
While our intention is to adhere to the day-by-day itinerary as printed below, a degree of flexibility is built in. Overnight stops may vary from those suggested.

Arrive into the Ethiopian capital where you will be greeted by our representative and transferred to your hotel. Depending on your arrival time you may take a guided tour of Addis, for your first glimpse of the lifestyles and cultures of this modern African city, visit the National Museum, home to Lucy, a three and a half million year old fossilised skeleton, also visit chaotic Merkato, the largest open-air market in Africa where you can buy anything from electronics to clothes, industrial goods to tea.

## Journey to Jinka

A morning flight transports you to Arba Minch on the shores of Lake Chamo. Transfer by road to Jinka, set in the hills above the Mago and Omo National Parks. Relax and enjoy the arid beauty of your surroundings this afternoon. Please note - flight times frequently change in Ethiopia, if the flight departs in the afternoon it may be necessary to overnight in Arba Minch and fly the following morning to ensure there is enough time to transfer to Lake Chamo. Your Tailormade Regional Specialist will discuss flight times with you.

# Indigenous tribes

Not for the faint-hearted, your time spent in Ethiopia's most remote national park will provide a lifetime of memories with a visit to the most famous of Ethiopia's indigenous tribes - the Mursi. This will provide a fascinating insight into this tribe, who insert large circular clay discs into the lower lips of their women. In the afternoon you head back to Jinka and to the Ari village. The Ari people are known for their colourfully painted houses, blacksmithing and pottery.

# Journey by road to Turmi

A long drive through a typical dry landscape brings you to the distant town of Turmi, where the colourful Hamer tribe exhibit beaded decorations, ocre-coloured braided hair and painted white faces. In the afternoon, visit Omo Rate, where you'll take a boat trip across to meet the Dasenech people, known for their body painting, scarification and wigs made from bottle tops. The day ends at the town of Turmi on the banks of the Keske River.

# Local tribes

Today you head to Murulle to discover the fascinating and often extreme cultures and traditions of the Karo people. Their most elaborate expression is the white chalk, black charcoal, yellow, ochre and red earth face and chest paintings, often imitating the spotted plumage of a guinea fowl. The Karo women also use scarification to beautify themselves, while the men use it as a symbol that he has killed an enemy or dangerous animal. You also have time to visit a traditional settlement called Dus, before heading back to Turmi for some free time. Depending on the day of the week you may like to visit the colorful market of the Hamer and Benna tribes.

# Drive to Arba Minch via Konso

From Turmi you journey back to Arba Minch via Konso, an area of terraced farms and peaceful village landscapes. In the afternoon, enjoy a scenic boat trip on Lake Chamo to see hippos and crocodiles, known locally as "Crocodile Market", the birdlife is also great here - look out for African fish eagles, great white pelicans and egrets, among others.

# Langano Beach Resort

Drive to Langano, heading via Chench village, home of the Dorze people, known for their beehive shaped houses and excellent weaving. After lunch, continue to Lake Langano to relax on the beach.

Departing from Lake Langano, you'll explore the Rift Valley Lakes of Ziway, Abyata, Shalla and Bishoftu before hitting the road back to Addis Ababa. Upon arrival, enjoy a city tour to see Trinity Cathedral and Mount Entoto. In the evening, enjoy a traditional meal and folklore dance.

Recommended Currency for Exchange: It is advisable to take your spending money in Sterling, Euros or US Dollars cash (high denomination notes usually get better exchange ates). Please note that any pre- 1999 or torn US Dollar bills will not accepted in Ethiopia. Please keep any receipts as you may be able to change back any unused local currency.

# **Joining your Tour**

### **Flight Information**

You are able to book this tour on a 'land only' basis or as a 'flight inclusive' package. Your flight inclusive package will be fully protected by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) ATOL protection scheme.

#### Booking a land only package with Explore

For passengers making their own travel arrangements, please ensure you join the group as described on day one of the tour itinerary. If you are considering purchasing your own airline tickets, you can book these through any travel agent, directly with an airline or through an online flight consolidator. In all cases, we would be happy to arrange transfers to and from the joining point of your tour if required.

### **Booking a flight inclusive package with Explore**

On our website we display a UK flight inclusive package guide price which is generally based on a London departure. To avoid paying supplements or to secure your preferred flight option, we recommend booking as early as possible, especially for peak travel dates.

# **Important Information**

### **Travel Insurance**

It is a condition of joining any of our tours that you must have valid travel insurance. It must indicate that you have cover for (at least) medical expenses and emergency repatriation in the event of illness or injury. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling in England and Scotland. We also strongly recommend your policy includes curtailment, personal effects and cancellation protection as all deposits paid are non-refundable. You will also need to ensure your travel policy covers you for all activities you intend to do whilst on tour. Your insurer may charge an additional premium for certain activities.

If you require travel insurance for your tour, Explore Worldwide is an appointed representative of Campbell Irvine Limited, who is authorised and regulated by the Financial Conduct Authority. Our travel insurance policy is specially tailored to the needs of the adventure traveller and will cover you for any included activity on any Explore trip. You can either purchase this at the time of booking or call us on 0844 499 0903 after you have booked.

#### **Vaccinations & Protection**

#### **Ethiopia**

An International Certificate of Vaccination against yellow fever is required. We recommend protection against malaria, hepatitis A, diphtheria, tetanus, typhoid and polio. Although the risk is low you may also consider immunisation against rabies and meningococcal meningitis. Consult your travel clinic for latest advice on different prophylaxis available against Malaria. The above is not an exhaustive list. # **Preparing for your Tour**

### **Climate**

#### **Ethiopia**

Ethiopia is generally pleasant and warm, but varies with altitude. The long rains usually arrive mid- June to early September and the short rains between mid-February and April although this pattern has been completely erratic in recent times. After the rains, the highlands of northern Ethiopia are usually green and thus particularly scenic. The temperature all year round rarely falls below 18°C. Night-time temperatures in the mountains can be cold and can drop below freezing at higher altitude. There is a strong risk of sunburn at high altitude in Ethiopia. Luggage allowance on tour:

Unfortunately it does occasionally happen that luggage does not always reach its destination on the same flight as its owner, or possibly it may be damaged in transit. If you are unlucky enough for this to occur, it is important that you file a PIR (Property Irregularity Report) with the airline before leaving the airport. This is essential when you come to make a claim either against the airline or from your travel insurance company

The air holiday packages (Tours including flights) that we advertise are ATOL protected, since we hold an Air Travel Organiser's Licence granted by the Civil Aviation Authority. Our ATOL number is ATOL 2595. In addition, As a member of the Association of Bonded Travel Organisers Trust Limited (ABTOT), Explore has provided a bond to meet the requirements of the Package Travel, Package Holidays and Package Tours Regulations 1992. Please note that packages booked outside the UK are only protected when purchased directly with Explore.

## Reserving your place

To reserve your place on this tour you will need to check availability on the Explore website or through our dedicated call centre based in the UK where you can. Our tours can fill up quickly so you are advised to book as early as possible. If your chosen date is 'Available' or 'Guaranteed' we will be able to provisionally hold you a space for up to 48 hours.

The easiest way to confirm your booking is through our website. When you are ready to book, we normally require a 10% nonrefundable deposit, but for some holidays this may be more to cover such items as permit fees, internal flights or other non-refundable services. If your travel starts within 60 days of booking, full payment will be required at the time of booking
