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## Old Dubrovnik + Dalmatian Island Cruise

Explore the best of Croatia's historic and natural highlights. Visit the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Dubrovnik, the historic city of Trogir, the Diocletian's Palace of Split and the shimmering lakes and waterfalls of Plitvice Lakes National Park. After spending a week exploring the land we'll take to the waters. Home to over a thousand islands, the Croatian Adriatic offers some of the best cruising in the Mediterranean. We travel to the scenic islands of Vis, Korcula, Hvar and Brac on board the traditional Oldtimer wooden boat. Unwind with us as we swim in crystal clear seas off the coast of picturesque islands with a mix of sandy beaches and rocky coves. We'll also visit ancient villages, explore pine-forested trails and enjoy delicious local cuisine and wines along the way. There'll be the chance to get active on our included cycling, windsurfing and sea kayaking excursions.

### Suitability

We've given each of our tours a comfort rating and a tour pace, walking or cycling grade to give you a general idea about the level of activity on each tour and the standard of accommodation you will be staying in at the end of your day's adventure.

## DAY 2 Free day in the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Dubrovnik

Today is left free for you to enjoy Dubrovnik's Old Town or to join one of our excursions to the surrounding attractions. Now essentially fully restored following damage from shelling in the Siege of Dubrovnik in 1991-92, the Old Town still retains its unique atmosphere and charm. UNESCO granted it World Cultural Heritage status, as one of the world's finest examples of a fortified Medieval town. Those who seek paradise on earth, George Bernard Shaw once wrote, should come to Dubrovnik. You may choose to get a view from above by taking the cable car to a nearby hilltop or by enjoying a walk around the city walls (the walk of the full course is 1940 metres). You may also like to visit the Franciscan Monastery, Dominican Monastery or the cathedral in the Old Town. Alternatively you could leave the city and head to Montenegro, take a boat ride to the charming harbour town of Cavtat or cruise to the picturesque UNESCO protected Lokrum Island Nature Reserve. This idyllic island, with an ancient Benedictine monastery at its heart is only a short boat ride from Dubrovnik. As well as visiting the monastery there is the opportunity to take one of the forest walks, relax on one of the small beaches or to take a dip in the mini 'Dead Sea' on the island.

## DAY 3 Walking tour of Dubrovnik; drive to Split

The best way to get a feel for the wealth of monasteries, museums and old buildings in Dubrovnik's Old Town is on foot. Starting from Pile Gate this morning we'll take a walking tour including visits to the Rector's Palace and the Maritime and Ethnographic Museums. The Rector's Palace was built in the 14th century for the Rector of the Regusa Republic and was in use for this up until 1808. It was then used as an armoury, watch house and prison. As well as the buildings fantastic architecture it also houses a museum that will give you a taste of the Ragusan lifestyle. The Maritime Museum is located in the Fort of Saint John and gives you an overview of ship building and trading from the start of the Dubrovnik Republic right up to after World War II. The Ethnographic Museum is found in an old granary dating from the 16th century. Here you can learn about the heyday of the Dubrovnik Republic and see the traditional folk costumes and textiles from the time. This afternoon we drive to Split and if time allows we'll make a stop for lunch in Ston along the way. Ston is a village known for its unusual salt pans and its impressive defensive walls. Split is vibrant city set on the coast and with a beautiful old town area. This evening you may like to take the opportunity to join the glamorous locals on a stroll along the Riva, Split's seafront promenade and stop off in one of the aromatic restaurants and bustling cafes along the way.

## DAY 4 Free day to discover Split or the chance to visit Hvar Island

Split is the second largest city in the country and it's a hive of activity. It has a long history and its old cobbled streets are a pleasure to explore, with their small boutique shops, hidden art galleries and reams of restaurants and cafes - some of which are built into the ancient city walls. Fresh fish and homemade wine is a popular choice for lunch with the locals. You could take the opportunity to relax on the city's main beach, Bacvice and perhaps try your hand at a popular local game called, Picigin, where a small group of people will swim in the sea whilst trying to keep a rubber ball out of water for as long as possible, but your only allowed to touch it once on your turn. Perhaps, you'd like to visit Krka National Park, which main attractions are its stunning waterfalls and Visovac Island with a pretty monastery sat in the centre. If you wish to remain closer to Split then you could take a walk on Marjan Hill, which is on the same peninsula and offers great views over the city and coastline below. Within the city itself you could visit the Mestrovic Gallery, which features works of art by Ivan Mestrovic, Croatia's most famous modern sculptor.

## DAY 5 Tour of Split and Diocletian's Palace; drive to Plitvicka Jezera

After breakfast we take a guided walking tour of Split's old town and Diocletian's Palace, which is a particular highlight. The palace was built by Emperor Diocletian for his golden years at the turn of the 4th century as an imperial residence and fortified camp. It quickly became the heart of the city. What was then the mausoleum of this pagan Roman emperor evolved over time to become the world's oldest Roman Catholic cathedral, the Cathedral of Saint Domnius. A tour of the palace is a step back in time, as we wander through the intriguing maze of narrow cobble-stone streets where pre-Romanesque churches nestle alongside Gothic chapels. We'll visit the peristyle (central square), cathedral, crypt and basement halls at the palace. In the afternoon we drive to Plitvicka Jezera's which is an ideal base for visiting the nearby Plitvice Lakes National Park. Located in a valley between high forested mountains, Plitvice was the first and is one of the most attractive national parks in the country and is considered to be one of Europe's greatest natural wonders.

## DAY 6 Full day to explore Plitvice Lakes National Park

We'll spend a full day walking the well-marked trails in the Plitvice Lakes National Park, which follow the course of 16 crystal blue-green lakes on their dramatic and cascading descent over 92 travertine barriers and waterfalls. Over the millennia, the waters of these lakes have dissolved the limestone rock and carved out the valley in which they now lie. Through the sedimentation of calcium carbonate and the work of special kinds of algae and moss, travertine has been deposited to form the natural dams that separate the lakes. This dynamic process still continues with new falls breaking through the travertine barriers and constantly changing the look of this icon national park. A popular circuit leads you from the Upper Lakes, you take a ferry across Lake Kozjak and then the path twists between the Lower Lakes. Every turn leads to new breathtaking scenery and yet another stunning waterfall. The walk is mostly on wooden promenades and shorter walks are possible for those wanting less activity.

## DAY 7 Scenic drive to Trogir via ancient Zadar

Following scenic backroads initially through rolling farmland, we make for the northern Dalmatian Coast towards the ancient capital of Dalmatia, Zadar. On arrival we'll take a walking tour to see the unique experimental musical instrument on the sea front, known as the Sea Organ as well as the Sun Salutation, which is a multi-coloured sun powered light display on the pavement. We'll also see the round Church of Saint Donat, which is considered to be the symbol of the city. We then continue our drive along the twisting and picturesque Dalmatian coastal road to Trogir. Here we'll take a walking tour of the main sights and visit Saint Lawrence Cathedral. This evening you're free to enjoy your final night in this charming Medieval harbour town.

## DAY 8 Join the cruise in Trogir, settle into the cabins on our boat

This morning we'll have free time to explore Trogir before joining our Dalmatian Islands cruise this afternoon. Old Trogir is a pretty walled town of ancient palaces and jutting belfries. It's a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the best preserved Romanesque-Gothic towns in Central Europe. There are a lot of sights that are worth visiting such as the Kamerlengo Castle. Our traditional wooden boat, the Oldtimer, will be docked on the old town waterfront. During the next week we will cruise between some of the most beautiful and dramatic islands in the Croatian Adriatic and have the chance to explore cliffs, bays and beaches along the shoreline. Tonight we shall meet the crew, settle into our cabins and have a light supper on board. Our boat is family operated and equipped with 10 cosy twin cabins with a wash basin in each and there are four toilet/showers and one separate shower on board. Our boat has a dining room, spacious sundeck and boat ladder to make the most of swimming and snorkelling opportunities. Breakfasts and lunches are generally taken on board the boat, leaving you free to sample the cuisine in local restaurants in the evenings. Please note that the days on which the lunches and dinners that are included may alter although there will always be the appropriate total number of meals included within the trip.

## DAY 9 Cruise to Hvar Island; afternoon cycling from Jelsa

We enjoy breakfast on board as we start our journey cruising towards Jelsa on Hvar Island. Along the way there'll be the chance to swim in the clear waters of the Adriatic. The town of Jelsa is located mid-way along the coast of Hvar Island, which has a mild climate, clean atmosphere and warm and welcoming locals. The old town of Jelsa has been in existence since the 13th century and remnants of the old wall can still be seen. It prospered through the ages as it developed into a maritime and trade centre predominantly selling local wines, olive oil and fish which is still the main produce today. Jelsa and the Island of Hvar as a whole are a treasure trove of cultural and historical monuments that can found in its churches, parks, caves and beautiful town squares. This afternoon we enjoy a cycling excursion from the port in Jelsa along the coast with the chance to stop along the way for refreshments and swimming.

## DAY 10 Explore Hvar Town; cruise to Vis Island

This morning we have time to discover Hvar, where 7,000 years of history are encapsulated in this small island town. Sparkling amid green hills, rocky terrain and a sea of cobalt blue, Hvar is a producer of olive oil, lavender oil and wine. The town is filled

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with sophisticated shops, cafes and restaurants and most activity revolves around the main square. Our Explore Leader will guide you through the narrow streets to visit the citadel. Whilst exploring you'll also have the chance to see the 15th century Franciscan Monastery, the old rectory that today houses a collection of lace, manuscripts and books and the church with its remarkable collection of paintings. In the main square you'll see Saint Stephen's Cathedral with its treasury and bell tower, all of which bear the mark of Venetian rule. This afternoon we cruise to the town of Vis, on the island by the same name. With both Greek and Roman ruins, and a very pretty church built out on a spit, it has plenty to entertain including a small fort and museum. We may move around the headland to a quiet bay where a tunnel was constructed by the Yugoslavs to hide their ships from the German air raids during World War II. A section of the tunnel has been converted into a family run wine cellar where you have the option to stop and sample the local wine. Tonight we will moor in this harbour town where you can choose to dine in a number of waterfront restaurants.

## DAY 11 Sea kayaking excursion; cruise to Korcula Island

We start today with an included sea kayaking excursion for a few hours, which takes us to a number of beaches, close to Manjarema Fort and the beautiful Barjoska Bay with its crystal clear waters. Please note that the kayaking routing may alter based upon the abilities of the group and local conditions, which will be decided by the Explore Leader on the day. This afternoon we cruise to Korcula, one of the most historical of all the Dalmatian Islands, which is believed to be the birth place of Marco Polo, as well as being famed for its high quality white wine production. They'll be plenty of time today to stop for a swim or to snorkel. In a secluded bay near to Vela Luka, towards the most westerly part of the island, will be our overnight mooring spot. There's the opportunity to walk up Pinski Rat Hill (950 metres) to a nearby archaeological cave. This evening there's the option to visit an olive grove where you can have dinner and enjoy a local music performance or dine in one of the selection of restaurants and inns offering traditional specialties and locally produced wine. Vela Luka is also home to many talented musicians and artists, so don't be startled if spontaneous singing starts in the street.

## DAY 12 Explore Lumbarda; afternoon windsurfing

Today we continue east, following Korcula's coastline with stops for swimming and snorkelling along the way to our destination for tonight, Lumbarda, which is close to Korcula Town. From Lumbarda this afternoon we have our included windsurfing lesson with an instructor who will teach us the basics of how to manoeuvre the board to best catch the wind. There's the opportunity this evening to enjoy a dinner and wine tasting. There are also several taverns and inns in Lumbarda offering traditional dishes, especially fresh grilled fish seasoned with olive oil and accompanied by the local white wines. It is also known for its white wine called Grk which has been locally produced for hundreds of years. Alternatively, you may choose to take a short taxi ride to Korcula Town for dinner.

## DAY 13 Cruise to Korcula Town and Kuciste on the Peljesac Peninsula

Today we cruise to Korcula Town which is undoubtedly one of the highlights of the trip. Take a self-guided walking tour of this wonderfully compact walled town whose history, like most of Croatia, spans the centuries and includes a stop at the Rector's Place and City Museum which is housed in a 16th century mansion and boasts Byzantine icons. Korcula is a photographers dream, with its red terracotta roofs, stone cathedrals and winding roads. We then cruise a short distance to Kuciste, a small village on the southwest of the Peljesac Peninsula. It's located about 5 kilometres from Orebic and overlooks Korcula Town and the village of Banja Zrnovska on the opposite side of the Korcula Channel. Due to its location in the Korcula Channel, there are plenty of strong but pleasant westerly winds during summer, which make it a favourite spot for sailors and windsurfers, perhaps the best in the entire Croatian Adriatic. The beaches here are a mix of sandy and pebbled so there's something to suit everyone. The shops and restaurants in Orebic are easily accessible for you to find anything you may need.

## DAY 14 Cruise to Pucisca on Brac Island; visit the Golden Horn Beach

This morning we cruise to Pucisca on Brac Island and take the local bus to Bol, which is famous for its sandy beach, Zlatni Rat, also known as the 'Golden Horn' which is excellent to swim from. After free time here to relax, there's the opportunity to visit Vidova Gora peak, which affords great views over the island and coastline below. There are regular buses back to Pucisca, and the harbour where the boat is docked is close to the bus station. You may wish to visit the stone masonry school in the town which produces a famous white stone that is mined from quarries nearby. This stone was used during the construction of many famous buildings, such as the Diocletian Palace in Split and the White House in Washington, U.S.A. Pucisca has retained many of its original Mediterranean characteristics and its white roofs create a truly ambient atmosphere. From this beautiful coastal town you can also enjoy swimming

in numerous bays and pebbled beaches, dine in small family-owned restaurants and meet friendly local people. Tonight, as it will be our last evening on board, we'll get to enjoy a Captain's dinner.

This morning we'll sail three hours along the coast to Trogir, where our trip ends. If you have time before your flight you may choose to explore the pretty walled town of Trogir with its narrow streets and beautiful old buildings.

## Accommodation and Meals

### Accommodation Notes

Why not join us for a week on a traditional wooden sailing boat cruising between some of the most beautiful and dramatic islands on the Croatian Adriatic? With over 1000 islands to choose from we've based our cruise itinerary around some of the most beautiful islands off the Dalmatian Coast. We will have the chance to explore the cliffs, bays and beaches along the shoreline.

The boat is family operated and the cabins are small and cosy. There are 10 twin cabins (bunk beds) on the main and upper decks, with a wash basin in each. There are also four toilet/showers and one separate shower. Electric plug sockets are not available in the cabins; however there are sockets available in the corridor of each deck in order to charge phones, cameras, etc. Please be aware, as with all accommodation on traditional boats, cabin space is limited, so please pack accordingly. Soft sided bags are much easier to stow than hard-framed suitcases.

Our boat is equipped with a galley (kitchen), dining room and spacious sundeck. There is also a boat ladder to make the most of swimming and snorkelling opportunities. There is an Explore Leader, plus the captain, boat crew and a cook on board. Breakfasts and lunches are generally taken on board the boat, leaving you free to sample the cuisine in local restaurants in the evenings.

The likelihood of getting sea sick during this trip is low as the islands themselves provide protection against strong winds, reducing the possibility of choppy sea conditions.

While our intention is to adhere to the day-to-day route printed, a degree of flexibility is built into the itinerary. Overnight stops and even islands visited, may vary due to weather, sea conditions and the availability of mooring space in harbours. In some harbours, we may be mooring alongside other boats and so access may involve crossing other vessels decks.

An ability to swim is strongly recommended and for water activities such as sea kayaking, where you do need to be able to swim 25 metres unaided to participate.

### Food & Drink

Included meals: 14 breakfasts, 5 lunches, 3 dinners included in the price of this trip. Please be prepared to pay for non-included meals. Please note that costs for drinks and meals can vary depending on location.

## Budgeting for your Trip

You will need some extra money to cover meals and drinks not included in the trip price, any optional sightseeing, souvenirs and items of a personal nature such as laundry.

### Food

The costs for meals may vary depending upon location, type of restaurant and number of courses eaten and so the prices given are an average guide. Local restaurants located off the beaten track may be less expensive, whereas an upmarket restaurant located in the centre of a major city may charge more.

## Foreign Exchange

### Croatia

**ATM Availability:** Most towns and cities have ATM's for cash withdrawal.

**Credit Card Acceptance:** Generally accepted throughout including most restaurants and hotels.

**Travellers Cheques:** Travellers Cheques can only be exchanged in banks.

**Local Currency:** Croatian Kuna.

**Recommended Currency for Exchange:** Pound Sterling, US Dollars and Euro cash can all be exchanged for the local currency.

**Where to Exchange:** Most major towns and cities - your Explore Leader will advise you on arrival. Only exchange money at reputable places like banks, ATM's and official Forex Offices.

### Joining Tour Abroad

The exception to this rule is customers who are booked on a tour where the joining and ending point is at the designated airport or train station.

Free transfers are not available for Self-Guided, Tailormade or Tours for Churches customers.

If you are not eligible for the Free Transfer then you will need to make your own way through to the joining and ending point. On a majority of our tours Explore will be able to provide a private transfer at an additional cost. Please ask for a quote at the time of booking.

### Travel Insurance

It is a condition of booking with Explore that you have adequate valid travel insurance. Your Insurance Policy must fully cover you for medical expenses and emergency repatriation to your home country. Please ensure your policy includes medical emergency helicopter evacuation in the event of illness or injury and covers the entire duration of your holiday. If you are trekking at altitude please ensure that there is no upper altitude limit which may limit or exclude cover for your trip. Medical and repatriation insurance cover is not mandatory for UK residents who are travelling on trips within the United Kingdom.

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### Vaccinations & Protection

#### Croatia

Nothing compulsory, but we recommend being up-to-date with your routine vaccination courses and boosters as recommended in the UK including protection against measles, mumps, rubella, tetanus, diphtheria, hepatitis A, typhoid and polio. Tick-borne encephalitis protection is recommended by some medical sources at certain times of the year. Ticks are most active between spring and late autumn. Check the latest requirements with your travel clinic or doctor prior to departure. The above is not an exhaustive list. Further information regarding vaccinations and travel health advice can be found by following the NHS and NaTHNaC links at <http://www.explore.co.uk/Travelhealth/> and from your local healthcare provider. Vaccination requirements are subject to change and should be confirmed before departure.

## Preparing for your Trip

### Climate

#### Croatia

The Croatian Adriatic has a Mediterranean climate with mild winters and warm, dry, sunny summers. There is a chance of sporadic rain in spring and autumn, though generally it is in the form of short showers. Thunderstorms can occur in summer, generally helping to cool the air. Hvar Island gets the most sunshine in summer with 10-12 hours each day, followed by Split, Korcula Island and Dubrovnik with around 7-8 hours. Temperatures from May to October are generally in the low to mid 20's (in °C), but can reach into the 30's (in °C) in July and August. Trip itineraries with boat cruises can occasionally be disrupted due to bad weather.

### Clothing

July and August are the hottest months, but early and late in the season go prepared with clothing to suit drops in temperature and the odd shower. Please note air conditioning is not normally available. You'll need your swimming gear, a 'bath' towel (as towels are not provided on board) and a beach towel. Take a fleece for potential chilly breezes when sailing.

### Equipment

We recommend a water bottle, a sun hat, sunglasses and sunscreen, a towel and if you wish to snorkel, your own mask and snorkel. Consider taking some mosquito repellent. A torch is useful in case of powercuts/ emergencies. Please note that if you wish to sleep out on deck on some nights, as many choose to do in good weather, you should bring a sheet sleeping bag and a roll mat, as the cabin bedding is not permitted on deck. You may also wish to bring ear plugs.

### Footwear

Comfortable shoes/trainers plus sandals for relaxing. Take something with good grip for walking in Plitvice Lakes National Park. You may find a pair of old shoes useful for swimming off rocks and stoney beaches. Footwear is generally not worn on board the boat, but you may find a pair of old shoes or plastic sandals useful to avoid sea urchins on rocks.

### Luggage: On Tour

One main piece of baggage and a daypack. Remember that you will have to carry your own luggage between our bus and your accommodation so don't overload yourself. Space is limited on board the boat so only bring what you need. A soft bag is more easily stored on board than a hard suitcase.
