where whitewashed houses and traditional fishing boats present a perfect backdrop for our stay. The town has a rich and somewhat colourful history and its importance as a trading port during the 18th and 19th centuries saw it prosper, attracting British, French, Arab and Jewish merchants and sailors to its shores. These influences are still reflected in the architecture and layout of the town. An interesting, and it has to be said, wholly suspect legend claims the town's patron saint to be a Scotsman by the name of McDougal, who was believed to have been washed up onto these shores after a storm in the 14th century. Another interesting footnote is that much of Orson Welles's version of Othello was filmed here, its ramparts and coastline providing a rich and original setting for Shakespeare's Moorish tragedy. Our accommodation is a private residence that has been turned into a family run hotel and consequently now has a personal feel and homely decor. It also has a swimming and is located 15 minutes from the beach and the old town.

DAY **7** Time to relax and explore

Your time here today is free to indulge as you wish. We suggest a stroll around the old town or along the fine sandy beach from the harbour. Not to be missed is a visit to the Medina, but be warned, after passing through the narrow, highly decorated arched entrance, it may be hard to resist snapping up some of the locally made rustic leather belts, gleaming gold jewellery and wooden boxes exquisitely inlaid with mother of pearl. The town abounds with galleries and workshops, cafes and souks, making it a pleasurable way to pass the day. For the more active amongst you, you may prefer to take to the beaches for some opportunities to enjoy some walks or camel rides along the beach. Swimming is possible but please take local advice before entering the water as the surf off these beaches can prove to be too much for less able swimmers.

DAY **8** Free morning, then drive back to Marrakech

With some extra free time this morning to enjoy the last of Essaouira's laid back ambience, or perhaps grab a last minute bargain, we then head back with a stop on the way in one of the famous Argan cooperatives. The women from different villages work together and produce the precious oil by pressing the nuts by hand until their contents are extracted. We will learn about this traditional skill and its economic benefit on the community. On arrival at the 'Red City' of Marrakech, there should be some time this afternoon to explore something more of this wholly captivating city before our final evening. Marrakech is a city like no other and a walk through its bustling streets will fill the senses and fire the imagination. The city boasts a staggering array of spectacular architecture and wonderful facades, but do remember that many of the mosques will be forbidden to non-Muslims and be careful of photographing women, however photogenic they look, as the Moroccans are very sensitive about such things. If you are unsure, it is always best to ask.

Accommodation Rating

The hotel in Marrakech is located in the heart of the new town and surrounded by many restaurants and local shops with a swimming pool, terrace area and rooms that are equipped with satellite TV and air conditioning. Moving on to Ouirgane, the hotel is built in the middle of olive groves in an isolated location which adds to the relaxing atmosphere. The accommodation also has a swimming pool surrounded by pleasant gardens. Our accommodation in Ouled Berhil is a riad - this old residence is in the middle of a beautiful farm of orange trees and a multitude of flowers surrounding the swimming pool - a great place to soak up the atmosphere of this rural area and its tranquillity. The hotel in Imouzar is located outside the village and overlooks the valley with a swimming pool, gardens and a tennis court. Our hotel in the beach resort of Essaouira is a family run residence with a swimming pool and easy access to the beaches and old town.

Food & Drink

Included meals: 8 breakfasts, 0 lunches, 4 dinners included in the price of this tour. Please be prepared to pay for non-included meals. Please note that costs for drinks and meals can vary depending on location.

Budgeting for your Tour

You will need some extra money to cover meals and drinks not included in the tour price, any optional sightseeing, souvenirs and items of a personal nature such as laundry.

Local Crew: Although entirely voluntary, tipping is a recognized part of life in this region of the world. Some local staff will look to members of the group for personal recognition of particular services provided. In order to make things easier for you, the Tour Leaders may organise a group's tips kitty and if this is the case, they will account for it throughout the tour.

Accordingly, you should allow approximately 10 Pounds per person for tipping crew and local guides used.

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Foreign Exchange

Morocco

ATM Availability: ATMs are available in main towns/cities, though can be unreliable.

Credit Card Acceptance: Not all places.

Travellers Cheques: Travellers cheques are difficult to exchange and are not recommended.

Local Currency: Moroccan Dirham (MAD).

Recommended Currency for Exchange: US Dollars, Sterling and Euros are readily exchangeable. We recommend you take a mixture of cash and credit cards. Scottish bank notes and Australian dollar travellers cheques and cash are NOT normally accepted in Morocco.

Where to Exchange: Most major towns - your Tour Leader will advise you.

Joining your Tour

Flight Information

You are able to book this tour on a 'land only' basis or as a 'flight inclusive' package. Your flight inclusive package will be fully protected by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) ATOL protection scheme.

Booking a land only package with Explore

Customers who have chosen to book on the 'Land Only' arrangements of our tour, please ensure that you have checked your tour specific 'Joining Instructions' prior to booking your own travel arrangements. Joining Tour Abroad

Customers booked on the 'Land Only' arrangements will now receive a Free Transfer, provided you arrive and depart on the tour only itinerary start and end dates. The transfers will be from the Explore designated airport or train station to the joining point of your tour, and then back from the ending point to the designated airport or train station. The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of booking.

Important Information

Travel Insurance

It is a condition of joining any of our tours that you must have valid travel insurance. It must indicate that you have cover for (at least) medical expenses and emergency repatriation in the event of illness or injury. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling in England and Scotland. We also strongly recommend your policy includes curtailment, personal effects and cancellation protection as all deposits paid are non-refundable. You will also need to ensure your travel policy covers you for all activities you intend to do whilst on tour.

We are delighted to include FREE travel insurance **for all qualifying customers** who book an Explore trip from 01 January 2015.

Visa Information

Morocco: Visas are not required by UK, Australian, New Zealand, US and Canadian citizens. Other nationalities should consult their local embassy or consular office.

All visa information is subject to change. You should confirm all visa related questions with the relevant Embassy prior to departure.

Lone Parents

Morocco

Single parents or other adults travelling alone with children should be aware that some countries require documentation confirming that the individual has authority to travel with the minor. It is crucial that you contact the Morocco embassy for further information on exactly what may be required.

Vaccinations & Protection

Morocco

Nothing compulsory, but we recommend protection against tetanus, typhoid, infectious hepatitis and polio. Consult your travel clinic for latest advice on different prophylaxis available against malaria.

Preparing for your Tour

Climate

Morocco

The climate is both Mediterranean and Atlantic. The dry, hot season is from May to October when summer temperatures can reach 38°C and above (if sight seeing is included we will do our best to avoid the heat of the day during this period). Temperatures may drop significantly at times during the night as the day's heat rapidly diminishes. From December to January snow can be expected on mountain passes and it can be wet. In winter, day temperatures will probably be around 18-25°C, dropping to perhaps 0-5°C.

Clothing

Summer (Apr-Oct) clothing should be lightweight, however, a warm fleece/sweater and waterproofs are also advisable, as the mountains can sometimes be cold at night, even in the summer.

Morocco is a Muslim country and it is important to dress with respect for local customs. People may be offended by shorts or revealing dresses, which can attract unwelcome attention. We advise that in general both men and women should cover shoulders, upper arms and knees. Transparent, 'plunging' necklines and tightfitting clothes should be avoided. Women and older girls should also cover their heads when entering a sanctuary, though in general, mosques are forbidden to non-Muslims. For those clients on a cycling holiday please bear this information in mind for times that you are not on the bikes. While cycling it is no problem for both men and women to wear your regular cycling gear, tight fitting or not.

Equipment

We recommend a sunhat, high factor sunscreen, a torch, insect repellent and a water bottle.

Footwear

Lightweight trail boots or robust trainers with good traction soles and sandals.

Luggage: On Tour

One main piece of baggage and daypack. Remember you are expected to carry your own luggage so don't overload yourself.

Booking Your Holiday

Peace of mind - book with confidence

You can book your Explore holiday with confidence, as all monies paid to us for your trip are fully protected. Explore is a fully bonded tour operator licensed by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) and by ABTOT.

The air holiday packages (Tours including flights) that we advertise are ATOL protected, since we hold an Air Travel Organiser's Licence granted by the Civil Aviation Authority. Our ATOL number is ATOL 2595. In addition, As a member of the Association of Bonded Travel Organisers Trust Limited (ABTOT), Explore has provided a bond to meet the requirements of the Package Travel, Package Holidays and Package Tours Regulations 1992. Please note that packages booked outside the UK are only protected when purchased directly with Explore.

Reserving your place

To reserve your place on this tour you will need to check availability on the Explore website or through our dedicated call centre based in the UK where you can. Our tours can fill up quickly so you are advised to book as early as possible. If your chosen date is 'Available' or 'Guaranteed' we will be able to provisionally hold you a space for up to 48 hours.

For Self-Guided holidays and Private Journeys simply choose your date of travel and let us know so we can confirm all ground services.

The easiest way to confirm your booking is through our website. When you are ready to book, we normally require a 10% non-refundable deposit, but for some holidays this may be more to cover such items as permit fees, internal flights or other non-refundable services. If your travel starts within 60 days of booking, full payment will be required at the time of booking
