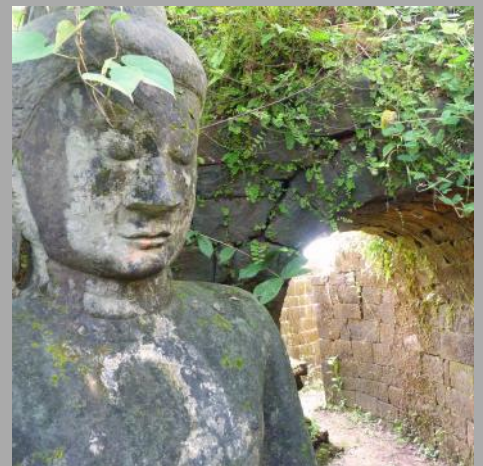

DAY 1 Depart UK

Depart the UK for your overnight flight.

Why Book this trip?

Burma is a tropical country and has three seasons. Temperature and rainfall varies across the country; Rangoon, Bagan and coastal areas tend to have higher temperatures and rainfall. The cool season, from October to February has average temperatures from 18-24C; at higher altitudes such as Inle Lake and Kalaw, the temperatures are slightly cooler and can drop down to zero at night. Hot season, March to mid-May has temperatures of around 25-38C, and can be particularly hot in Bagan and Rangoon. The rainy monsoon season is mainly in the southwest from mid-May to September and has average temperatures 23-33C; practically all of the country's rain falls in this period.

DAY 2 Arrive Rangoon

Arrive in Rangoon and transfer to the hotel. The rest of day is free and leisure.

 **Included Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 3 Drive to Mawlamyine

Leaving Rangoon behind this morning you transfer to the city of Mawlamyine, situated around 300 km to the south-east, at the mouth of the Thanlwin River. If road conditions allow we travel by way of the Kawkung Natural Cave

 **Included Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 4 Bilu Island

Taking a ferry across to Bilu Gyun, Ogre Island you visit some of the local communities that lie along the Thanlwin River, and explore the villages where you see traditional craftsmen at work. This afternoon, back in Mawlamyine you visit Pa Auk Taw Ya Monastery, one of the largest meditation centres in the country, the 100-year old Seindonn Minbaya Kyaung and watch the sun set from the 9th century Kyaikthanlan Phayar, the highest structure in the city.

 **Included Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 5 Drive to Kyaikhtiyo

Departing Mawlamyine you transfer to Kyaikhtiyo, stopping en route at Thanbyuzayat the WWII cemetery. Dedicated to the prisoners of war who died building the infamous 'Death Railway', the cemetery contains the graves of over 3,700 Allied POWs. After an emotive visit to this site you continue on your journey to Kin Pun 'base camp' where, on arrival, you continue in an open truck up a steep 11km track to Yathetaung. From here you then walk for another 45 minutes to the mystical Mount Kyaikhtiyo Pagoda (Golden Rock) in time for sunset.

DAY 6 Drive back to Rangoon via Bago

Today you may have the opportunity to watch the sunrise from the pagoda platform, before driving back to Rangoon. You stop in Bago, founded in 573AD, the town is home to a number of sacred shrines and pagodas, including the Shwemawdaw Paya (the Golden God Temple) the tallest pagoda in the country, the Shwethalyaung Reclining Buddha, the second largest in the world, and the Kyaik Pun Pagoda. If time allows you may also take a look around Bago's local market, before continuing on to Rangoon.

 **Included Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 7 Fly to Bagan; half-day sightseeing tour

Depart Rangoon and fly to Bagan. This afternoon visit some of Bagan's most distinctive pagodas, including the Shwezigon Pagoda, the 13th century frescoes and cave temple of Wetkyi-in-Gubyaukgyi, Ananda Pagoda, one of the best preserved monuments in the entire city and Htilominlo Temple which is known to be the last Myanmar style temple built in Bagan. Late in the day, watch the sunset from a panoramic viewpoint on one of the upper terraces overlooking the temple site.

DAY 8 Sightseeing in Bagan, PM free

This morning you continue your exploration of Bagan with visits to the Sulamani Temple of King Narapatisithu and the finely crafted brickwork of the Dhammayangyi Temple, the largest shrine on the site. This afternoon has then been left free to explore at your leisure. You may wish to take a trip out to Mount Popa, Burma's sacred abode of the Nats (spirit gods).

 **Included Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 9 Irrawaddy Cruise to Pakkou. PM drive to Monywa

This morning you have a boat ride to Pakkou, a bustling tobacco trading centre on the banks of the Irrawaddy River. From here you continue by road for about three hours to Monywa, in the Chindwin Valley. This afternoon offers the chance to visit the colourful Thanbuddhay Pagoda, home to more than 500,000 images of Buddha, and the Hiaungdawmu Buddha, the second largest reclining Buddha in Burma.

 **Included Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 10 Transfer to Mandalay

Crossing the Chindwin River this morning you visit the Po Win Daung Caves and Shwe Ba Daung. A system of 492 sandstone caves, containing around 450,000 paintings, statues and carvings, they represent what many experts believe to be the most comprehensive collection of Buddhist art anywhere in South East Asia. Continuing your journey by road to Mandalay, Burma's last royal capital, you stop en route in Monywee Kayemon village to visit a blacksmith and local cottage industries where they make slippers.

 **Included Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 11 Mingun and Mandalay

This morning you have a short cruise to Mingun village and the ruins of the Mingun Pahtodawgyi, although uncompleted, it would have been the world's largest pagoda however building stopped with the death of King Bodawpaya in 1790. This afternoon return to Mandalay where you spend the afternoon exploring some of the city's major highlights, including the world's largest book at the Kuthodaw Pagoda and the intricate wooden majesty of the Shwenanda Monastery. You can also visit the craft shops where you can observe traditional and skilled goldleaf making, tapestry making and wood carving.

 **Included Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 12 Visit to Amarapura and Inwa

Visit Amarapura the former royal capital, just to the south of Mandalay, perhaps best known for the 19th century, 1.2km teak footbridge that spans Lake Taungthaman. You pay a visit to the Mahagondayon Monastery this morning, one of the largest and most important religious sites in the city and visit some local cotton and silk weavers. This afternoon drive to Inwa where you take a horse cart ride around the old city visiting the monasteries of Manu Ok Kaung and Bagaya Kyaung and the 'Leaning Tower of Inwa'.

DAY 13 Transfer to Kalaw

Departing Mandalay you transfer to the British colonial town of Kalaw, arriving late afternoon.

DAY 14 Painebin Palaung hilltribe village trek

Today you trek to Painebin village. Walking at an easy pace, you stop en route to see tea and cheroot cultivation, orange groves and vegetable gardens. Arriving at the village you will meet the traditional Palaung people and learn about their tribal customs.

 **Included Meals:** Breakfast, Lunch

DAY 15 Transfer to Inle Lake

This morning you have the opportunity of visiting the morning market and Nee Paya, a gold lacquered bamboo Buddha, before departing for Inle Lake. This afternoon take a long-tailed boat to Phaungdaw U Pagoda and a short visit to Leshae Village where you can see the making of Buddha images from dried flower powder, followed by a visit to Nga Phae Chaung Monastery and floating gardens.

 **Included Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 16 Sightseeing around Lake Inle Visit Indain

This morning take a boat trip up the small scenic creek that runs into Inle Lake, continuing to Indain on the west side of the lake, where you disembark and explore the 1000 stupas overlooking the lake. This afternoon proceed to Innpawkhone Village where you can see lotus and silk weaving crafts, followed by a visit to Nanpan to see traditional boat making, cheroot making factory and hopefully some local fishermen practicing their uniquely distinctive rowing technique.

 **Included Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 17 Fly to Kyaing Tong

Departing Inle Lake you fly to Kyaing Tong. The remotely inhabited mountain valley is one of Burma's most scenic areas, with colonial architecture, Buddhist temples and ethnic groups. This afternoon you have a visit to the Standing Buddha image, where Kyaing Tong was founded approximately one thousand years ago and arrive for sunset at One Tree Hill where a lone, 245 year old Kanyin-byu tree stands. The tree was planted by Alaungmintaya, the founder of Third Myanmar Empire.

 **Included Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 18 Loi-mwe sightseeing

Today you drive through Akhi village with a short stop to see village life, then continue through forests and terraced rice fields to Loi-mwe, meaning 'misty mountain' this small town sits 1600m above sea level. You will have guided walks around the villages and explore the native way of life.

DAY 19 PinTauk

Today you visit PinTauk where you can visit Akha, Lahu and Ann minority groups, with their beautiful costumes, silver decorations and bamboo rings, each group is very different.

 **Included Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 20 Fly to Rangoon

This morning you will have time to peruse the central market before a visit to Wat Jom Kham pagoda, a tall gilded stupa inlaid with silver, rubies, diamonds, sapphires and jade. This afternoon fly back to Rangoon.

DAY 21 Rangoon

This afternoon walk down Pansodan Street to see the many colonial era buildings and colourful sidewalk markets. Also visit Chaukhtatgyi, a huge 70m reclining Buddha and Swedigon Pagoda for sunset views.

DAY 22 Depart Rangoon

Unfortunately, time to leave Burma for your return to the UK.

Accommodation and Meals

Food & Drink

Included meals: 20 breakfasts, 1 lunch, 0 dinners included in the price of this trip. Please be prepared to pay for non-included meals. Please note that costs for drinks and meals can vary depending on location.

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Budgeting for your Trip

You will need some extra money to cover meals and drinks not included in the trip price, any optional sightseeing, souvenirs and items of a personal nature such as laundry.

ATM Availability: ATMs are becoming more widely available and some hotels may have them, including the Panda Hotel in Yangon. You are more likely to find them in the larger cities, but they are now starting to appear in some of the smaller towns and villages. Please be aware that they are prone to occasional breakdowns so you would be wise to top up your cash before it runs out completely.

Credit Card Acceptance: Credit cards are becoming more widely accepted but you should not rely on them. The places where you are most likely to be able to use them are in the cities of Yangon and Mandalay and there may be a charge.

Travellers Cheques: Not accepted.

Local Currency: Kyat.

Recommended Currency for Exchange: Carry all your funds in U.S. Dollars cash, larger denominations tend to get better exchange rate. NB - PLEASE ONLY BRING NEW U.S. DOLLAR BILLS (BIG HEADS INSTEAD OF SMALL) AND THEY SHOULD BE NEW AND IN A PRISTINE STATE. ANY OLD, TORN OR MARKED NOTES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. U.S. Dollar bills with the series CB will not be accepted for exchange.

Where to Exchange: The official rate is far different from the market rate, we recommend you consult your tour leader for advice regarding the best place to exchange. The exchange booth at airport offers a very poor rate so we recommend you wait until getting into town (taxi accept dollars if agreed beforehand).

Joining your Trip

Flight Information

You are able to book this tour on a 'land only' basis or as a 'flight inclusive' package. Your flight inclusive package will be fully protected by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) ATOL protection scheme.

Booking a land only package with Explore

Customers who have chosen to book on the 'Land Only' arrangements of our tour, please ensure that you have checked your tour specific 'Joining Instructions' prior to booking your own travel arrangements. Joining Tour Abroad

Customers booked on the 'Land Only' arrangements will now receive a Free Transfer, provided you arrive and depart on the tour only itinerary start and end dates. The transfers will be from the Explore designated airport or train station to the joining point of your tour, and then back from the ending point to the designated airport or train station. The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

Free transfers are not available for Self-Guided, Tailormade or Tours for Churches customers.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of booking.

Burma

Nothing compulsory, but we recommend protection against malaria, tetanus, typhoid, hepatitis A plus Polio and diphtheria. Consult your travel clinic for latest advice on different prophylaxis available against malaria. Following the advice given by the Government's Foreign and Commonwealth Office, we strongly recommend the wearing long sleeved shirts and the liberal application of insect repellent as a precautionary measure to avoid being bitten by mosquitoes. These precautions should be taken at all times as the mosquitoes are also active during daylight hours. The above is not an exhaustive list.
