Snow-shoeing in the Picos de Europa

This snowshoeing adventure takes us through the dramatically beautiful snow-capped mountains of Picos de Europa National Park. We experience a variety of mountain scenery on snowshoe routes in the Eastern, Western and Central Massifs. As a fitting finale we leave the snow behind and trek along cliff-cut pathways through the imposing Cares Gorge. Snow shoes are easy to use and require no previous experience.

Suitability

We've given each of our tours a comfort rating and a tour pace, walking or cycling grade to give you a general idea about the level of activity on each tour and the standard of accommodation you will be staying in at the end of your day's adventure.

Often you'll stay in different styles of accommodation during your tour; so we make an average rating across the entire tour. For more information on where you'll stay each night, please refer to the day by day tour itinerary.

DAY 1 Join tour Asturias Airport. Drive to Benia de Onis

Meeting at Asturias airport we then drive by minibus to the small village of Benia de Onis for our first night. This evening there is an opportunity for us to enjoy a relaxing spa (not included).

DAY 2 Snow shoe from Lago Covadonga to Vegarredonda Refuge; Drive to Sotres

Departing Benia de Onis this morning we drive to Covadonga, the site of the first significant victory by the Christians over the occupying Moors in the 8th century. We pay a visit to the town's Catholic Basilica, before then driving on to the Lagos Covadonga. Lying in the western massif of the Picos de Europa National Park or 'El Cornion', these glacial lakes provide us with a beautiful backdrop for today's hike up to the Vegarredonda Refuge (1,460 metres). Following our walk we then drive on to Sotres, at 1,045 metres the highest village in the Picos National Park. Walking time: four hours. Distance: 10 kilometres.

DAY 3 Snow shoe up to the Refugio Andara (1,700 metres)

The Picos de Europa National Park boast the highest, and arguably, the most spectacular mountain landscapes in the whole of Spain. This morning we explore the eastern massif or Andara Range on a walk from Sotres to Collada de Antesoles and up to Refugio Andara (1,700 metres). From the high-point of our climb we then descend to Jito de Escarandi (1,291 metres), from where we return to Sotres by bus. Walking time: five hours. Distance: 8 kilometres.

DAY 4 Explore the Teju and Nevandi Valleys

Today we walk from Sotres to Espinama, lying at the southern edge of the Picos, through valley systems that bisect the central and eastern massifs. We begin the day walking up the Teju Valley, before following part of the course of the Nevandi River down to the village of Espinama, where we spend the night. The trail today takes us from a little over 1,000 metres and up a 500 metres incline, offering us some great views across the Picos before we descend back into the valley. Our luggage for an overnight stay will be transported on to Espinama by car. Walking time: five hours. Distance: 18 kilometres.

DAY 5 Ride the Fuente De cable car. Snow shoe back to Sotres via the Aliva Valley

After breakfast this morning we drive the short distance to Fuente De, where we take the cable car up the start of today's walk. The 900 metres ride to the upper station is said to be the longest unsupported cable ride in the world, lifting us out the giant rock amphitheatre that is Fuente De, to reach the alpine meadows that sit perched some 1,834 metres above the valley below. From here we can see out across the beautiful Liebana Valley and, as we trek through the open spaces of the Aliva Valley we enter a world that is home to chamois, eagles and even wolves. Walking time: five hours. Distance: 18 kilometres.

DAY 6 Snow shoe to Pandebano, Bulnes and Poncebos via the Texu Gorge

Starting from Sotres we walk this morning to the small village of Pandebano (1,212 metres), the site of another clash between the Christian armies and the Moors in 718 AD. From here we then head down to Bulnes, where we stop for lunch. Until the 2001 underground funicular was built, Bulnes was an isolated and picturesque high mountain village that was only accessible by foot. This afternoon sees us heading into the dramatic landscapes of the Texu Gorge and on to Puente Poncebos (218 metres), where we rendezvous with our transport for the short drive back to Sotres. Walking time: five hours. Distance: 12 kilometres.

DAY 7 Walk the Garganta del Cares Gorge

This morning we drive back down to Puente Poncebos, to where its medieval bridge spans the Cares River. This marks the starting point for our walk through the stunning Garganta del Cares, a dramatic gorge that drops over 1,000 metres and stretches for some 12 kilometres. Today's walk is a low altitude hike, so will not require us to use snow shoes. It is however considered one of the highlights of any visit to northern Spain and our path takes us along a traverse that has literally been blasted out of the canyon walls. Walking time: six to seven hours. Distance: 24 kilometres.

Accommodation and Meals

Accommodation Rating

Situated in the heart of the region's highest village of Sotres, Casa Cipriano is a small family-run hotel perfectly located as a base for exploring the spectacular and little known Picos de Europa mountain range in the heart of northern Spain's Asturias region. A walk through the village leads to a viewpoint of the surrounding peaks.

The hotel features a bar as well as a restaurant serving home cooked food - not to be missed is the traditional and very delicious La Fabada Asturiana, a hearty soup made with beans, chorizo and black pudding. In winter an open log fire makes for a comfy nook in the bar, whilst in summer the terrace outside is a popular spot for guests and locals alike. Next door the family also runs a small shop, selling everything from small locally made souvenirs to cheeses and cured hams.

Rooms are simple yet cosy and feature tiled floors, wooden furniture and an en suite bathroom with a shower over a small bath tub. Central heating during the winter ensures a comfortable stay. There is a TV and hairdryer in all rooms.

Food & Drink

Included meals: 7 breakfasts, 6 lunches, 6 dinners included in the price of this tour. Please be prepared to pay for non-included meals. Please note that costs for drinks and meals can vary depending on location.

Budgeting for your Tour

You will need some extra money to cover meals and drinks not included in the tour price, any optional sightseeing, souvenirs and items of a personal nature such as laundry.

The costs for meals may vary depending upon location, type of restaurant and number of courses eaten and so the prices given are an average guide. Credit Card Acceptance: Visa and Mastercard are generally accepted in larger restaurants and some shops.

Travellers Cheques: Not recommended.

Recommended Currency for Exchange: We recommend you take the majority of your spending money in Euros cash.

Where to Exchange: We recommend that you change any currency into Euros prior to arrival. Bureau de Change are generally only found in major cities and large airports.

Joining your Tour

Flight Information

You are able to book this tour on a 'land only' basis or as a 'flight inclusive' package. Your flight inclusive package will be fully protected by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) ATOL protection scheme.

Booking a land only package with Explore

Joining Tour Abroad

Customers booked on the 'Land Only' arrangements will now receive a Free Transfer, provided you arrive and depart on the tour only itinerary start and end dates. The transfers will be from the Explore designated airport or train station to the joining point of your tour, and then back from the ending point to the designated airport or train station. The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of booking.

Important Information

Travel Insurance

It is a condition of joining any of our tours that you must have valid travel insurance. It must indicate that you have cover for (at least) medical expenses and emergency repatriation in the event of illness or injury. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling in England and Scotland. We also strongly recommend your policy includes curtailment, personal effects and cancellation protection as all deposits paid are non-refundable. You will also need to ensure your travel policy covers you for all activities you intend to do whilst on tour.

Vaccinations & Protection

Spain

Nothing compulsory but Tetanus is usually recommended as a precaution. Vaccination requirements are subject to change and should be confirmed before departure.

Preparing for your Tour

Trekking Details

This is a 6-day trek with an average of 4 to 6 hours snowshoeing each day. The final walk is without snow shoes. We have graded this trek as moderate. Snowshoeing is suitable for beginners, snow shoes and walking sticks are provided. We recommend you bring gaiters.

Climate

Spain

Overall, spring, early summer and autumn are ideal times for a Spanish trip - though the weather varies enormously from region to region. The high central plains suffer from fierce extremes, stiflingly hot in summer, bitterly cold and swept by freezing winds in winter. The Atlantic coast, in contrast, has a tendency to damp and mist, and a relatively brief, humid summer. The Mediterranean south is warm virtually all year round.

Equipment

Small Rucksack/Daypack with straps (SPC only): In any mountain region the weather can change rapidly and you must be equipped for this eventuality. The straps will be useful if you have to remove and carry your snow shoes (SPC only). Your daypack should carry the essentials and therefore, be large enough to carry the following: waterproofs, sweater, long trousers (if walking in shorts), warm hat and gloves, sun hat, sun cream, water bottle (at least 1litre), tissues and your packed lunch. Most people normally find that this adds up to about 3 to 4kg. Camera equipment can be heavy so think carefully when deciding what to take.

Other optional items in a daypack might be binoculars, a diary or a book to read at lunch time. Please note that cooked meals and bottled drinks are available in the refuges, so it is not necessary to carry food and drink for your stay.

Luggage: On Tour

One main piece of baggage and daypack. We recommend a daypack with external straps to be able to attach and carry snowshoes when not wearing them. Remember you are expected to carry your own luggage so don't overload yourself.

Luggage allowance on tour: 20kg

Our tours can fill up quickly so you are advised to book as early as possible. If your chosen date is 'Available' or 'Guaranteed' we will be able to provisionally hold you a space for up to 48 hours.
