Family Adventure in the Alps

Based at our chalet-style hotel with a pool and garden, we spend a week surrounded by the giant mountains of the Mont Blanc massif in a quiet part of the Les Contamines Valley. A pass is included which allows you to use the cable cars and have unlimited entry to the adventure park where you can try archery, lake swimming, an aerial ropes course and tennis. We also go mountain biking, walk in the mountains and visit local markets.

Why Book this tour

This holiday is for families who want a range of activities plus some time to themselves to discover the beautiful Alps area all set in a traditionally designed and family run chalet. With included activities such as an adventure park, walks, mountain biking and a trip to Chamonix combined with a pass that gives access to the local cable cars and adventure park, any free time is easily taken up with selfguided family walks in the area or more time taking on the ropes course or archery in the adventure park. The chalet is of a high standard with a lovely garden area and pool to relax in.

We've given each of our tours a comfort rating and a tour pace, walking or cycling grade to give you a general idea about the level of activity on each tour and the standard of accommodation you will be staying in at the end of your day's adventure.

Join tour Geneva Airport; transfer to Les Contamines

After meeting up with the tour leader at Geneva airport we transfer to our hotel in Les Contamines. Les Contamines sits under the western aspect of the Mont Blanc Massif and our hotel has good views of the mountain range and is a few minutes' walk into the local pretty village. Facilities at the hotel include an outdoor pool and garden area as well as a spa room.

Full day in the adventure park with aerial ropes course

Les Contamines valley is a pretty and peaceful part of the Mont Blanc Massif with a rushing river, thick forests and an adventure park! We take a short walk from the hotel to the adventure park where we spend the day. There are many activities to take part in such as an aerial ropes course, swimming in a mountain lake, archery, mini-golf and a biathlon which involves laser guns and roller skates. The hotel is less than a 10 minute walk if you want to head back to the pool. Please note that we provide a pass for the whole week which allows unlimited entry to the park, access to lake swimming, archery, biathlon, ice skating at St Gervais and all the cable cars and lifts in the St Gervais / Les Contmaines domain.

The Alps is most famous for skiing, mountaineering and trekking. Today we take a cable car high into the mountains and then walk through the beautiful scenery of the Mont Blanc Massif. We will look out for marmots and chamois and stop for a picnic en-route before returning to the valley bottom by cable car. As Les Contamines does not have many bright man-made lights, we hopefully can get the chance to watch the night sky and do some star-gazing.

Day trip by train to Chamonix

Today we head to Chamonix which is justifiably known as the adventure capital of the world. Here you will find the best climbers in the world, crazy skiers and the highest mountains in Europe. The whole town is abuzz with adventurers, day-trippers and long-term vacationists who can't help gazing at the amazing mountain views. We will arrive by train and have the full day to explore the town and all it has to offer. There are also opportunities to go up in the highest cable car in Europe (the Aiguille du Midi), take a cog-railway up to 2000 metres to see a glacier or enjoy a picnic in the valley bottom. There are plenty of shops, cafés and restaurants or you could take a walk along the river. We will return to Les Contamines in the late afternoon by train and then public bus.

Morning mountain biking in the valley. Afternoon free to continue cycling

We meet our mountain bike guides and pick up our bikes today. After a briefing about the bikes, we head off on well-established biking trails. The route takes us into the forest and along some quieter roads (please note that we need to take a short cycle along the main road in the town in order to start the main ride) with plenty of stops to have a drink and look at the view. We will spend approximately 2-3 hours cycling along the trails which are roughly between 10 and 15km, with a few bits of uphill! We finish in time for lunch. The afternoon is free: either head to the hotel swimming pool or take advantage of the activity card we supply that enables you to use the cable cars into the mountains for further walks and exploring.

Visit the weekly market at St Gervais - use of the activity card to try ice-skating

Every Thursday there is a traditional French market at Saint Gervais - a classic Alpine town nominated as a 'ville fleurie'. Here you can browse the stalls for local cheeses, fruit and smelly sausages. We will get a picnic together and then take a cable car above the town where we walk into the hills with views of Mont Blanc and its satellite peaks. In the afternoon you can head back to Les Contamines or try ice skating at the rink in St Gervais (this is included in the activity card we give to you).

in. You may like to try rock-climbing or more mountain biking using the lifts to get to the higher and more challenging trails. You can also head to the adventure park for a last chance to try the aerial ropes course or play a gentle game of mini-golf.

Ability to swim required

An ability to swim is essential for your safe enjoyment of the water based activities on this trip. If you wish to participate in these activities then we insist that you are able to swim (there are no lifeguards at the hotel pool or at the lake in the adventure park).

Accommodation and Meals

Accommodation Rating

The hotel is very close to the ski lift which gives access to the Contamines-Hauteluce alpine region and walking routes. The hotel boasts 38 spacious en-suite bedrooms with balconies where you can view the Mont Blanc massif and is decorated in a typical Savoyard style using natural materials. Rooms have satellite TV, direct-line telephone and Wi-Fi internet access. The restaurant has an ornamental fireplace giving a real alpine atmosphere. There are plenty of sports activities to choose from in the local area, or you could stay at the hotel to enjoy the heated swimming pool or use the relaxation area with its sauna and jacuzzi. There are a number of shops within walking distance of the hotel including cafés, a patisserie and a small supermarket. Other facilities at the hotel include a library, board games, spa-room and bar area.

Food & Drink

Included meals: 7 breakfasts, 2 lunches, 3 dinners included in the price of this tour. Please be prepared to pay for non-included meals. Please note that costs for drinks and meals can vary depending on location.

Budgeting for your Tour

You will need some extra money to cover meals and drinks not included in the tour price, any optional sightseeing, souvenirs and items of a personal nature such as laundry.

Where to Exchange: Bureau de Change can only be found in major cities and large airports. Many French banks no longer exchange Foreign currency.

Flight Information

You are able to book this tour on a 'land only' basis or as a 'flight inclusive' package. Your flight inclusive package will be fully protected by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) ATOL protection scheme.

Booking a land only package with Explore

Joining Tour Abroad

Customers booked on the 'Land Only' arrangements will now receive a Free Transfer, provided you arrive and depart on the tour only itinerary start and end dates. The transfers will be from the Explore designated airport or train station to the joining point of your tour, and then back from the ending point to the designated airport or train station. The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of

Travel Insurance

It is a condition of joining any of our tours that you must have valid travel insurance. It must indicate that you have cover for (at least) medical expenses and emergency repatriation in the event of illness or injury. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling in England and Scotland. We also strongly recommend your policy includes curtailment, personal effects and cancellation protection as all deposits paid are non-refundable. You will also need to ensure your travel policy covers you for all activities you intend to do whilst on tour.

We are delighted to include FREE travel insurance for all qualifying customers who book an Explore trip from 01 January 2015.

Preparing for your Tour

Climate

France

Across France, from April - August, weather conditions are generally warm and pleasant with moderate rainfall; Autumn temperatures are a bit lower and the winter months (though colder) remain mild. The summer months on the Mediterranean Coast in the south tend to be warmer than the rest of France and have less rainfall, and also more mild winters; freezing conditions are nearly unheard of. The mountainous areas of the Alps, Juros and Pyrenees can be quite different. During summer the morning and evening temperatures are considerably cooler and it becomes much colder in winter with heavy snowfall. Western France, along the English Channel, there can be very strong winds and frequent rain during the winter months Nov - Apr. Wine harvesting takes place in late August/early September.

Clothing

Lightweight clothing suitable for outdoor activity is advised and although you can expect to live in T-shirts and shorts for the holiday, please be aware that temperatures can change dramatically at altitude and at night so a fleece is essential. Waterproofs are recommended as the weather can change with little notice as in all mountainous areas. If you have padded cycle shorts, bring them for the mountain bike ride and although cycle helmets are available, you may wish to bring your own to ensure best fit. Don't forget your swimming things and note that French health regulations require men to wear 'proper' swimming trunks, not loose Bermuda / boxer-style trunks in all public pools.

Footwear

Trainers should be adequate for all activities on this trip, though if you have walking boots or trekking shoes they are useful for any walks. Light shoes or sandals can be brought for general travel. If you bring boots, make sure that they are worn-in and comfortable before the start of the trip and we recommend that you wear/carry your walking boots as hand luggage on the international flight: should your luggage be delayed, your well broken-in boots will be irreplaceable.

The air holiday packages (Tours including flights) that we advertise are ATOL protected, since we hold an Air Travel Organiser's Licence granted by the Civil Aviation Authority. In addition, As a member of the Association of Bonded Travel Organisers Trust Limited (ABTOT), Explore has provided a bond to meet the requirements of the Package Travel, Package Holidays and Package Tours Regulations 1992. Please note that packages booked outside the UK are only protected when purchased directly with Explore.

Reserving your place

To reserve your place on this tour you will need to check availability on the Explore website or through our dedicated call centre based in the UK where you can. Our tours can fill up quickly so you are advised to book as early as possible. If your chosen date is 'Available' or 'Guaranteed' we will be able to provisionally hold you a space for up to 48 hours.

For Self-Guided holidays and Private Journeys simply choose your date of travel and let us know so we can confirm all ground services.

The easiest way to confirm your booking is through our website.
