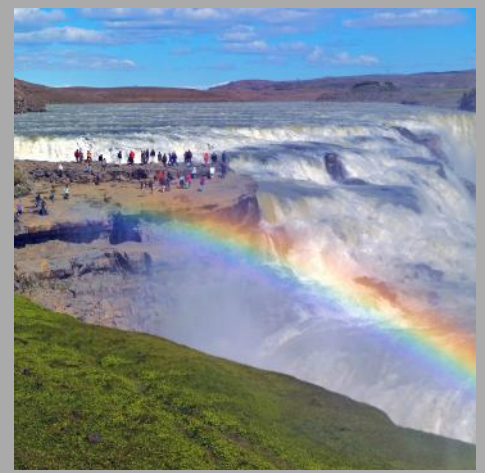
These are often small, family run establishments or campsites which provide a no-frills experience with adequate amenities and service standards. Sleeping arrangements are simple, typically with en suite facilities.

Tour itinerary notes

While our intention is to adhere to the day-by-day itinerary as printed below, a degree of flexibility is built in. Overnight stops may vary from those suggested.

Your Tour Leader

This tour will not be accompanied by an Explore Tour Leader. Instead you will be accompanied by an Explore Representative. The representative will not be with you for every section of the tour and will not stay at the accommodation at night or eat out with the group in the evenings. However they will be available for you and your group during the included activities and will help if any problems occur.

DAY 1 Join tour at Keflavik airport and visit the Blue Lagoon

Make sure your swimsuit is packed accessibly as, after arriving at Keflavik airport, we head 20 minutes down the road to the famous Blue Lagoon for a recuperative dip. Accidentally formed in the 1970s by a nearby geothermal power plant, the steaming turquoise waters now attract people from around the world. Its minerals, silica and algae are renowned for their health-giving properties and the 40 degree water temperature ensures its appeal on even the coldest of days. Towels can be hired for a fee, or alternatively, feel free to bring your own. In our relaxed state, we travel the short distance to Reykjavik to check-in to our hotel. Our evening is free to enjoy the diverse dining and, maybe even the world-famous nightlife, of this vibrant city. Please note: On some departures, the Blue Lagoon will be visited on day 4 instead of day 1.

DAY 2 Golden Circle tour of Geysir, Gullfoss and Thingvellir

Today we take a tour of Iceland's 'Golden Circle' which includes many of the natural wonders which make the country so famous. Thingvellir is a rare site of both historical and geological importance. Meaning 'Parliament Plains', this was the location of Iceland's first National Assembly from 930AD until 1798 and, as such, is hugely significant in the country's cultural heritage. What's more, the impressive landscape sits on a unique spot where the Mid-Atlantic Ridge can be seen on dry land before disappearing to the ocean floor where it spends most of its existence. This provides the quirky opportunity to place one foot on the North American tectonic plate and one foot on the Eurasian plate. Our next stop is Geysir with the claim to fame that, as the first spouting spring known to Europeans, it gave all such springs their name. However, it is the Strokkur, meaning 'The Butter Churn', which is the main attraction of this area these days, due to its impressive 100 feet eruptions every few minutes. The final visit of the day is to Gullfoss, known as the 'Golden Waterfall' due the way it cascades into a deep gorge with tremendous force. Regarded by many as one of the most beautiful falls in the world, its spray forms colourful rainbows in the sun.

DAY 3 Free day with the chance to ride in a super jeep

Today has been left free for you to take part in one of a number of different optional tours, depending on your interests and the time of year you are travelling. Throughout the year there's the opportunity to jump aboard a super-jeep and enjoy an exhilarating drive into the wild Thorsmork Valley - widely viewed as one of Iceland's most beautiful spots. These 10 feet high monsters can cross glacial moraine, lava flows and fast-flowing rivers with relative ease. In fact, you won't believe what the drivers can make them do, but fear not - they do this for a living! Another option in winter is to take a super-jeep to another glacier in the mountains and try your hand at a bit of snowmobiling. You may also like to consider a whale watching trip. The nutrient-rich waters around Iceland attract 23 types from May to September, including humpback, minke and blue whales. In winter it's more common to see white-beaked dolphins, porpoises and humpback and killer whales, but the weather can be unpredictable, so it is a more adventurous experience. Trips depart from Reykjavik harbour. In the summer months (May to August), another option is a puffin tour to see these colourful birds close up. Trips depart from Reykjavik harbour. For those keen to stay on dry land, a horse riding tour is also available. Alternatively, after all the action of the previous two days, you may prefer to step down a gear and enjoy the art galleries, museums and cafe culture of Reykjavik.

Due to the recent considerable rise in tourism in Iceland, hotels are experiencing very high demand for rooms. For this reason we would like to emphasise that hotel accommodation is subject to change, and we may need to change your night stops with little or no notice. In the case of unavoidable hotel changes we will endeavour to always provide accommodation of the same or a higher standard.

Food & Drink

Other Sightseeing & Activities

Optional Excursions

Reykjavik - Year-round:

Super-jeep tour to Thorsmork 32,400 ISK (minimum four participants required)

Pearl Tour with Snowmobile - 34,200 ISK (minimum four participants required, subject to availability and snow cover). Two people per snowmobile (if you wish to drive you must bring a valid driving licence). If you want to have a snowmobile to yourself and not share then there will be an extra cost of 5,000 ISK per person. This tour can usually be operated year-round because the snowmobiling takes place on a glacier, but it is dependent on conditions on the glacier and therefore may not always be available.

Whale watching from Reykjavik harbour 8,500 ISK without thier pick-up service or an extra 1,000 ISK for this.

Horse riding tour for one hour 7,900 ISK, two hour tour 10,200 ISK

Summer only:

Puffin tour from Reykjavik harbour 4,000 ISK

Winter only:

Northern Lights - Tour with Reykjavik excursion 5,400 ISK (please note that this is weather permitting and it is not guaranteed that you will see the Northern Lights). From mid November to mid January it may be dark early enough to see the Northern Lights on your return journey on the super-jeep tour. If not then it will be necessary to go on this excursion if you would like the opportunity to try and view them.

Tipping - Local Crew

Local Representative - Tipping is not a recognised part of life in Iceland for meals etc. though if you do wish to tip your local representative (entirely at your discretion) it will no doubt be appreciated.

Joining your Tour

Flight Information

Joining Tour Abroad

Customers booked on the 'Land Only' arrangements will now receive a Free Transfer, provided you arrive and depart on the tour only itinerary start and end dates. The transfers will be from the Explore designated airport or train station to the joining point of your tour, and then back from the ending point to the designated airport or train station. The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of booking.

Important Information

Travel Insurance

It is a condition of joining any of our tours that you must have valid travel insurance. It must indicate that you have cover for (at least) medical expenses and emergency repatriation in the event of illness or injury. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling in England and Scotland. We also strongly recommend your policy includes curtailment, personal effects and cancellation protection as all deposits paid are non-refundable. You will also need to ensure your travel policy covers you for all activities you intend to do whilst on tour.

We are delighted to include FREE travel insurance **for all qualifying customers** who book an Explore trip from 01 January 2015.

Preparing for your Tour

Climate

Iceland

Iceland has a cool and temperate climate and, despite its location just south of the Arctic Circle, its northerly latitude is counteracted by the warm waters of the North Atlantic Drift which encircles the island. Temperatures in winter can fluctuate between about 10°C and -10°C and precipitation in the form of rain, sleet or snow is to be expected at any time. Days will be short, with daylight often only guaranteed between about 11 am and 4 pm in December. The best time for seeing the Aurora Borealis is October to March. Summer is generally cool with average temperatures for June and July around 12 - 15 degree centigrade in Reykjavik, although is known to be warmer in other parts of the country. In June and July you can enjoy continuous daylight and see the Midnight Sun, whilst late spring and early autumn offer long twilights.

Clothing

Weather conditions can change rapidly - sunshine, drizzle, rain and snow may all occur in the same day. You'll need lots of warm clothing; best to have layers that you can add or remove according to your body temperature and level of activity. Year round a wind and waterproof jacket and trousers are essential. We also recommend that you bring your swimsuit and a towel with you for use at the Blue Lagoon.

You can book your Explore holiday with confidence, as all monies paid to us for your trip are fully protected. Explore is a fully bonded tour operator licensed by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) and by ABTOT.

The air holiday packages (Tours including flights) that we advertise are ATOL protected, since we hold an Air Travel Organiser's Licence granted by the Civil Aviation Authority. Our ATOL number is ATOL 2595. In addition, As a member of the Association of Bonded Travel Organisers Trust Limited (ABTOT), Explore has provided a bond to meet the requirements of the Package Travel, Package Holidays and Package Tours Regulations 1992. Please note that packages booked outside the UK are only protected when purchased directly with Explore.

Reserving your place

To reserve your place on this tour you will need to check availability on the Explore website or through our dedicated call centre based in the UK where you can. Our tours can fill up quickly so you are advised to book as early as possible. If your chosen date is 'Available' or 'Guaranteed' we will be able to provisionally hold you a space for up to 48 hours.

For Self-Guided holidays and Private Journeys simply choose your date of travel and let us know so we can confirm all ground services.

The easiest way to confirm your booking is through our website. When you are ready to book, we normally require a 10% non-refundable deposit, but for some holidays this may be more to cover such items as permit fees, internal flights or other non-refundable services. If your travel starts within 60 days of booking, full payment will be required at the time of booking
