## South Korea Explorer

From the cosmopolitan city of Seoul to the ancient Silla capital of Gyeongju, we explore all that South Korea has to offer. We visit one of the last frontiers of the Cold War, the Demilitarised Zone, to see the barrier separating North and South Korea. We also take part in traditional tea ceremonies and witness early morning temple rituals. Finally we spend time relaxing on Jeju - the Island of the Gods.

### Suitability

We've given each of our tours a comfort rating and a tour pace, walking or cycling grade to give you a general idea about the level of activity on each tour and the standard of accommodation you will be staying in at the end of your day's adventure.

Often you'll stay in different styles of accommodation during your tour; so we make an average rating across the entire tour. For more information on where you'll stay each night, please refer to the day by day tour itinerary.

### DAY 1 Join tour Seoul

We begin this exciting adventure in Seoul, South Korea's dynamic capital and one of the world's fastest growing cities. The economic, political and cultural centre of the country, Seoul is a fascinating mix of glass towers, historic temples, parks and museums, spanning the banks of the Han River. Arriving today we have a free evening to relax and settle into the flow of one of Asia's most exciting cities.

## DAY 2 Morning orientation tour of Seoul. Afternoon free

This morning we take an orientation tour around the centre of Seoul, walking through the Myeongdong shopping district and down to the market at Namdaemun, before heading past the City Hall to the Gyeongbokgung Palace. The largest of five great palaces built by the Joseon Dynasty, Gyeongbokgung still remains the grandest and we pay a visit before moving on to the National Folk Museum. Later we walk down into the area of Insadong, famed for its antiques and handicrafts. We stop for lunch here, after which the rest of the day is free to enjoy as we wish.

## DAY 3 Visit the Demilitarised Zone

Today we visit one of the last frontiers of the Cold War - the Demilitarised Zone (DMZ) that separates North and South Korea - an area where over a million soldiers remain on high alert on either side. Formally the Korean war technically has never ended - and this geo-political fault line is still raw for the people of Korea. We are escorted by the Military right into the DMZ and stand right at the very edge - both sides literally staring at each other just metres apart. Whilst in the Joint Security Area (JSA) you must be respectfully dressed, no jeans or sandals are allowed nor can you make any arm or hand gestures as visitors are closely monitored (and photographed) by the North Koreans for propaganda purposes. Our next stop is underground to explore a tunnel built by the North into South Korea with the aim to breach the border. This was found by accident - the tunnel is wide enough for 2000 troops an hour to pass through and is just 1 of 4 that were subsequently discovered. Military clearance is obtained for all visitors and you will be in a larger group, please be aware that due to the nature of the area visited this excursion may be cancelled at short notice (although highly unlikely) depending on the security situation.

## DAY 4 Mount Seorak National Park

After breakfast we drive to Mount Seorak National Park on the eastern edge of the Korean Peninsula. Set amongst the granite landscapes of the Taebaek Mountain range, Mount Seorak is the third highest peak in the country and on arrival we have the chance to enjoy some activities around the park. There are a number of walking trails that lead to temples and waterfalls and you can also take a cable car to the mountain's summit.

## DAY 5 Drive to Samwhasa Temple via the Osaek Mineral Springs

A different experience today as we make our way to the Samwhasa Temple where we spend the night. Our journey takes us via the Osaek Mineral Springs in Osaekjigu, where we stop for lunch before continuing on to Samwhasa. This afternoon we have an opportunity to partake in a traditional tea ceremony and learn a little more about temple life. Please note that the sleeping arrangements at the monastery will be up to four people per room.

## DAY 6 Drive to Suaedang via the Buseoksa Temple

For early risers there is a chance to watch the monks perform their morning rituals before we leave our temple home and head for one of Korea's most beautiful temples. Hidden amongst the wooded slopes of Bonghwangsan, Buseoksa Temple dates back to the latter years of the 7th century and differs from many other temples in Korea because of its huge size. From here we continue to Suaedang via the stone Buddha at Jebiwon, an impressive 11th century carving that sits on top of a rocky outcrop overlooking the Sobaek Mountains. Arriving at our homestay later this afternoon we enjoy a tea ceremony, some local games and dinner. Please note that the sleeping arrangements at the homestay will be up to four people per room.

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## DAY 7 Visit the Hahoe Folk Village and Mask Museum. Train to Gyeongju

After a relaxing morning we check out and drive on to the Buyeongdae Viewpoint. From here we then continue to the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Hahoe, where we find the Hahoe Folk Village and its fascinating Mask Museum. We visit the site with a local guide, spending time wandering through the traditional houses of this early Joseon Dynasty village and exploring the museum. We then continue on our journey to the city of Andong, from where we board a train and head south on to Gyeongju.

## DAY 8 In Gyeongju

We enjoy a full day tour of South Korea's second largest city today. Once the capital of the ancient kingdom of Silla, Gyeongju ruled over much of the Korean Peninsula between the 7th and 9th centuries. Our first visits this morning are to the UNESCO World Heritage Sites of Seokguram Grotto and the Bulguksa Temple. We also visit the Silla Kiln and the city's National Museum, a rich repository for the relics and artifacts of the Silla kingdom, one of the longest dynasties in Asian history.

## DAY 9 Morning free for optionals. Drive to Busan, flight to Jeju.

This morning we have a few options available to make the most of some free time before we leave. One is a hike on Mount Namsan with our local guide. Other possibilities include a boat trip on the lake (seasonal), exploring the surrounding countryside or a final look around Gyeongju. After lunch we then pay a visit to the Tongdosa Temple en route to Busan, South Korea's largest port. After a chance to have a look around Busan's fish market, we fly to Jeju-do, lying off the southern tip of the peninsula in the Korea Strait.

## DAY 10 Sightseeing around Jeju island

This morning we begin our exploration of Jeju. Korea's largest island, this volcanic outcrop is home to three UNESCO World Heritage Sites and a distinctive culture that has developed in isolation to that of the Korean mainland. We explore the island, visiting the Seongeup Folk Village and the Manjanggul lava tubes, before heading along the coastal road to Ilchubong Peak. From here we drive back to the hotel to relax and enjoy some free time.

## DAY 11 Free on Jeju-do

We have a free day to make the most of this unique island. You could visit the Cheonjeyeon and Cheonjiyeon Waterfalls, explore some of the Jeju Olle (hiking trails) that crisscross the island, or perhaps take a ride out to the Sangumburi Crater. As well as its natural attractions and World Heritage Sites, the island's culture sets Jeju-do apart from the mainland. It is blessed with a number of museums dedicated to the myths, legends and folklore of the island, providing us with a fascinating insight into the culture, beliefs and traditions of the local people.

## Joining your Trip

The transfers will be from the Explore designated airport or train station to the joining point of your tour, and then back from the ending point to the designated airport or train station. The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

Free transfers are not available for Self-Guided, Tailormade or Tours for Churches customers.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of booking.

### Travel Insurance

It is a condition of booking with Explore that you have adequate valid travel insurance. It is your responsibility to arrange appropriate travel insurance and ensure you have read and understood the full terms and conditions of your travel insurance policy to ensure that you are covered for all activities you intend to undertake whilst on the tour, including all optional activities. Your Insurance Policy must fully cover you for medical expenses and emergency repatriation to your home country. Please ensure your policy includes medical emergency helicopter evacuation in the event of illness or injury and covers the entire duration of your holiday. If you are trekking at altitude please ensure that there is no upper altitude limit which may limit or exclude cover for your trip. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling on trips within the United Kingdom.

## Visa Information

South Korea: Visas are not required by UK, Australian, New Zealand, US and Canadian citizens for a stay of less than 90 days. Other nationalities should consult their local embassy or consular office.

If you do require assistance in obtaining a visa then you may consider applying through Explore's recommended visa service in the UK, Travcour. ## Vaccinations & Protection

### South Korea

Nothing compulsory, but we recommend protection against malaria, infectious hepatitis, typhoid, tetanus and polio. Consult your travel clinic for latest advice on different prophylaxis available against malaria. Travellers may wish to take immunisation against Japanese Encephalitis. The above is not an exhaustive list. ## Preparing for your Trip

### Climate

#### South Korea

South Korea has four distinct seasons: long, cold winters; short summers which tend to be hot and humid; autumn and spring offer pleasant weather but tend to pass quickly. Jeju Island tends to have a warmer climate due to its southern location, temperatures usually reach up to 25 degrees during the summer months. ### Clothing

Lightweight raingear is required all year round. For winter departures warm sweaters, gloves, scarf, hat, warm coat, thermal underwear will be required.

To reserve your place on this tour you will need to check availability on the Explore website or through our dedicated call centre based in the UK where you can. Our tours can fill up quickly so you are advised to book as early as possible. If your chosen date is 'Available' or 'Guaranteed' we will be able to provisionally hold you a space for up to 48 hours.

For Self-Guided holidays and Private Journeys simply choose your date of travel and let us know so we can confirm all ground services.
