Nile Felucca Sailtrek

On this Egyptian adventure we explore the Nile aboard traditional 'felucca' sailing boats. We enjoy local food as we sail down the river and sleep under the stars on the deck. We also visit ancient Egypt's most famous sites including the Great Pyramid of Giza, the mysterious Sphinx, Karnak Temple and the Valley of the Kings.


While our intention is to adhere to the day-by-day itinerary as printed below, a degree of flexibility is built in. Overnight stops may vary from those suggested.


Join tour Cairo

Arrive Cairo and check-in at the hotel. Cairo is a vibrant, exhilarating, fascinating and welcoming city. Home to the best Pharaonic, Coptic and Islamic sites in Egypt, this city is where you never know what incredible, half-forgotten monument you might stumble across while wandering around. If you arrive early you may wish to catch your first glimpse of the mighty Nile River, visit the capital's medieval markets at Khan El-Khalili or walk down the Nile promenade. There are also plenty of cinemas, theatres and modern shopping malls.

m I In Cairo; visit the Pyramids, Sphinx and Egyptian Museum; fly to Aswan

Cairo is Africa's largest capital city and is known as the city of a thousand minarets. Driving to Giza we see the Pyramids and Sphinx, which are among the most impressive man-made spectacles in the world. The Great Pyramid of Cheops is the largest of the group (originally 145m high with a square base 232m). Second is the Pyramid of Chephren (136m high and 210m wide). The complex includes the Sphinx, a crouching lion with a human head carved from solid rock and the splendid Granite Temple. We also visit the Egyptian Museum, which contains the treasures of Tutankhamun. This evening we fly to Aswan and transfer to our accommodation. We will normally be staying in a guesthouse within a Nubian village on the west bank of the Nile, opposite of the main city of Aswan. There will be scheduled motorboat transfers across the river to the city during your free time. Please note that due to flight availability it may be necessary for you to spend the night of day 2 in Cairo (instead of Aswan) and to then fly to Aswan early in the morning of day 3.

Today is free in Aswan. Aswan is traditionally regarded as the frontier town of Upper Egypt; it stands just below the first Cataract and is the meeting point of Arab culture with Nubia and black Africa. Aswan's bazaar area is filled with craftwork with a strong Sudanese style. You may want to take an excursion to the Aswan High Dam (built in 1971), the granite quarries from where the pharaohs cut many of their huge obelisks and statues and visit the Philae Temple, situated on an island in the Nile.

Our time in Aswan is free and there are a number of places worth seeing (all of which are optional to give as much flexibility to your time here as possible). Your tour leader can organise an excursion by road (or air) to the temples of Abu Simbel. Cut into the rock face, these huge structures were raised 61m to save them from inundation by the artificial lake created when the Aswan High Dam was constructed. The 29m high statues found here represent Ramses II.

This morning you may chose to take an optional excursion of a camel trek through the desert to the abandoned Coptic Monastery of St. Simeon. Later we board our feluccas for our voyage, sailing towards Edfu. The leisurely and informal nature of felucca sailing means that no fixed night stops can be given. These depend to a considerable extent on the elements. As we sail, we see the intensive cultivation of the Nile Valley and at intermittent points there are small villages, which depend upon the river for their livelihood. In general, our evening stops will be by the river bank or at mid-river islands, where we set up a wild camp allowing pleasant early morning swims. We sleep on the deck of the feluccas and the experience of sleeping under the stars more than compensates for the limited facilities. Our crew look after us admirably and are great fun. Our stopping times are extremely variable as we need to take maximum advantage of the northerly winds.

Today we continue sailing peacefully upstream. In the afternoon we aim to reach Kom Ombo. The Temple of Kom Ombo is unique in that it is dedicated to two gods, Horus and Sobek. Sobek the crocodile god was much needed at this spot as the river here was noted for crocodiles until early this century.

Today we enjoy another day taking in the scenes of life along the Nile, enjoying a book, chatting with group or crew members and forgetting all about time as we sail down the world's longest river.

We sail towards Edfu today, the largest Egyptian temple after Karnak, dating from the time of the Ptolemies (3rd-1st century BC). A falcon-headed god guards the Temple of Horus, which is in almost perfect condition. The temple is unusual in that the roof is still intact. After our road transfer to Luxor we'll take horse drawn carriages (caleshes) from our hotel to visit the stupendous Temple of Amun at Karnak, the labour of numerous pharaohs. Begun in around 2000 BC, the most imposing structures include the 134 pillars of the Hypostyle Hall, carved all over with scenes of the king worshipping Amun. In Luxor we will normally be accommodated on the west bank of the Nile, opposite the main city. There will be a motorboat available to transfer you across the river whenever you require.

Overnight: Standard Hotel **Single Rooms Available**



This morning we travel by bus to visit the extraordinary Temple of Queen Hatshepsut, Egypt's only female Pharaoh, who usurped the throne from her son, the future Tuthmoses III. The scale of the temple and its magnificent setting are breathtaking, but perhaps even more remarkable are the details - look out for the fine carving of the 'Expedition to the Land of Punt'. We then take a short bus ride to the Valley of the Kings' to explore some of the more important sites made famous in 1922 by the discovery of the tomb of Tutankhamun by Howard Carter. We visit three tombs. This afternoon is free for your own personal exploration, maybe a visit to Luxor Museum, some last minute shopping or even an optional donkey trek on the west bank, where you travel through fields and villages and end your trip watching the sun set over the Nile.

Aswan - Camel trek to St. Simeon's Monastery USD35.00, Philae Temple, Aswan High Dam and Obelisk USD45.00, dinner in Nubian village USD15.00 or Philae Temple Sound and Light Show USD30.00.

Abu Simbel - Excursion from Aswan by bus USD90.00 or by air USD315.00.

Tour Leader: At your discretion you might also consider tipping your Tour Leader in appreciation of the efficiency and service you receive.

ATM Availability: You may also bring an ATM card, as these are available in main towns.

Credit Card Acceptance: Credit cards are rarely accepted.

Recommended Currency for Exchange: We recommend that you bring your money in cash, £GBP, US\$ or Euros which are readily

Flight Information

You are able to book this tour on a 'land only' basis or as a 'flight inclusive' package. Your flight inclusive package will be fully protected by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) ATOL protection scheme.

Booking a flight inclusive package with Explore

On our website we display a UK flight inclusive package guide price which is generally based on a London departure. To avoid paying supplements or to secure your preferred flight option, we recommend booking as early as possible, especially for peak travel dates.

Important Information

Travel Insurance

It is a condition of joining any of our tours that you must have valid travel insurance. It must indicate that you have cover for (at least) medical expenses and emergency repatriation in the event of illness or injury. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling in England and Scotland. We also strongly recommend your policy includes curtailment, personal effects and cancellation protection as all deposits paid are non-refundable.

If you require travel insurance for your tour, Explore Worldwide is an appointed representative of Campbell Irvine Limited, who is authorised and regulated by the Financial Services authority. Our travel insurance policy is specially tailored to the needs of the adventure traveller and will cover you for any included activity on any Explore trip. You can either purchase this at the time of booking or call us on 0844 499 0903 after you have booked.

Visa Information

Egypt: An entry visa is required by all nationalities. UK citizens can obtain a visa on arrival at the airport for the current cost of 10.00GBP or 15.00USD. Payment can be made in Sterling or US Dollars. Please note, you must purchase a visa stamp at one of the nearby banks before proceeding to the immigration desk.

Visas can also be obtained prior to departure through Explore's recommended visa service in the UK; Visaswift, at http://www.visaswift.com/explore.aspx. Other nationalities should consult their local embassy or consular office.

All visa information is subject to change. You should confirm all visa related questions with the relevant Embassy prior to departure.



Vaccinations & Protection

Egypt

Nothing compulsory but we recommend protection against typhoid, tetanus, infectious hepatitis and polio. Though malaria does exist in Egypt it is not normally found in the areas in which we travel. For the most up to date advice please consult your travel clinic.

Preparing for your Tour

Climate

Egypt

Egypt's climate is hot and dry, typical of a desert environment. In summer it can be very hot and remain hot overnight whereas winter days are milder by comparison and temperatures can drop considerably at night. The mildest area is along the Mediterranean coast with temperatures ranging from 23-31°C in summer and 10-17°C in winter. In the desert region temperatures fluctuate in summer reaching as low as 7°C at night and 40°C during the day and in winter it can vary from 0°C at night to 18°C in the day. Aswan is one of the hottest cities with Cairo and Alexandria generally being slightly cooler. Egypt receives very little rainfall annually and rainfall in summer is very rare.

Clothing

Egypt is a Muslim country and it is important to dress with respect for local customs. Brief shorts/skirts should be avoided in towns and you should cover your head and shoulders when entering a mosque. In more traditional towns and market areas we advise women to wear long loose fitting trousers or skirts and have shoulders covered to avoid unwanted attention. Men should also be aware that shorts are not generally worn by Egyptians.

Equipment

For use on the felucca sailtrek a 2 season (temperature 0°C to 5°C) sleeping bag is necessary between April and October, 4 season (temperature -10°C to 0°C) for colder nights between December and February, and a 3 season (temperature -5°C to 0°C) for November and March. Please note that it is possible to hire a sleeping bag locally for the nights on the felucca at a cost of approximately £10.00.

It is also advisable to bring a water bottle, towel, insect repellent and a small torch. Sleeping mats are provided, but you may wish to bring your own for additional comfort/insulation. You may want to bring wet wipes and water free hand sanitiser.

Footwear

Walking shoes and sandals are recommended.

Luggage: On Tour

One main piece of luggage and daypack. Remember you are expected to carry your own luggage so don't overload yourself.

Luggage allowance on tour: 20kg

Reserving your place

To reserve your place on this tour you will need to check availability on the Explore website or through our dedicated call centre based in the UK where you can. Our tours can fill up quickly so you are advised to book as early as possible.
