Amalfi Coast Walking

This relaxed walking holiday explores the spectacular Amalfi coastline from our agriturismo base. Our day walks take us across cliff tops and through woodland and national parks, culminating in the celebrated 'Walk of the Gods' - one of the greatest coastal walks in the world. There is also time to explore the cultural highlights of Amalfi, Positano and Capri, with the chance to visit Pompeii and Ravello.



Suitability

We've given each of our tours a comfort rating and a tour pace, walking or cycling grade to give you a general idea about the level of activity on each tour and the standard of accommodation you will be staying in at the end of your day's adventure.

Often you'll stay in different styles of accommodation during your tour; so we make an average rating across the entire tour. For more information on where you'll stay each night, please refer to the day by day tour itinerary.

Your tour itinerary

Tour itinerary notes

While our intention is to adhere to the day-by-day itinerary as printed below, a degree of flexibility is built in. Overnight stops may vary from those suggested.

DAY 1 Join tour at Naples airport; transfer to our agriturismo

Arriving at Naples Airport, the transfer to our base in San Lazzaro will take just over an hour. Here, we can look forward to settling in to our authentic agriturismo accommodation, with its rustically-furnished, en-suite rooms - our home for the next week. At 650 metres above sea level and located only a few metres from the cliffs, our base affords magnificent views of the Bay of Salerno and is peacefully situated a few miles away from the tourist thoroughfare. The family who run this working farm are our hosts for the week, producing their own wine, as well as much of the food that they serve us. A light, cold supper will be served on arrival at the agriturismo.

DAY 2 A warm up ridge walk above the Agerola Plain

Setting off on foot from the farm this morning, we head up onto a ridge and gently ascend to a height of 900m. Continuing along the ridge, we pass through thick woodland and enjoy views of the Agerola Plain, Vesuvius and the Bay of Naples. Today's walk is circular and we descend to the small hamlet of Santa Maria before heading back to San Lazzaro, where the rest of the day is free to relax. Today's walk is graded moderate, with the 10 kilometres expected to take approximately five hours.

DAY 3 Walk to Amalfi along the Ancient Republic's Path

Once again, we commence our walk from the farm, following a path that leads through steep terraces towards the coast. This is an ancient pathway and, before the coastal road was built in the 19th century, this was the only way to get from Agerola to Amalfi. There are plenty of places to stop and admire the sea-views as we descend down a series of steps and meander through ancient alleyways. We arrive in Amalfi in time for lunch and have a free afternoon in which to explore this stunning harbour town. You may choose to look around the impressive Duomo di Sant Andrea (St Andrew's cathedral), with its remarkable baroque interior dating back to the 11th century. The beautifully restored ancient Roman basilica is another highlight. Alternatively, you might choose to relax in one of the many cafes or gelaterias, or look around the curio shops. If it's a hot day, a swim from the public beach might appeal - don't forget to pack your swimming costume and towel. We will head back to San Lazzaro by public bus late in the afternoon. Today's seven kilometre walk is graded as easy, with a 650 metre descent. We expect it to take us approximately two-and-a-half hours.

DAY 4 Day Trip to Capri by boat

We take an early bus to catch the boat from Amalfi to Capri. Our short ferry ride affords us impressive views of the Amalfi Coast, its clusters of buildings clinging spectacularly to the cliffs. Although only a small island measuring seven kilometres in length and three kilometres in width, Capri's magnificent 600 metre-high cliffs contribute to its imposing appearance. Capri has enjoyed coastal resort status since Roman times, but today's walking gets behind its glitzy facade of trendy boutiques and cool cafes. Exploring its network of winding streets, grand houses and kitchen gardens, our route takes us to the coast, past banks of beautiful bougainvillea. Here we have superb views of the mainland and the magnificent limestone cliffs rising out of the Mediterranean. There will be time to enjoy the buzz of the main town, as well as a visit to Emperor Tiberius' palace, before heading back by boat to Amalfi. The evening is free for you to enjoy dinner at one of the superb restaurants in Amalfi, or you may opt for the local pizzeria in San Lazzaro. Today's easy-graded walk will take approximately three hours, covering six to 10 kilometres, with a 400 metre ascent and descent. Please note that if the weather is deemed too rough, the ferry to Capri will not operate. Instead we will visit the beautiful hilltop town of Ravello and take a two-hour walk along the Amalfi coast.

DAY 5 Walk in the Ferriere National Park

Once again, today's walk sets off from our accommodation. We take a limestone stairway above San Lazzaro which leads us to the coastal edge. There are great views towards Salerno and the villages and towns below. Contouring round, we pass pretty woodlands and small valleys, before crossing into the Vallone di Ferriere. Surrounded by high limestone cliffs, the four kilometre length of this valley has a unique micro-climate, creating a home for plants not normally found in this area. Our well-established path offers spectacular views of the valley and coast, passing small waterfalls and a pretty river. Descending to Amalfi, we catch the bus back to San Lazzaro. This moderately-graded walk will take approximately five hours, covering a distance of 10 kilometres.

DAY 6 A free day to visit Pompeii and Vesuvius

Today is a free day to use as you wish. You may choose to relax at the farmhouse or take an optional day-trip to Pompeii. Devastated by a volcanic eruption in AD 79, Pompeii is hailed as Europe's most compelling archaeological sites, due to the unique way that the volcanic ash has perfectly preserved so much of the city. Walking around the paved streets and buildings of this UNESCO World Heritage site provides a fascinating, if ghostly, insight into Roman life. Looming above Pompeii is Mount Vesuvius. As well as providing the opportunity to peer down into its 200 metre crater, which most recently erupted in 1944, the panoramic view from its summit is spectacular. A trip to Pompeii and Vesuvius is organised locally, so you do not need to book it in advance.

DAY 7 The 'Walk of the Gods' to Positano

Often a highlight of the trip, the Walk of the Gods is justifiably regarded as one of the greatest coastal walks in the world. The high cliff path contours west, with magnificent views of the Bay of Salerno and Capri. The trail passes under huge limestone cliffs and above picturesque stone farmhouses until it reaches the attractive village of Nocelle. From here, we descend down an ancient stairway, passed pretty flower gardens, into Positano. A poor fishing village until the 1950s, Positano has grown into a chic town that is still a favourite with Hollywood stars. There is plenty of time to enjoy the town and beach before catching the public bus back to the farm for our final evening. Today's moderately-graded walk will take approximately five hours and will cover a distance of eight kilometres with a 650 metre descent.

DAY 8 Tour ends at Naples Airport

Today provides the option of free time or an alternative is to visit Ravello, which offers the chance to explore its glorious mix of Moorish flair and aristocratic excess. This tranquil spot, located high on a rocky promontory overlooking azure waters, has attracted artists and writers to its enchanting streets for generations. Later this afternoon we transfer back to San Lazzaro and later on Naples Airport, where the tour ends.

Accommodation and Meals

Accommodation Rating

Our base for the week Luna d'Agerola is a small family-run agriturismo (farm guesthouse) set close to the cliffs overlooking the stunning scenery of the Amalfi Coast. It's just a three minute walk from the small village of San Lazzaro, which has a few bars, two mini-markets and a couple of small restaurants. There are only 11 bedrooms, all with private bathrooms and a balcony or terrace that looks towards the sea. The agriturismo's restaurant serves up tasty simple home-cooked meals, prepared by Giovanna, Valentino and Ferdinando. Much of what you eat will be grown and produced on the farm: this may include fresh fruit and vegetables, meat and wine, though this will vary in quantity and variety depending in which season you visit. Although the kitchen can cater for vegetarians, it is difficult for the agriturismo owners to source gluten free products locally. Whilst there will be plenty of naturally gluten free foods to eat, we recommend that customers with gluten free requirements wishing to eat pasta, bread and cereals, bring their own supply from home. There's a small sun terrace and quiet room where you can use the WiFi internet connection at no extra charge.

Italy's agriturismi were started in the 1950s as an initiative to reverse the closing down of small non-profitable farms, Italy's agriturismo movement encouraged farmers to redevelop their properties for paying guests by converting parts of the farm such as old barns and outhouses, into guest accommodation to supplement their agricultural income. Most agriturismi tend to produce local products such as honey, corn, farro or pearl barley, as well as many vegetables and fruits. Often located in areas of outstanding beauty, they provide a great way to experience life in rural Italy. Usually there's the chance to enjoy some traditional Italian family cooking and eat the delicious produce from the farm.

Food & Drink

Included meals: 7 breakfasts, 3 lunches, 5 dinners included in the price of this tour. Please be prepared to pay for non-included meals. Please note that costs for drinks and meals can vary depending on location.

Budgeting for your Tour

You will need some extra money to cover meals and drinks not included in the tour price, any optional sightseeing, souvenirs and items of a personal nature such as laundry.

Food

The costs for meals may vary depending upon location, type of restaurant and number of courses eaten and so the prices given are an average guide. Local restaurants located off the beaten track may be less expensive, whereas an upmarket restaurant located in the centre of a major city may charge more.

There are reduced entrance fees for over 65s at Pompeii and Villa Rufalo. You will need to take proof of age to obtain a reduction.

Joining Tour Abroad

Customers booked on the 'Land Only' arrangements will now receive a Free Transfer, provided you arrive and depart on the tour only itinerary start and end dates. The transfers will be from the Explore designated airport or train station to the joining point of your tour, and then back from the ending point to the designated airport or train station. The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of booking.

Travel Insurance

It is a condition of joining any of our tours that you must have valid travel insurance. It must indicate that you have cover for (at least) medical expenses and emergency repatriation in the event of illness or injury. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling in England and Scotland. We also strongly recommend your policy includes curtailment, personal effects and cancellation protection as all deposits paid are non-refundable. You will also need to ensure your travel policy covers you for all activities you intend to do whilst on tour.

Italy: Visas are not required by UK, Australian, New Zealand, US and Canadian citizens. Other nationalities should consult their local embassy or consular office.

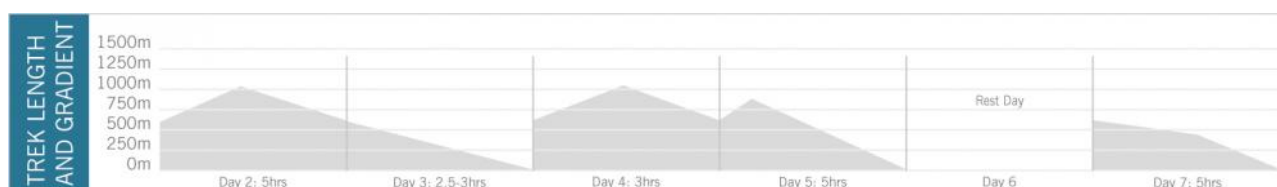

Preparing for your Tour



Trekking Details

We walk between three and five hours each day, following footpaths and old mule tracks between villages. Some of the terrain is rough and stony underfoot and three of the walks involve long descents of steep steps. Any of the walks can be opted out of. We have graded this trek as Easy to Moderate.

Climate

Italy

April/May and October/November are pleasantly warm. June/September are the hottest months. Showers are common in Autumn.

Clothing

The following are essential: waterproof jacket, fleece jacket or jumper (the evenings can be cool), T-shirts, comfortable walking trousers, shorts, sunhat, sunglasses and high factor sun-cream. Between April and early October you should expect to live in T-shirts and shorts during the day, but please be aware that temperatures and the weather change quickly and it is much cooler at night. For around-town wear you may like to bring some slightly smarter clothes - the Italians dress well when they go out. There are opportunities to spend time at the beach, so bring a towel and swimming costume. Please note that from October to early April it will be cooler during the day and from November to mid-March it can be cold. It is also likely to rain. You should come prepared for this and bring waterproof trousers and jackets, walking boots, warm clothes, woolly hat, gloves and scarves.

Equipment

You will need a water bottle (preferably 1-2 litres), and high factor sun cream. You may like to bring trekking poles, particularly as some of the descents can be long and a bit tough on the knees. It is a good idea to line your daypack with a good quality plastic bag - this will go a long way in protecting your gear from any rainstorms we encounter.

Tap water: is safe to drink in most places but water sources along the trail are non-existent. We encourage our clients not to buy mineral water because of the negative environmental impact with plastic bottles. Energy snacks including chocolate and sweets are recommended whilst walking.

Footwear

We recommend you bring walking boots - leather or fabric are both fine. Some of the paths are a bit rocky underfoot and so you could twist an ankle if not wearing boots. Trainers are not recommended. Make sure that your boots are worn-in and comfortable before the start of the trip. We recommend that you wear/carry your walking boots as hand luggage on the international flight: should your luggage be delayed, your well broken-in boots will be irreplaceable.

Luggage: On Tour

One main piece of baggage and daypack. Total allowance: 44lb/20kg. Remember you are expected to carry your own luggage so don't overload yourself.

One main piece of baggage and a waterproof day-sac (20-30 litres recommended). You just need to carry what you need for the day which may include a raincoat, jumper, camera, sun-cream, picnic lunch etc. On hot days you will carry fewer clothes but more drinking water.

Reserving your place

To reserve your place on this tour you will need to check availability on the Explore website or through our dedicated call centre based in the UK where you can. Our tours can fill up quickly so you are advised to book as early as possible. If your chosen date is 'Available' or 'Guaranteed' we will be able to provisionally hold you a space for up to 48 hours.
