DAY 1 Depart UK and arrive in Guayaquil

Depart UK and arrive in Guayaquil later the same day. Depending on the arrival time of your flight you may wish to explore Ecuador's largest city. Guayaquil is a bustling, lively city with a number of churches and museums you might like to visit. Alternatively you could wander through the old district of Las Penas, an area of cobbled streets, painted houses and cafes, where you can sit and watch the world go by.

Why Book this trip?

Ecuador's mainland climate varies according to altitude. The highlands are drier from June to September and are at their best from July to August with clearer skies caused by higher winds. The jungle has rain all year round but the wettest months are from April to June. The coast is especially hot, humid and wet from January to April.

The Galapagos climate is influenced by ocean currents. It is most popular to visit from December to May as the seas tend to be calmer, warmer for snorkelling, the sun shines and it is generally very hot with sudden showers. The temperature drops from June to November as the Humboldt current reaches up from the south bringing much richer seas and an increase in wildlife activity. However in August and September the sea and land temperatures drop, it is often cloudy and the sea is especially choppy (when many boats put in to dry dock).

DAY 2 Fly to the Galapagos

Today you fly to the Galapagos island of Santa Cruz, your gateway to the wonders of nature at her most spectacular. The Galapagos are an isolated chain of volcanic islands supporting a distinct and unique flora and fauna, including prehistoric creatures found nowhere else on earth. On arrival on Santa Cruz you take a local bus to Puerto Ayora harbour, from here you will take the ferry west, crossing the open waters to nearby Isabela Island.

DAY 3 Day trip to Los Tuneles

The largest of the Galapagos Islands, Isabela is formed from five volcanoes, of which two are still active. An idyllic paradise of white sand beaches and swaying palms, it is home to the second largest caldera on earth and the highest point in the archipelago. Today you embark on a full day trip to Los Tuneles, an area of unique rock formations both above and below the water, created by a series of lava flows. You'll have the opportunity to walk through the incredible landscape and spend some time swimming and snorkelling with the sea turtles, manta rays, white tipped sharks and sea horses that can be found here.

DAY 4 Wall of Tears

Between 1945 and 1959 Isabela Island was a penal colony where around 300 prisoners were forced to build a 25 metre high wall for no better reason than to keep the prisoners busy. Working in horrific conditions, many prisoners lost their lives and locals still claim to hear their cries from the surrounding area. The name Wall of Tears comes from the guards who use to say 'Here, the strong will cry and the weak will die'. You will have a guided walk around the area before taking the boat to Santa Cruz. Santa Cruz Island is a main stopping point for most visitors to the Galapagos and is where the largest and most developed town can be found. There are many sights to be enjoyed and after settling in at your hotel you may have some free time to explore the area.

DAY 5 Santa Fe, Plazas or North Seymour Islands

Today you have the choice of three excursions: Santa Fe was formed from an uplift (rather than a volcano) giving the island a relatively flat surface rather than the typical conical shape of the other islands. Along the island's northern shore you can view the forest of giant prickly pear cactus (Opuntia). A member of the cactus family their name comes from the pear shaped fruit the plant produces. Santa Fe is also home to a number of endemic species which have bounced back from various threats to their survival. You may get a chance to see the Galapagos hawk, Galapagos snake, a variety of finches and the Galapagos mockingbird. After the hike you can swim and snorkel in the beautiful bay area where you may find playful sealions in the turquoise waters. Plazas Islands are two islands, although the larger Plaza Sur is the only one which can be visited. Here you will find many colourful green, yellow and orange land iguanas which feed off the island's cacti. Plaza Sur home to a unique hybrid of iguana created by marine and land iguanas breeding. This is also a bird lover's paradise with the steep cliffs being home to swallow-tailed gulls, masked boobies, blue-footed boobies, tropical red bill birds, frigatebirds and pelicans. North Seymour is located north of Baltra Island and has a surface area of less than two square kilometres. This is a breeding ground for frigatebirds, blue-footed boobies plus swallow-tailed gulls and is a bird lovers paradise. The island is also home to marine iguanas, sea lions and occasionally fur seals, lava lizards and Galapagos snakes.

DAY 6 Free morning, transfer to San Cristobal

This morning is free to explore at your leisure. Why not walk to Tortuga Bay where you have the opportunity to swim at one of the most spectacular beaches of the entire chain, and an important turtle nesting ground. Or you could visit the nearby Charles Darwin Research Station which has been responsible for conservation projects within the islands since 1959 (the centenary of the publication of Origin of the Species). Here you will visit the centre to learn more about the unique collection of animal and plant life that resides here, including the Galapagos tortoises, which may live up to two hundred years. This afternoon you'll take the ferry to San Cristobal Island, the eastern-most island in the Galapagos containing the capital of the province of Galapagos, Puerto Baquerizo Moreno. Your afternoon is free, you may wish to visit the Interpretation Centre which showcases the geology, history and science of the Galapagos.

DAY 7 Isla Lobos or Kicker Rock

Today you will embark on a trip to either Lobos Island or Kicker Rock, depending on availability and park regulations at the time. Isla Lobos is a tiny, rocky outcrop where you can observe frigatebirds and blue-footed boobies and walk among the sea lion colony. Afterwards visit Canal Lobos a protected channel where you can enjoy swimming and snorkelling with sea lions, tropical fish, rays and sea turtles – an unforgettable and magical experience. Leon Dormido, or 'Kicker Rock', rises hundreds of feet above the ocean and resembles a sleeping lion. Your boat will circle the rock formation so you can observe the birds that use the rock as a nesting site. Kicker Rock quite striking and if conditions are right you may be able snorkel through the narrow channel which splits the rock in half. Kicker Rock is home to an incredibly diverse set of marine life in the nutrient-rich water, including sharks, turtles and rays. After these tours you will sail to Playa Ochoa or Manglecito beach, depending on tides and weather conditions, for lunch, relaxation and swimming opportunities.

DAY 8 Galapagos highlands, fly to the UK

An early start this morning takes you to El Junco Lagoon, a lake within a caldera of an extinct volcano. Located in the highlands of San Cristobal, El Junco has some fantastic views over the islands and is one of the best places to spot white-cheeked pintail ducks and the endangered Chatham mockingbird. Following El Junco Lagoon you head to Puerto Chino, past sea lions lazing on the beach and blue footed boobies on the rocks, to a beautiful white sandy beach. Your journey then continues to La Galapaguera, a tortoise breeding centre where visitors learn about the origin, evolution and habitat of the giant tortoise. You then transfer to the airport for your flight to Guayaquil and on to the UK.

ATM Availability: Available in Major towns. Always have some cash as back-up as they are not always reliable

Credit Card Acceptance: Credit cards are useful and can be used in many places, but may be subject to a 10% service charge

Travellers Cheques: Travellers Cheques can be awkward or expensive to change

Local Currency: US Dollar.

Recommended Currency for Exchange: Carry all your funds in U.S. Dollar Cash (NOT Sterling, which is almost impossible to change). The US dollar is the currency used in Ecuador. It is advisable to bring some US\$400 - \$500 of your total spending money in cash, in small denomination notes (in good condition). 100US\$ bills are very difficult to use.

Where to Exchange: Your Tour Leader will advise you on arrival.

Joining your Trip

Flight Information

You are able to book this tour on a 'land only' basis or as a 'flight inclusive' package. Your flight inclusive package will be fully protected by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) ATOL protection scheme.

Booking a land only package with Explore

Customers who have chosen to book on the 'Land Only' arrangements of our tour, please ensure that you have checked your tour specific 'Joining Instructions' prior to booking your own travel arrangements. Joining Tour Abroad

Customers booked on the 'Land Only' arrangements will now receive a Free Transfer, provided you arrive and depart on the tour only itinerary start and end dates. The transfers will be from the Explore designated airport or train station to the joining point of your tour, and then back from the ending point to the designated airport or train station. The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

Free transfers are not available for Self-Guided, Tailormade or Tours for Churches customers.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of booking.

If you are trekking at altitude please ensure that there is no upper altitude limit which may limit or exclude cover for your trip. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling on trips within the United Kingdom.

Vaccinations & Protection

Ecuador

We recommend protection against malaria, Tetanus, Infectious Hepatitis, Typhoid and Polio. Please consult your travel clinic for the latest advice on Malaria, Dengue and Zika Virus. Please take preventative measures to avoid mosquito bites - these include mosquito repellent as well as long trousers and long sleeve shirts to cover up when necessary. Please note many countries in Central America, South America and the Caribbean require a yellow fever vaccination certificates if travelling from infected areas. Also on the NaTHNaC site there is a list of Countries (and specific areas within a country) which are at risk of infection and a vaccination is therefore recommended.. Preparing for your Trip

Climate

Ecuador

Temperature ranges are similar all year round. In the highlands: the dry season lasts from June to mid-September. November and December are partially dry. The rainy months are October and from January to May, but showers are short and mostly in the afternoons. Temperatures range from 12°C to 24°C. Nights are cold at altitude (4°C - 10°C). The Coastal Region: from December to May it is hot and wet. From June to November it is generally cool and misty with sudden light showers. Temperatures range from 16°C to 32°C. The Amazon Area: it is humid all year round. Temperatures range from 16°C to 32°C. From April to August the rainfall is heavier. The Galapagos: On the Galapagos, the hot season is January to April with largely sunny days and the possibility of heavy showers; the cool season runs from May to December and is generally more cloudy with much cooler seas. Please note that although it is windier from July to November the sea can be rough at any time of the year. On the mainland the dry season lasts from June to October, though September can be wet.

Luggage allowance on trip:

Unfortunately it does occasionally happen that luggage does not always reach its destination on the same flight as its owner, or possibly it may be damaged in transit. If you are unlucky enough for this to occur, it is important that you file a PIR (Property Irregularity Report) with the airline before leaving the airport. This is essential when you come to make a claim either against the airline or from your travel insurance company

Reserving your place

To reserve your place on this tour you will need to check availability on the Explore website or through our dedicated call centre based in the UK where you can. Our tours can fill up quickly so you are advised to book as early as possible. If your chosen date is 'Available' or 'Guaranteed' we will be able to provisionally hold you a space for up to 48 hours.

For Self-Guided holidays and Private Journeys simply choose your date of travel and let us know so we can confirm all ground services.

The easiest way to confirm your booking is through our website. When you are ready to book, we normally require a 10% non-refundable deposit, but for some holidays this may be more to cover such items as permit fees, internal flights or other non-refundable services. If your travel starts within 60 days of booking, full payment will be required at the time of booking
