Cambodia by Bike

Cambodia is a well-kept secret that offers the visitor much more than the world-renowned jungle temples of Angkor. Join us on this cycle holiday that follows the tropical coastline before heading inland through rural backroads and deep into the interior. Along the way we visit the vibrant capital Phnom Penh, national parks, brilliant beaches and the floating villages of Tonle Sap Lake. We end our journey deep in the jungle of Angkor exploring temples of the once mighty Khmer empire.

Why Book this tour

Unlike many other operators, we include the hire of your bike in the overall cost of the holiday: you don't need to bring your own or pay extra to hire one locally. We also provide a support vehicle, spare parts and take care of day to day bike maintenance. All you need bring is your own helmet.

Cycling Information

On this tour we cycle 488 km over nine days (an average of 54 km per day) with further optional rides available. Our route mainly follows quiet and flat back-roads and paths, 40% tarmac, 60% gravel and dirt tracks. A support vehicle accompanies the rides throughout the tour. We have graded this route as moderate.

Suitability

We've given each of our tours a comfort rating and a tour pace, walking or cycling grade to give you a general idea about the level of activity on each tour and the standard of accommodation you will be staying in at the end of your day's adventure.

Often you'll stay in different styles of accommodation during your tour; so we make an average rating across the entire tour. For more information on where you'll stay each night, please refer to the day by day tour itinerary.

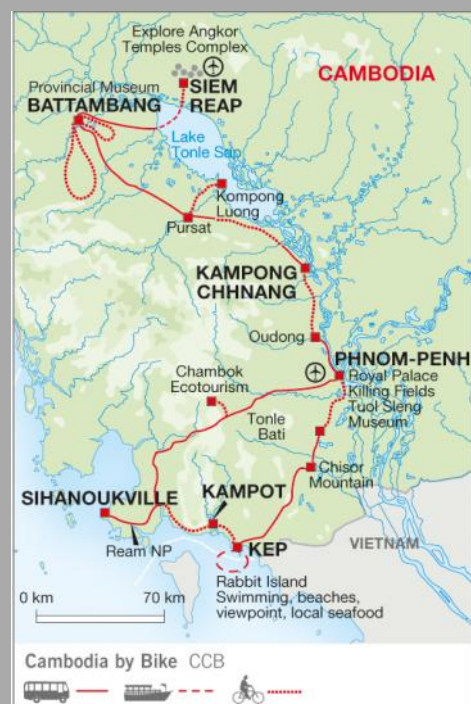
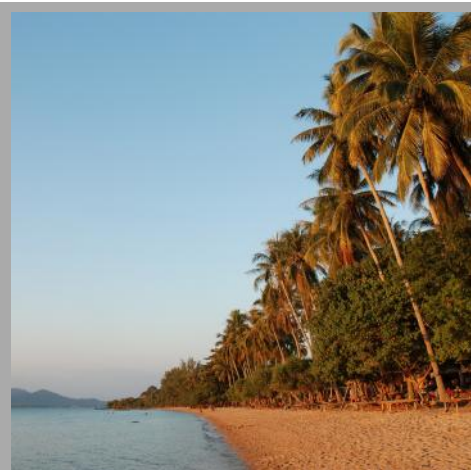

DAY 1 Join tour Phnom Penh. Afternoon city tour

Our journey begins in Phnom Penh, an engaging mix of tree lined boulevards, colonial villas and vibrant city streets that is a fascinating testament to Cambodia's ancient and colonial past. This afternoon we enjoy a tour of the city, visiting its National Museum with its impressive collection of Angkor statues, as well as the impressive French built Royal Palace, whose spectacular pagoda-style structure is without doubt one of Phnom Penh's most impressive sights. We also take in the hilltop sanctuary of Wat Phnom, from which the city gets its name. No cycling planned for today.

DAY 2 Exploring Phnom Penh and the Killing Fields. Cycle and drive to the coastal city of Kep

Our cycling begins after breakfast this morning, with a route through the quieter roads of the capital to visit the emotive settings of Tuol Sleng Genocide Museum and onto the nearby Killing Fields of Choeung Ek, chilling testaments to life under the Khmer Rouge. Continuing by bike on the village tracks through rice fields, past pagodas, streams and canal to Tonle Bati, we have a chance to take lunch by the river and pay a visit to the temples of Ta Phrohm and Yeay Peou. After lunch we use our bus to drive to the foot of Phnom Chisor mountain and (time permitting) explore its 11th century Khmer Brahman hill top temple. Later this afternoon we drive to the little developed coastal town of Kep, located on the south-west coast. A coastal city that is a launching pad to the surrounding hills, evergreen tropical forests, unspoilt islands, coral reefs, sandy beaches and fresh seafood. Founded during the French colonial time, the city was renovated into a beautiful seaside resort in 1960s during then-Prince Norodom Sihanouk's reign. The name Kep is derived from the French words le cap, or cape in English. Our total cycling distance today is approximately 40 kilometres

DAY 3 Morning visit to Rabbit Island. Cycle to Kampot and the Tek Chhou Waterfall

Founded by the colonial French during the 1960s, Kep suffered badly at the hands of the Khmer Rouge. However its colonial heritage still offers us a short but interesting morning's ride as we make our way to the Rabbit Island boat dock after breakfast. Boarding a boat, we then cruise (20 minutes) out to this tranquil little island to relax, swim or explore on foot before returning to the mainland to resume our journey. We cycle along the relatively quiet main coastal road to Kampot, passing salt farms and pepper and durian plantations along the way. Upon arrival in Kampot we have a chance to view the colonial architecture, villages and tree lined roads that skirt the banks of the Prek Kampong River. Rest of the afternoon is free to explore Kampot town. Our total cycling distance today is approximately 47 kilometres

DAY 4 Cycle through Bokor National Park. Drive to Sihanoukville

Today is a straightforward and relatively flat ride as we continue along the main coastal road through the landscapes of the Bokor National Park. Created by the French as an elegant hill station, the mountain and its surrounding countryside provides a stunning backdrop for today's ride, its densely forested hills providing us with the perfect setting as we make our way to the town of Veal Rinh. Stopping here for lunch, we then complete the rest of the day's journey by bus, driving on to the resort town of Sihanoukville later this afternoon. Our total cycling distance today is approximately 59 kilometres

DAY 5 Free day in Sihanoukville; optional Ream National Park

Sihanoukville town sits in a bay that was listed as one of the most beautiful bays in the world but has since undergone much development. Nevertheless it still provides us with a great setting for some rest and relaxation after yesterday's endeavours. One option available is to pay a visit to the nearby Ream National Park, which is home to the country's only protected marine reserve. A haven of beaches, mangrove forests and offshore coral reefs, the park provides sanctuary to rhesus monkeys, over 150 species of birds and a diverse array of marine life and affords us the chance to enjoy some quiet virgin beaches or perhaps a boat trip out to the outlying islands. Our total cycling distance today is approximately 60 kilometres

DAY 6 Bus to Phnom Pehn. Explore Kiriom National Park by bike en route

After an early breakfast we start our drive back to Phnom Pehn, stopping after a couple of hours to cycle 18 km on a dirt road with some ascents and descents alongside Kiriom National Park to pay a visit to Chambok Ecotourism site. Located in Kampong Speu Province, this area provides an ideal insight into Cambodia's natural and cultural attractions and includes dense forest, a 40 metre high waterfall, a bat cave and a number of local villages. Time permitting we may trek through dense forest to a beautiful 40-meter high waterfall (flow dependent on time of year). During harvest time it is possible to see local farmers busy ploughing the land or harvesting. We return the same route by bike to the bus to resume our journey back to the capital, a journey of about 2 to 3 hours. Our total cycling distance today is approximately 70 kilometres

DAY 7 Drive to Oudong, then cycle on to Kampong Chhang

Another challenging yet rewarding day on the bike lies ahead but first we head north out of the city by bus on national road 5 towards the ancient Cambodian capital of Oudong. The route takes us past a number of Cham villages for about 1 hour before we reach the foot of the hills that lay claim to a city that ruled over Cambodia for nearly 250 years. We'll have a chance to explore the abandoned city on foot, taking in its ruined temples and stupas, before driving on a short distance and then getting on our bikes for today's ride to Kampong Chhang. We ride on a quiet tarmac road past cultivated fields, the occasional temple and locals going about their daily work in the fields. Our total cycling distance today is approximately 60 kilometres

DAY 8 Countryside cycle. Explore the floating villages of Tonle Sap. Drive to Battambang

A short drive to Pursat Province after breakfast brings us to the start of our cycling route for the day. We start cycling on dirt roads through sleepy villages and farmland before reaching the hustle and bustle of Kampong Luong. Set against the backdrop of Tonle Sap, Kampong Luong is one of the largest floating villages in the region, playing host to some 1,200 families. On arrival we explore the village by boat observing how the buildings on stilts rise and fall according to the lake's water level, and how life has adapted to living on the water. Kompong Luong is inhabited by about 7,000 people and is equipped with petrol stations, schools, shops, markets, hospitals, garages and restaurants. We continue by bus for a couple of hours to the city of Battambang - Cambodia's second-largest city, founded in the 11th century. Until the war years, when most of the infrastructure was destroyed, this province was the leading rice-producer of the country. Free time to explore French colonial houses in the downtown area and a suggested stroll along the beautiful Sangker River. Our total cycling distance today is approximately 70 kilometres

DAY 9 Battambang and surrounding countryside and sites by bike

Today we explore the attractions of Battambang by bike with no need for our bus. We continue by bike for about 21 km to Phnom Banon which is noticeable for its five sandstone towers standing on the top of a hill. Later we have a visit to Banon Grape Farm for an explanation of grape cultivation and perhaps even a tasting of wine grown in these hot climes. We cycle lastly to the Provincial Museum and Wat Ek Phom 11th century temple. We make our way by bike to the hotel. Our total cycling distance today is approximately 70 kilometres

DAY 10 Tonle Sap boat trip to Mechrey. Cycle to Siem Reap

We leave early this morning heading straight to the port for our 7.30 am boat on Tonle Sap Lake cruising along with other travellers. The boat should arrive at Mechrey eco-tourism site at around lunch time from where we will hop on the bike and cycle past rice paddies, villages and pagodas for about 3 hours. We complete the journey to Siem Reap by bike later today. Our total cycling distance today is approximately 38 kilometres

DAY 11 Exploring the Angkor temples around Siem Reap. Optional cycling

Our cycling today is optional, but the plan is to spend the day exploring the UNESCO World Heritage sites of the Angkor Archaeological Park, probably one of the most important ancient sites anywhere in South East Asia. We plan to visit the fortified city of Angkor Thom (home to the Bayon, whose exquisite bas-reliefs are one of Angkor's true gems) and the wonderfully atmospheric Ta Phrom Temple, which remains in the clutches of the enveloping jungle. This afternoon we then head for the magnificent complex of Angkor Wat itself, without doubt one of the most breathtaking of all the jungle sites. Our total cycling distance today is approximately 25 kilometres

DAY 12 Explore Beng Mealea and Banteay Srei by bike

Our final day's cycling sees us heading through the remote countryside around Siem Reap. Riding through a landscape of rice paddies and forest, we head first for the 11th century temple of Beng Mealea, a setting that almost rivals Angkor Wat in size. Shrouded in jungle and surrounded by a 45 metre wide moat, it dates from the same period of the Angkor temples, although its artwork and friezes differ markedly from their neighbours. Heading back to Siem Reap, we then stop at the wonderfully preserved and graceful 11th century Temple of Shiva - Banteay Srei, built in 967 A.D. and dedicated to Brahma. While some of the temples are impressive because of their sheer size, Banteay Srei stands alone in the quality of its construction and decoration. Its pink sandstone walls are decorated with what some consider the best carving of all that is still an excellent state of preservation. Our total cycling distance today is approximately 70 kilometres

Local Currency: Riel.

Recommended Currency for Exchange: In Cambodia, US\$ is the most commonly used currency (small denomination notes are easier to use).

The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

Travel Insurance

It is a condition of joining any of our tours that you must have valid travel insurance. It must indicate that you have cover for (at least) medical expenses and emergency repatriation in the event of illness or injury. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling in England and Scotland. We also strongly recommend your policy includes curtailment, personal effects and cancellation protection as all deposits paid are non-refundable. You will also need to ensure your travel policy covers you for all activities you intend to do whilst on tour.

Visa Information

Cambodia: A single entry visa is required by UK, New Zealand, Australian, US & Canadian citizens and can normally be obtained upon arrival at Siem Reap and Phnom Penh airports at a cost of USD 30, please bring a passport sized photo with you for the visa. Alternatively you can now obtain an e-visa prior to departure for USD 30, applications should be made through the Cambodian Ministry of Foreign Affairs website. Other nationalities should consult their local embassy or consular office.

All visa information is subject to change. You should confirm all visa related questions with the relevant Embassy prior to departure.

Vaccinations & Protection

Cambodia

Nothing compulsory, but we recommend protection against malaria, infectious hepatitis, tetanus, typhoid, diphtheria and polio. Consult your GP regarding tablets advised for malaria. Though not compulsory, travellers may wish to immunise themselves against Japanese encephalitis. The above is not an exhaustive list. Your included bike is an 18 gear Merida hybrid and will be the correct frame size for your height. A handlebar bag or pannier and water bottle holder are included as well as the facility to fit your own pedals or saddle if you wish to bring them. A support vehicle accompanies the rides throughout the tour. We provide spare parts and take care of the day to day maintenance. All you need to bring is your own helmet.

Climate

Cambodia

Cambodia is a hot and tropical country, being hottest in April and coolest in January (still high 20s). Although rainfall is at its maximum in October, Phnom Penh and Siem Reap receive very little rain compared to the coastal areas, and when it does rain it tends to be in the form of sporadic mid afternoon downpours. There is normally very little rain between December and March.

Clothing

Bear in mind that the area is tropical with high humidity. Lightweight clothing are needed all year round. Other additions that you may find useful are swimming costumes, cycle gloves, cycling shorts/trousers and quick drying cycle tops. Please note shorts are not permitted in certain temples.

Equipment

Take a cycle helmet, cycle water bottle, torch, sunglasses, sunhat, sunscreen, insect repellent. You may wish to bring a gel seat cover for your saddle and ear plugs may come in handy in general. Please consider carrying all or some of your cycling equipment, e.g. helmet, as part of your hand luggage.

Footwear

Comfortable walking shoes/sandals for sightseeing, trainers for cycling.
