## Disko Bay Whale Safari

### Whale safari

On the west coast of Greenland, Disko Bay is home to countless icebergs, rocky islands and glaciers - truly stunning scenery. Our favourite way to explore this unique landscape is to explore by Zodiac and on foot so you can get close to the birds and ice fields in absolute tranquillity. There will be plenty of opportunity to get off the boat and visit villages and bird colonies. Disko Bay's rich waters attract narwhals, plus beluga, bowhead, minke and humpback whales, providing an exciting wildlife experience. The expedition will also give you a fascinating insight into Inuit culture. In addition, the Midnight Sun provides a stunning backdrop for the voyage and enables you to make the most of your time in this stunning environment.

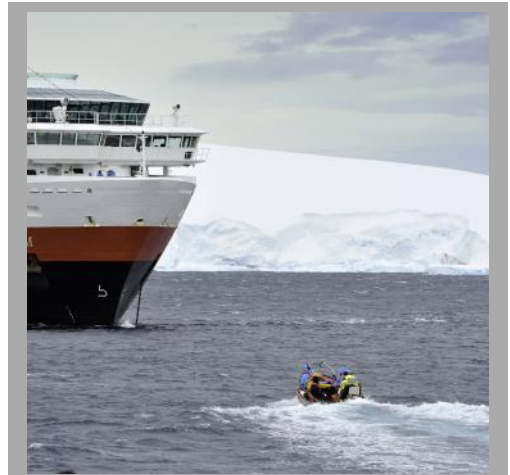

## DAY 1 Copenhagen

There will be an overnight in Copenhagen before embarking on your voyage (due to the flight times between Copenhagen and Kangerlussuaq.) Enjoy a night in the city before heading to the airport to meet the ship the following day.

## DAY 2 Copenhagen / Kangerlussuaq

Begin your Greenland experience in Copenhagen with a specially chartered flight to Kangerlussuaq, the main gateway to Greenland. Situated close to the majestic icecap that covers more than 80% of Greenland, this desert-like place is home to only 600 people.

## DAY 3 Sisimiut

Sisimiut is the second largest community in Greenland. Here you'll find fishing trawlers, a shipyard and a busy fish processing factory. We recommend a visit to the arts and crafts workshop close to the pier. Here you may watch the local craftsmen create traditional jewellery and purchase local souvenirs.

## DAY 4 Qeqertarsuaq

Qeqertarsuaq is situated on the old volcanic island of Disko and plays host to the Arctic Station, part of Copenhagen University, studying flora, fauna and the climate. Enjoy a stroll along the beach with its grounded icebergs or join the highly recommended walking tour to Blæsedalen, an area rich in high Arctic flora.

## DAY 5 Qasigiannuit

Qasigiannuit, 'Pearl of the Disko Bay', is the second oldest town in Greenland and was founded in 1734. The oldest house is still in use, and archaeology and history buffs should definitely pay a visit to the local museum. Explore the settlement on your own, or join the excursion, which includes a settlement walk, entrance to museums and a visit to the church.

## DAY 6 Uummannaq / Ukkusissat

The town of Uummannaq is situated in scenic surroundings at the foot of a 1170 m heart-shaped mountain. Here, you can join a walking tour, or just stroll around this beautiful town on your own. In the early evening, we call at Ukkusissat, a traditional hunting and fishing settlement of about 190 welcoming inhabitants. When we arrive, the locals will come aboard to entertain us with traditional songs and dances, before proudly welcoming us to their village. Once ashore you may stroll around on your own.

## DAY 7 Illorsuit

Illorsuit lies at the mouth of the Uummannaq Fjord. There are only 90 people living in this settlement. It is a traditional hunting and fishing community, and you are likely to see whale meat and fish drying on the front porch right next to the laundry on several of the houses. It is a place rarely visited by tourists, so we are probably as much of an attraction to the locals, as their village is to us. Later we will land in Illorsuit to visit this settlement.

## DAY 8 Upernavik

Upernavik is where the locals migrate to in Spring, to take advantage of the rich hunting grounds, as many of the locals still go hunting and fishing. The settlement lies at N72° 47 and W 56° 10 in Melville Bay, Northwest Greenland. The world's Northernmost open-air museum is well worth a visit.

## DAY 9 Qullissat / Eqip Sermia

Arriving in Qullissat, we will go ashore and you will have time to visit the settlement on your own. If the ice conditions allow it, we will hopefully be able to enjoy the stunning views of the Eqip Sermia glacier. Here you will have an outstanding opportunity to experience glaciers first-hand and sense the vastness of their nature.

## DAY 10 Ilulissat

The meaning of Ilulissat is 'icebergs' and the Ilulissat Icefjord was inscribed to the UNESCO's list of World Heritage Sites in 2004. The floating icebergs are form impressive sculptures against the Arctic backdrop, with colours varying depending on the light. Our shore excursions include hikes and a boat tour to the ice fjord.

## DAY 11 Itilleq

We then continue our journey South and in the early afternoon, we reach the small settlement of Itilleq. Itilleq means "the hollow" and as its name suggests, the village is situated in a hollow, majestically surrounded by high mountains and glaciers. It can truthfully be called the Arctic Circle Village as the Arctic Circle is indeed found only 200 metres to the south. On our visit, you will be invited by the locals for a 'kaffemik' (which literally means 'coffee please'.) Afterwards, you can enjoy the traditional soccer game between the ship's crew and guests and the locals of Itilleq.

## DAY 12 Kangerlussuaq / Copenhagen

Kangerlussuaq is situated in the end of the Kangerlussuaq fjord. The settlement/airport lies just north of the Arctic Circle and is one of the best places to observe native wildlife. You will leave the M/S Fram in the morning, followed by a transfer from the docks to the airport in Kangerlussuaq for your flight back to Copenhagen and will arrive at Copenhagen Airport in the late afternoon.

## Accommodation and Meals

### Food & Drink

Included meals: 11 breakfasts, 9 lunches, 10 dinners included in the price of this tour. Please be prepared to pay for non-included meals. Please note that costs for drinks and meals can vary depending on location.

### Cabins

Prices are based on the use of inside, category one cabins on decks 3, 5 and 6. Category one cabins are based on twin share, with one bed and one sofa bed. They are comfortable with a private toilet and shower, fridge and TV. The MS Fram has a number of different cabin categories, many of which are outside facing, with two beds (apart from superior cabins and suites, which have double beds).

Some cabins have portholes and others, larger windows and sitting areas. All cabins are twin share, but we can also offer single occupancy at a supplement, if you are travelling alone. Call us for details on the cabin choice to fit your requirements.

## Budgeting for your Tour

You will need some extra money to cover meals and drinks not included in the tour price, any optional sightseeing, souvenirs and items of a personal nature such as laundry.

### Food

The costs for meals may vary depending upon location, type of restaurant and number of courses eaten and so the prices given are an average guide. Local restaurants located off the beaten track may be less expensive, whereas an upmarket restaurant located in the centre of a major city may charge more.

### Tipping - Local Crew

Tipping is collected at the end of the voyage and is divided among the crew. Tipping is a very personal matter and the amount you wish to give is at your discretion, but as a generally guideline, we suggest US\$12 per person per day.

### Foreign Exchange

**ATM Availability:** Cash can be drawn on credit or debit cards from ATMs in major cities.

**Credit Card Acceptance:** Credit cards are useful and can be used in many places, but may be subject to a service charge. The ship accepts Visa and Mastercard.

**Travellers Cheques:** Travellers Cheques can be difficult to exchange and are not accepted aboard.

**Recommended Currency for Exchange:** A combination of US dollars cash and cards is best. It is advisable to take a minimum of US\$200-500 of your total spending money in cash, in mixed denominations (notes should be in good condition).

**Where to Exchange:** Banks or Forex offices in major cities.

## Joining your Tour

### Flight Information

You are able to book this tour on a 'land only' basis or as a 'flight inclusive' package. Your flight inclusive package will be fully protected by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) ATOL protection scheme.

### Booking a land only package with Explore

Customers who have chosen to book on the 'Land Only' arrangements of our tour, please ensure that you have checked your tour specific 'Joining Instructions' prior to booking your own travel arrangements. ### Joining Tour Abroad

Customers booked on the 'Land Only' arrangements will now receive a Free Transfer, provided you arrive and depart on the tour only itinerary start and end dates. The transfers will be from the Explore designated airport or train station to the joining point of your tour, and then back from the ending point to the designated airport or train station. The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of booking.

## Booking a flight inclusive package with Explore

## Important Information

### Travel Insurance

It is a condition of joining any of our tours that you must have valid travel insurance. It must indicate that you have cover for (at least) medical expenses and emergency repatriation in the event of illness or injury. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling in England and Scotland. We also strongly recommend your policy includes curtailment, personal effects and cancellation protection as all deposits paid are non-refundable. You will also need to ensure your travel policy covers you for all activities you intend to do whilst on tour.

We are delighted to include FREE travel insurance **for all qualifying customers** who book an Explore trip from 01 January 2015.

## Preparing for your Tour

### Climate

### Clothing

Pack comfortable, casual clothing for all activities. Wind and waterproof outer layers are essential, and a jacket is provided in the cost of the cruise. Beware of tight clothing that leaves no room for trapped air, which is an excellent insulator. Wool, silk and some of the new synthetic fibres, like polar fleece, retain heat better than cotton.

#### Parkas

A wind and waterproof jacket is provided as part of the cost of your holiday.

#### Gloves

Keeping your hands warm and dry can be a challenge. Thin polypropylene gloves can be worn underneath warm outergloves. This allows you some protection from the cold when removing your gloves to operate your camera etc. We strongly recommend that you bring more than one pair of gloves, in case one gets wet (or lost).

#### Hat/Cap

Warm, woollen hat/cap to protect your ears, as well as a scarf, neck gaiter or other face protection, such as a balaclava.

#### Trousers

Water-resistant trousers of coated nylon or, even better, Gore-Tex® are essential for your comfort. They can be worn over your regular clothes to keep you warm and dry. We suggest that you purchase trousers a few sizes larger than you normally wear as you will be wearing them over other clothing. Gore-Tex® or similar fabrics are excellent for keeping out wind and water without trapping excess heat. Rain gear and Gore-Tex® products can be found in any outdoor sport clothing store. In addition to your waterproof trousers, warm ski pants are suggested if you have them. Warm trousers such as jeans, corduroys etc are also good.

#### Socks

Warm wool socks worn over a thin pair of silk, polypropylene socks should provide enough warmth and insulation for your feet. Bring several pairs of socks, since you will inevitably get your feet wet.

## Outer Clothing

Woollen, knit or cotton sweaters/tops, polar fleece tops (medium weight), several cotton turtlenecks and T-shirts for layering on and off the ship.

## Underclothing

Thermal underwear is highly recommended as it will keep you warm without adding bulk. Most polar travellers prefer a lightweight version.

You can book your Explore holiday with confidence, as all monies paid to us for your trip are fully protected. Explore is a fully bonded tour operator licensed by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) and by ABTOT.

The air holiday packages (Tours including flights) that we advertise are ATOL protected, since we hold an Air Travel Organiser's Licence granted by the Civil Aviation Authority. Our ATOL number is ATOL 2595. In addition, As a member of the Association of Bonded Travel Organisers Trust Limited (ABTOT), Explore has provided a bond to meet the requirements of the Package Travel, Package Holidays and Package Tours Regulations 1992. Please note that packages booked outside the UK are only protected when purchased directly with Explore.

## Reserving your place

To reserve your place on this tour you will need to check availability on the Explore website or through our dedicated call centre based in the UK where you can. Our tours can fill up quickly so you are advised to book as early as possible. If your chosen date is 'Available' or 'Guaranteed' we will be able to provisionally hold you a space for up to 48 hours.

For Self-Guided holidays and Private Journeys simply choose your date of travel and let us know so we can confirm all ground services.

The easiest way to confirm your booking is through our website.
